CIGAR TO WATERCRESS STUD According to a report in vesterday's Sporting Life, two-time Horse of the Year Cigar (Palace Music), now the property of an insurance company, will be shipped from Ashford Stud in Versailles to Watercress Stud in Paris, Kentucky in approximately 10 days. While there, the seven-year-old will be under the care of Phil McCarthy, a veterinarian well known in the harness racing world for treating stallions with fertility problems. Sporting Life also reported that Cigar's owner, Allen Paulson, will have first refusal to buy back his superstar if and when the insurance company decides to sell him. "I saw Cigar last week when the insurers paid out, and I fed him some peppermints," Paulson told Sporting Life. "Phil McCarthy thinks there is a period over which a horse effectively recycles his sperm, and hopefully that will happen with Cigar. It could be several months before we know anything, but I've negotiated the right of first refusal if the insurers ever sell."

NOLAN NAMED CPR CHAIRMAN Former New York State Senator Howard C. Nolan, Jr., who has been active in the Thoroughbred breeding industry for more than 20 years, has agreed to serve as the first Chairman of the Board of Advisors of the Center to Preserve Racing, Inc. (CPR). The educational and research "think tank" was launched in April to educate the public and make recommendations to the industry and government concerning racing's preservation as well as its future development and expansion in New York State. Nolan is one of 10 founding members of the CPR Board of Advisors, which includes prominent racing and breeding leaders within the New York Thoroughbred industry.

PREAKNESS UPDATE

Kentucky Derby winner **Silver Charm** (Silver Buck) was uninjured after throwing exercise rider Larry Damore during an otherwise routine 1½-mile gallop Thursday morning at Pimlico. The colt was loose less than a sixteenth of a mile before he was caught by outrider Bill Rudolph and he never tried to run off. Instead, he cantered calmly along the outside fence. "I've been thrown from a Breeders' Cup winner and an Eclipse Award winner, but until today I'd never been thrown by a Kentucky Derby winner," former jockey Damore said.

Derby runner-up **Captain Bodgit** (Saint Ballado) has now been confirmed a starter for the Preakness. Team Valor President Barry Irwin said, "It's definitely a go. He's doing real good and came back from (the Kentucky Derby) great."

Mike Smith has been named to replace Carlos H. Marquez Jr. on **Concerto** (Chief's Crown) for the Preakness. "No real reason," said trainer John Tammaro III. "We just think Mike is a little more experienced jockey."

Jockey Kent Desormeaux will replace David Flores aboard GI Santa Anita Derby winner and third-place Kentucky Derby finisher **Free House** (Smokester).

Ordway (Salt Lake), second in the GII Gotham and fourth in the GII Wood Memorial, worked six furlongs in 1:12 over the main track at Belmont yesterday morning under Jerry Bailey. With the work, trainer Dave Donk gave the green light to run next in the Preakness.

Dogwood Stables's Jack Flash (Sovereign Dancer) will pass the Preakness, Dogwood President Cot Campbell said yesterday. He will be pointed for the May 18 Peter Pan S. at Belmont, which he will use as a prep for the June 7 Belmont S. "With the same cast of characters and with the race a sixteenth of a mile shorter around tight turns, we didn't think there was any reason he'd be terribly effective there," Campbell said.

The connections of Derby Trial winner **Richter Scale** (*Habitony) are still on the fence concerning the Preakness. "We're going to breeze him a half-mile Saturday morning and then sit down and make a decision," trainer Pat Byrne said. Byrne said the Peter Pan is the other option.

WORLD RACING LEAGUE PLANS ANNOUNCED

Michael Osborne, an organizer of the Dubai World Cup, has unveiled plans for a World Thoroughbred Series, according to a story in yesterday's Sporting Life. The story reports that discussions have been underway for over a year among the major racing nations to design a series of races for older horses which would take place in different countries at six-week intervals over 10 furlongs. The overall points winner in the series would collect a \$10 million bonus. Japan, Australia, New Zealand, Hong Kong, France, Britain, United States, Canada and Ireland have been involved in the discussions so far. During a press conference in Dublin Tuesday, Osborne said, "By the time we get to this year's Breeders' Cup there will be positive decisions taken on this. I regard the WTS as a noble aspiration that will be difficult to implement, but not impossible. I envisage it taking three years to set up, possibly more."

Serious doubts hang over the racing future of Bijou d'Inde (GB) (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}) after a renewed flare-up of swelling to his near foreleg. Last year's G1 St. James's Palace S. hero picked up a tendon injury when attempting unsuccessfully to hurdle the stricken Japanese mare Hokuto Vega (Jpn) (Nagurski) in last month's Dubai World Cup. His condition seemed to have improved on returning to trainer Mark Johnston's stables in Yorkshire. But now, with the leg stubbornly refusing to return to normal despite regular treatment, his connections are increasingly worried that the chestnut will be forced out of competitive action. Johnston, a qualified vet as well as a successful trainer, said Wednesday; "We are very puzzled by Bijou d'Inde's injury--none of us can figure out what is going on inside the leg--but it hasn't settled down as we had hoped it would and has, in fact, flared up again. The situation is very frustrating and it puts everything in doubt. There is always the possibility now that he won't be able to make a comeback."

The Nevada Pari-mutuel Association (NPMA) yesterday rejected a proposal designed to break the deadlock between it and Southern California Thoroughbred racetracks. The proposal--3.5 percent of win, place and show wagers and four percent of all other wagers-would have resulted in Hollywood Park receiving approximately .28 percent more than it received from NPMA last year. At the same time, NPMA approved a proposal to increase its fee to Golden Gate by approximately .28 percent. The Thoroughbred Owners of California (TOC) and the California Horse Racing Board (CHRB) must approve any proposal from NPMA in order to allow a California simulcast signal to be sent to Nevada. Euall Wyatt, Hollywood Park General Manager said, "While I obviously don't have a vote, I would be very surprised if either the TOC or the CHRB agreed to a deal in Northern California without resolving the issue in Southern California at the same time."
