CAPTAIN BODGIT RETIRED Captain Bodgit (Saint Ballado), second in the Kentucky Derby and third in last Saturday's Preakness S., has been retired from racing after suffering an injury to his left front leg. Barry Irwin, President of the colt's owner Team Valor, said, "He has a strain in the tendon. (Trainer) Gary Capuano noticed some swelling two days after the race (Preakness S.). It looked better yesterday, but an ultrasound scan showed there was a core lesion." Never worse than third in 12 career starts, Captain Bodgit retires with earnings of \$1,014,849 and a record of seven wins, one second and four thirds. Among his victories are the GI Florida Derby and GII Wood Memorial. According to Irwin, the injury is different from the strain the colt suffered as a two-year-old last spring. "He doesn't even know he's injured," trainer Gary Capuano said from his barn at Bowie Racecourse in Maryland. "He's in no pain, he jogs sound and is ready to go again right now. That's him." Team Valor purchased Captain Bodgit from Phyllis Susini for \$500,000 after he had finished third in the GIII Holv Bull S. at Gulfstream in his three-year-old debut. Trainer Bob Baffert, who watched his Silver Charm narrowly outrun Captain Bodgit in the first two legs of the Triple Crown commiserated with Capuano. "I hate to hear that because you know it can always happen to you," Baffert said, "I really feel for Gary Capuano. It's so hard to get a horse like that. He did a great job with that horse. Jockey Alex Solis, who partnered Captain Bodgit during the colt's gallant Triple Crown quest, was teary eved upon learning of the injury. "He gave me one of the biggest thrills of my life in the Derby," Solis said. "He is super special in my heart. To get a horse like him, especially a great warrior, he gave us all some great thrills."

GENTLEMEN OUT OF MASSCAP Gentlemen (Arg) (Robin des Bois), winner of the GI Pimlico Special in his last start, will skip the GIII Massachusetts H. at Suffolk Downs. After winning the May 10 Special, the five-yearold returned to California and was expected to head to Boston as the favorite for the May 31 race. "The travel (to Pimlico) took a little more out of him than we would have liked," explained assistant trainer Gary Mandella. "That's a risk you take when you ship them around the country. It happened with him and it's not in our best interests to ship him around again right now. We're going to leave him here (in California) and get him ready for the (June 29, GI) Hollywood Gold Cup."

Epsom trainer Philip Mitchell Wednesday decided not to send Predominate S. runner-up **Running Stag** (Cozzene) to New York for the Belmont S. Explaining his decision, Philip said: "He came out of the Predominate well, but I think the Belmont S. comes too soon for him. He will probably campaign in Europe but may go to Arlington Park in August (25) for the Secretariat S."

Jerry Bailey has been named to ride GII Illinois Derby winner **Wild Rush** (Wild Again) in the June 7 Belmont S. The horse had been ridden by Kent Desormeaux, who is committed to Preakness runner-up Free House. "Jerry is absolutely one of the best in the game right now," said assistant trainer Gary Mandella. "He knows Belmont Park very well and his style suits our horse very well. He can ride horses with a lot of different styles and always seems to get the best out of them. We're very happy to have him. He's a big-game hunter." Bailey won the 1991 Belmont S. aboard Hansel.

Her trainer, Henry Cecil told the *Times* newspaper earlier this week that Wafic Said's filly "is in very good form and has improved since last year. She's not had the pain she felt last year when she had to stand in her box for six weeks due to problems with her feet."

By winning the Gll Railbird S., I Ain't Bluffing (c, 3, Pine Bluff--Cup of Honey, by Raise a Cup) credited Pine Bluff with a first graded stakes winner from his first crop. Pine Bluff is a son of Danzig and the successful cross of a son of Danzig with a Raise a Cup mare is presaged by the success of Danzig with Raise a Cup's close genetic relative Alydar, the Danzig/Alydar cross having produced Lure, Strolling Along and Japanese Champion Yamanin Paradise. I Ain't Bluffing also has another combination which has proved to be fruitful--Pine Bluff is out of a mare by Halo and I Ain't Bluffing's second dam, Honey Deb, is by Herbager, a strain which Halo loves. We also shouldn't omit to note that when Honey Deb was bred to Danzig himself, the result was Mister C.--a four-time listed winner who is now a useful sire in Australia.
