### SALT IT LEAVES "K.D." BLUSHING IN BLACK-EYED SUSAN Making her first start in a graded race after running rapidly up the ladder in her last three, Salt It (Salt Lake) stunned the fans at Pimlico yesterday afternoon as she led from gate to wire in the GII \$200,000 Black-Eved Susan for her fourth consecutive score. But it wasn't the winner's 10-1 odds that caused a collective outcry from the crowd; it was the fourth-place finish of 1-10 favorite Blushing K.D. (Blushing John), who suffered only the second loss in her career. "She was not herself today," said Blushing K.D.'s rider, Lonnie Meche. "She didn't seem to have running on her mind. At about the half-mile pole, I felt she wanted to guit on me. And that's not her." With the odds-on choice out of the money, show prices for the top three lit up the tote board--Salt It paid \$22.20 to win but \$62.40 to show, while runner-up Buckeye Search (Meadowlake) paid \$72.20 to show and Holiday Ball (Black Tie Affair {Ire}) rewarded her backers with a \$95.00 payoff in the show spot. "I was looking for Blushing K.D.," said winning jockey Carlos Marquez Jr. "But they let me go so easy, my filly was relaxing down the backside. When I got to the eighth pole, she just took off. I knew they had to run to beat her today." The winner, an \$18,000 two-year-old purchase from last year's Fasig-Tipton Midlantic May sale, will start next in the GI Mother Goose at Belmont June 21. GEORGE STRAWBRIDGE J. NAMED TOBA "OWNER OF THE MONTH" After sending out winners on the flat and over fences, and stakes winners in America and Europe, George Strawbridge Jr. has been named the Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association "Owner of the Month" for April. His homebred Powder Bowl (Pleasant Colony) captured the GII Black Helen H. at Hialeah April 19, while Hidden Meadow (GB) (Selkirk) took the European Free H. on April 16; Strawbridge runners were also placed in stakes in France and England and at Keeneland, while his steeplechase stable boasted two winners during the month. The 59-year-old sportsman, a director of the Campbell's Soup Co. and Core States Financial Corp, sits on the executive committee of the National Hockey League's Buffalo Sabres. His Augustin Stables is the National Steeplechase Association's all-time leading money winner. Strawbridge, who has bred more than 35 stakes winners, currently has more than 40 horses in training.

Given a perfect lead in the centre of the track in this straight mile by Ali-Royal (Ire), First Island (Ire) smoothly won his second Group One event and his eighth career victory and now heads for a choice of engagements at Royal Ascot next month. The runner-up cruised to the lead a quarter mile out, but he was closely followed by First Island, who took over a furlong from home and, despite drifting to his left, ran on strongly for a comfortable win. The 1996 Irish 2000 Guineas winner Spinning World, the 9-4 favorite, made some progress at the eighth pole, but his effort petered out and he was caught on the line for third by Even Top (Ire). First Island, who won the G1 Sussex S. over a mile at Goodwood last summer, may stick to a mile for the G2 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot (June 17) or attempt to win the G2 Prince Of Wales S. over a mile and a quarter the same day for the second straight year. Winning trainer Geoffrey Wragg said: "He's so versatile that he is engaged in all the top mile and mile-and-a-quarter races, giving us plenty of options. He's so much better on ground like this, rather than when it's really soft." Spinning World was a great disappointment. Alan Cooper, racing manager to the Niarchos family, said: "He ran flat. He won in France on May 1 and he obviously needs more time between his races. He will probably have a break now until the Prix Jacques Le Marois at Deauville in August."

Salt It was beaten a neck in her debut, then reeled off three straight, most recently wiring the field in the March 23 Wide Country S. by 3 ½ lengths at Laurel. Back after a two-month break, the crowd's second choice broke alertly to set the pace and then pulled away in the stretch for her fourth victory in a row and her first in graded company. The 1-10 favorite BLUSH-ING K.D. (Blushing John), winner of five consecutive stakes races including the May 2 GI Kentucky Oaks in her previous start, raced just off the early pace on the inside before being steadied entering the backstretch; she angled out three-wide around the far turn to reach contention at the top of the stretch but weakened in the drive to finish fourth.

A superb performance from Yashmak, who had been a sick horse earlier in the year and ran poorly in stable companion Sleepytime's 1000 Guineas (May 4). The filly cruised through to take the lead at the half-mile mark and, pushed along by jockey Kieren Fallon, extended her advantage with every stride, winning just as impressively as her stablemate Reams Of Verse won the Musidora S. at York earlier in the week. Both Yashmak and Reams Of Verse are engaged in the Epsom Oaks on June 6, but no decision has been made as to whether both will run there; bookmakers have Reams Of Verse still at odds-on for Epsom, with Yashmak at 8-1. Yashmak's trainer Henry Cecil said: "I'm very fortunate to have three such good fillies--Sleepytime, Reams Of Verse and Yashmak. They went too fast for Yashmak in the Guineas, but she was always cantering here until Kieren made her work harder. She's a very good filly. She has a great pedigree and all her family improve with age, I will leave it to Prince Khaled (Abdullah) to decide where she and Reams Of Verse run next." Said Fallon: "Yashmak has improved so much since the 1000 Guineas. She gave me a great feel in her work before this race. I wouldn't know which to choose between her and Reams Of Verse. I will ride whichever one I am asked to. But Reams Of Verse can handle any track and any going, while Yashmak does need some give in the ground."
