DERBY CHAMP DRAWS POST SEVEN IN

PREAKNESS Kentucky Derby champion Silver Charm (Silver Buck) will break from post position seven in Saturday's GI Preakness S. "I just didn't want to be inside or dead on the far outside," trainer Bob Baffert said. "He's still training good, so I'll tell (jockey) Gary (Stevens) he's got a lot of buttons to push. The key is the first turn. If you survive the first turn (position-wise), it should be all right after that." Silver Charm was made the 9-5 morning-line favorite to take the second leg of the Triple Crown. Back to face the grey colt on Saturday will be Derby runner-up Captain Bodgit (Saint Ballado). The colt drew post position nine. "I don't think it will matter that much," trainer Gary Capuano said. "It's a mile-and-three-sixteenths race, so there is plenty of time for them to sort themselves out." Free House (Smokester), third in the Derby, will be breaking from post position four on Saturday, to the delight of trainer Paco Gonzalez. "I'm very happy with the post," he said. "I don't see any speed inside. We should have the kind of position we want." Co-owner Trudy McCaffery was even happier with Free House's draw. Following pumping her fist when she heard the post call, she observed, "We broke from the four in the Santa Anita Derby."

NUMBERS UP AT BARRETTS SPRING SALE

Barretts Spring Sale of Two-Year-Olds in Training concluded Tuesday night in Pomona, California, with increased figures across the board. At the two-day sale, 194 horses sold for a total of \$6,718,500. That's up 31.6 percent from last year's sale when 209 horses sold for \$5,104,700. The sale average of \$34,631 was up 41.8 percent from last year's average of \$24,424. The median price rose 53.3 percent, from \$15,000 in 1996 to \$23,000 this year. The top price at the second session was paid for hip number 325. The dark brown colt, by Chief's Crown out of the Sir Ivor mare Fortune's Favour, was consigned by Donna M. Wormser, Inc., agent and brought a final bid of \$130,000 from Can-Am Bloodstock Services.

GRADE I WINNER ALPRIDE RETIRED Alpride (Ire) (Alzao), a champion in Italy and two-time Grade I winner in the U.S., has been retired due to recurring ankle problems and will be bred to Storm Cat, according to a report in the Daily Racing Form. The six-year-old mare made her last start January 19, finishing second by a half-length in the GII San Gorgonio H. at Santa Anita. Her last win came in November, 1995, when she took the GI Yellow Ribbon Invitational. The Irish-bred was named the highweight two-year-old filly in Italy in 1993; she shipped to America for her four-year-old campaign and concluded her career winning two of 13

U.S. starts for American earnings of \$795,000.

THREE TRACKS JOIN AMERICA'S DAY AT THE **RACES** The number of tracks scheduled to participate in the inaugural America's Day at the Races on September 1 has grown to 10 with the addition of Calder Racecourse, Penn National and Prairie Meadows to the list. The promotion is aimed at establishing Labor Day as the holiday Americans celebrate by going to the racetrack. Arlington International, Del Mar and Monmouth Park will serve as hosts for a national Pick-3 featuring a reduced take-out that day. Also taking part in the event are Bay Meadows, Emerald Downs, Saratoga Racecourse and Wyoming Downs.

C. OLIVER GOLDSMITH PASSES AWAY C. Oliver Goldsmith, a Thoroughbred owner/breeder for more than 30 years, died Monday after a lengthy illness. He was 68. Owner of Longwood Farm in Howard County, Maryland, Goldsmith sent out such homebred stakes winners as Miss Slewpy, Leematt and Capp It Off, as well as Broodmare of the Year Turn Capp. A dispersal of his racing stock was already in motion at the time of his death, with 25 horses slated to be sold at the Fasig-Tipton Spring Two-Year-Olds in Training and Horses of Racing Age Sale, set for May 19-20. An attorney who graduated from the University of Maryland, Goldsmith is survived by his wife, Barbara, and four children.

ROMARIN RETIRED Romarin (Brz) (Itajara {Brz}) has been retired from racing and will return to Brazil to stand at stud, according to trainer Richard Mandella. The seven-year-old made his final start when third in last Sunday's San Francisco Mile at Golden Gate. He raced 18 times with five wins for earnings of \$731,535. "The owners (Rio Claro Thoroughbreds) had planned this all along," Mandella said. "The start of their breeding season is August 1 and they have had a lot of requests for him as a sire. From what I understand, his book is full. He retired sound." Romarin scored victories in the 1995 GII Early Times Turf Classic and the 1995 and 1996 GII San Gabriel H.

BUCKFINDER DEAD AT 23 Buckfinder

(Buckpasser), a graded-stakes winner of \$230,513 and sire of more than 20 stakes winners and the earners of over \$15 million, was humanely destroyed last Saturday due to complications from laminitis. The stallion, who had been standing at Win Row Farm in Lebanon, Ohio, was a half-brother to the great Ruffian and to top stallion Icecapade. His best runner was millionaire Track Barron, who captured the GI Woodward, GI Whitney H., GI Vosburgh and GI Dwyer.

CECIL NAMED TRAINER OF THE MONTH Ben Cecil was named the UTTA Trainer of the Month for April. Cecil, who has enjoyed tremendous success since taking out his trainers license just over a year ago, had perhaps his most impressive month in April. Cecil and owner Gary Tanaka won the \$100,000 Miss America H. at Golden Gate Fields with Housa Dancer then ran first and second in the GII Santa Barbara H. at Santa Anita with Donna Viola and Fanjica. The next day, Cecil saddled Sandtrap to win the GIII San Simeon H. The award is co-sponsored by Vinery Stallions 97 and United Thoroughbred Trainers of America and will be featured May 21 on ESPN's Racehorse Digest.

Five previous Dante S. winners--St Paddy, Shirley Heights, Reference Point, Shahrastani and Erhaab--have gone on to win the Epsom Derby and Ladbrokes now rate wire-to-wire winner Benny The Dip a 7-1 shot to achieve that distinction, while other bookmakers are being more generous with odds of 10-1 or longer. Masterfully ridden from the front by French champion jockey Olivier Peslier, homebred Benny The Dip led out of the gate. At the top of the straight, Peslier guickened the pace and soon had the rest of the field struggling. Only Desert Story (Ire) offered any sort of challenge but his bid petered out inside the final furlong. Under a hands and heels ride, Benny The Dip ran on resolutely and looks a worthy challenger to Entrepreneur for the Epsom Derby. It was the first Dante S. win for trainer John Gosden, who said: "He won very nicely. He ran well in the Classic Trial at Sandown but came back with some sort of mucus problem, which my vets managed to clear up. Olivier (Peslier) got him to relax in front and rode a beautiful race. Hopefully we can now go on to Epsom for the Derby (June 7)."
