KNEE SURGERY FOR GLITTER WOMAN Glitter Woman (Glitterman), who placed seventh as the 7-5 favorite in the May 2 Kentucky Oaks, was scheduled to undergo minor surgery yesterday on her right front knee at the Rood and Riddle Clinic in Lexington, Kentucky. "They're going to clean up her right knee," trainer Shug McGaughey explained. "I wouldn't call it a chip, it's more like a spur." McGaughey said the bay filly came back fine immediately after Friday's GI Kentucky Oaks, but he noticed the problem once she returned to Belmont Park. Dr. Larry Bramlage, who was scheduled to perform the operation, advised McGaughey that the problem could either be cured with lengthy rest or with the operation. McGaughey said Glitter Woman will probably be given three weeks of stall rest followed by three weeks of hand walking. He then intends to turn her out for a month, but is optimistic she will race again later this year. Before her disappointing Kentucky Oaks finish, Glitter Woman had won all four of her 1997 starts by an average of 8 1/4 lengths. Her triumphs this year include the GI Ashland S., Gil Bonnie Miss, GIII Davona Dale and GIII Forward Gal.

HOBLOCK NAMED NEW YORK STATE RACING AND WAGERING BOARD CHAIRMAN The New York State Senate unanimously confirmed the nomination of Michael Hoblock as the new chairman of the New York State Racing and Wagering Board Tuesday, according to the *Associated Press*. Hoblock succeeds Jerry Bilinski, who stepped down from the position in July '96 when the state Ethics Commission wanted him to divest his ownership interest in stallions. New York's Racing and Wagering Board regulates the state's harness and Thoroughbred racing industry, bingo, Las Vegas nights and raffles, off-track betting and simulcasting and the state's only legal casino--the Oneida Indians' Turning Stone. The 54-year-old Hoblock has served as a state senator and assemblyman and is a self-described racing enthusiast who owned harness horses in the 1970s. He acknowledged that he has not been to Aqueduct or Belmont for many years. Hoblock said one of his first priorities will be to review a proposal by the New York Racing Association to give rebates to high-stakes bettors and non-cash prizes to regular customers who don't bet as much. Another critical issue he may face is whether the state will continue NYRA's contract to operate Aqueduct, Belmont and Saratoga. That franchise expires in 2000.

WRITERS UP

LITTLE-KNOWN FACT, by Bill Oppenheim

Though it is understandably far better known as a broodmare sire line, the Buckpasser line (some call it Tom Fool or Menow) scored its third Kentucky Derby win since 1985 with Silver Charm's victory last Saturday--Spend a Buck (by Buckaroo) in 1985 and Lil E. Tee (by Norcliffe's son At the Threshold) in 1992 being the other two. In the last 13 years, only Raise a Native with five (three from the Mr. Prospector branch, two by Alydar) has been responsible for more Derby winners. The only other line with more than one is Northern Dancer, with two. What makes all this particularly interesting is that, since Buckpasser is an obscure sire line at best--in fact, it wouldn't even be a sire line except for his sensational record as a broodmare sire--all three of this line's Derby winners have had pretty 'ropey' pedigrees, by which I mean there hasn't been an excessive amount of classy black type in the recent female families of any of the three. Two of the three, again interestingly, are out of Princequillo-line mares: Spend a Buck out of a Speak John (by Prince John) mare, and now Silver Charm, who's out of a Poker (by Round Table) mare. Poker's other Derby winner as a broodmare sire, of course, was 20 years ago--Seattle Slew.
