FASIG-TIPTON MIDLANTIC STARTS MONDAY

The Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Spring Two-Year-Olds in Training and Horses of Racing Age Sale, to be held at the Timonium Sales Pavilion in Timonium, Maryland, begins Monday. A total of 450 hips have been catalogued for the two-day auction, including 25 horses from Phase I of the C. Oliver Goldsmith dispersal, consigned by Litz Bloodstock Services. Nine horses were added to that dispersal after the catalogue had been printed; to receive pedigree information on those hips, call Fasig-Tipton's Fax On Demand service at (606) 288-1015. Last year's GI Hopeful winner Smoke Glacken was purchased for \$65,000 at this sale last year. Among the 46 stakes winners to pass through the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic sales ring in 1996 was GI Breeders' Cup Classic winner Alphabet Soup. Bidding for the 1997 Spring Sale begins at 11 a.m. and the auction continues at 11 a.m. Tuesday.

JIM BOLUS DEAD Jim Bolus, Kentucky Derby historian, author-writer and a contributor to the *Thoroughbred Daily News*, died of a heart attack Wednesday, May 14 after an evening jog in Louisville, Kentucky. He was 54. Bolus, longtime secretary-treasurer of the National Turf Writers Association, is survived by his wife, a son, a daughter and a one-year-old grandson, Eli. A former University of Kentucky football player, Bolus knew everything there was to know about the Kentucky Derby and everyone who participated in it. "You can't say enough about Jim. I loved him," two-time Derby-winning trainer Nick Zito said Thursday. Bolus worked 23 years for the *Louisville Courier-Journal* and *Louisville Times* before becoming a freelance writer, author and editor. Over the past five years, he published a series of Derby story collections for Pelican Publishing. He was also the curator for the Kentucky Derby Museum. Visitation will be May 16 from 2-5 p.m. and 7-9 p.m. at Arch L Heady Funeral Home in Louisville. Memorial contributions can be made either to Kosair Children's Hospital in Louisville or the Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation.

TOGA TOGA TOGA RETIRES Toga Toga Toga

(Saratoga Six), winner of this year's GI Santa Monica H. has been retired from racing after suffering a tendon injury while winning the April 26 GII A Gleam H. "She bowed a tendon in the A Gleam," trainer Eduardo Inda confirmed. "It's unfortunate--she's been running some good races lately. Things like this happen, but they (her owners) are going to make her a broodmare next season." The five-year-old chestnut mare will be sent to owner Stanley Bell's farm in Sacramento, California and is scheduled to be shipped to Kentucky in November. Plans on which farm she will be sent to have not been finalized. Toga Toga Toga retires with seven wins in 18 starts and earnings of \$374,489.

VALID APPEAL'S BREEDING SEASON ON

HOLD Twenty five-year-old **Valid Appeal** (In Reality), sire of 70 stakes-winners, will take a three-week break from covering mares at Mockingbird Farm in Ocala, Florida. In a release issued yesterday, Farm Manager Tom Drier said, "Although he has produced eighteen crops in a seemingly effortless manner, for the current breeding season, Valid Appeal has not displayed his usual ability to stop mares. Due to his decline in fertility, we feel it is necessary to stop all breeding for a period of three weeks. At that time, we will re-evaluate and decide if he should continue to breed for the remainder of the 1997 season." Florida's all-time leading sire by money earned, Valid Appeal's best runners include 1981 Blue Grass winner Proud Appeal; Nannerl, a MGSW of \$553,465; GI Santa Monica H. winner Stormy But Valid; GII Pegasus H. hero World Appeal; and GI Remsen and GI Laurel Futurity victor Mighty Appealing.

One of the most improved horses in training, Celeric (GB) has progressed from minor handicaps this time last year to be a serious candidate for the champion stayer title. The two-and-a-half mile Ascot Gold Cup at Royal Ascot (June 19) is his next target. This was his fifth win at York. He raced well in the rear early while Godolphin's CLASSIC CLICHE (GB) (Salse), winner of this race last year, set the pace. With a half mile to run, Classic Cliche still led, but he very quickly began to weaken. Jockey Pat Eddery worked Celeric through a narrow opening a furlong from home and he sprinted into the lead, only to idle for a moment in front, almost allowing Mons to come back and grab the prize. Eddery said: "Willie Carson used to ride Celeric and he told me how to ride the horse, to come as late as possible. So I did just that. But when we hit the front he thought he'd done enough and tried to pull himself up, letting Mons come back at him." Classic Cliche, who started even-money favorite, looked magnificent in the parade ring, but he faded right out to finish a long way last. He was yet another major disappointment for the Godolphin team, whose trainer Saeed Bin Suroor said: "I don't know what is wrong with the horses. I just do not understand. All the horses look well and have all been working well."

Coming right back to his best form of 1995, sprinter Royal Applause (GB) gave trainer Barry Hills his sixth Duke Of York victory with a wire-to-wire win. He was chased all the way by the recent French Listed race winner Farhana (GB), but shook her off in the closing stages to win comfortably. He heads now for the G3 Cork & Orrery S. at Royal Ascot (June 19), followed by the G1 July Cup at Newmarket (July 10), both races over six furlongs. Sheikh Maktoum al Maktoum's racing manager Joe Mercer said: "He is a cracking natural sprinter, as he first showed as a two-year-old in 1995. He is a flying machine on pedigree. He lost his way last year after the 2000 Guineas and at the end of the year was turned out at Dalham Hall Stud for three months. He is back to his best again now. He could be champion sprinter this year, but he does prefer soft ground."

Local News, Arlington International:

Arlington International Racecourse's books show a \$69.8 million loss over the past eight years, according to financial statements audited by Arthur Andersen & Co. Disclosure of the loss--which includes depreciation on property and equipment--was published in an article in the *Daily Herald*, a newspaper in Arlington Heights, Ill, where the track is located. "We're meeting our bills but we're not getting any money back for the original risk and investment," Arlington's chief executive officer, Scott Mordell, told the *Daily Herald*. The article said that Arlington owner Richard Duchossois and his family invested \$200 million in rebuilding and reopening the track in 1989 after a 1985 fire destroyed its predecessor, Arlington Park. The audited statement reveals an operating profit of \$12.8 million, excluding depreciation, since 1989.
