SIR TRISTRAM DEAD Australasia's most influential stallion in decades, the recently retired **Sir Tristram (Ire)** (Sir Ivor), has been put down at the age of 26 after breaking a leg in a fall while galloping in a paddock at Patrick Hogan's Cambridge Stud in New Zealand. Sire of 42 Group 1 winners, Sir Tristram was leading sire in Australasia for many years and, until the arrival of Danehill, was the stallion most in demand at the bloodstock sales on both sides of the Tasman Sea. Said Hogan: "There were a lot of tears and everyone at the stud was very upset when we were advised by the vets to have him put down." Noted bloodstock writer Tony Morris said: "Sir Tristram was unquestionably the most successful stallion in Australasia since the second World War. Almost every season he attracted a book of more than 100 mares. He was not only a great success as a sire of major winners himself, he also became a great broodmare sire and, remarkably, a great sire of sires, too. His classic-winning son Grosvenor (NZ) sired this season's AJC Derby winner Ebony Grosve (NZ) and another of his sons, Zabeel (NZ), is of course the sire of Horse Of The Year Octagonal (NZ)."

CALDER OPENS TODAY Calder Race Course in Miami, Florida opens its 27th season today with a first-race post of 12:30 p.m. The season's \$4.1 million stakes program offers 34 stakes--16 worth \$100,000 or more, eight of which are in excess of \$200,000. Among the highlights of the stakes schedule is the \$250,000 Princess Rooney H., the richest sprint in the country for fillies and mares, to be contested on the richest day in Florida racing, the Festival of the Sun October 4. Calder Race Course will simulcast full cards from out-of-state tracks every live racing day until 10 p.m. Full-card simulcasting will also be offered on Wednesdays, when there is no live racing, but only to 7 p.m., as per state regulations. Live racing at Calder will generally follow a Thursday through Monday schedule, with a few exceptions. There will be live racing on Wednesday, September 3, Tuesday, October 28 and Tuesday, November 4. Post time will be 12:30 except on Mondays in June, July and August, when it will be 3 p.m.

BELMONT S. UPDATE

Kentucky Derby winner **Silver Charm** (Silver Buck) returned to the track yesterday morning at Churchill Downs for the first time since winning the Preakness S. last Saturday. Exercise rider Larry Damore was aboard for the 1 1/4-mile gallop. Afterwards, Damore said, "He was very aggressive. A little too aggressive really. He was getting to where he was pulling a little too much on me." Silver Charm will continue his series of daily gallops until a major workout scheduled for either Wednesday or Thursday next week. The Triple Crown hopeful will work at Churchill Downs on Tuesday of Belmont S. week before shipping to New York for the race.

The Belmont S. picked up an additional starter yesterday with the announcement that recent allowance runner-up **Irish Silence** (Seattle Song) will join the field. "We think the distance might make a big difference," trainer Leo O'Brien said. "We were happy to see that there were some defections and that it might be a small field. We're taking a shot." O'Brien said that John Velazquez will likely have the mount. Irish Silence was second in his last start, a May 14 allowance race at Belmont. In the \$40,000 race, he finished 1 1/2 lengths behind Mr. Groush. In his prior start, he won a \$37,000 allowance at Aqueduct. He's 2-for-8 lifetime with earnings of \$60,910.

DOMINION AWARD NOMINATIONS DUE Nominations are now being accepted for the fifth annual Dogwood Dominion Award, to be presented to an "unsung hero" in the Thoroughbred industry. The award, established in 1993, is named for Dogwood Stable's multiple graded-stakes winner and five-time champion sire in England who died that year. "This award was created to focus on the countless number of tireless behind-the-scenes workers who have created a positive influence on the racing and breeding world," said Dogwood President Cot Campbell. "The committee (Anne Campbell, Pat Day and Mack Miller) always has a hard time choosing just one winner, because there are so many worthy candidates." Nominations, which should include a description of the nominee's merits with their current address and telephone number and a photograph, must be postmarked by July 3. They can be mailed to Lila C. Campbell, Dogwood Stable Inc., P.O. Box 1549, Aiken, SC, 29802, or faxed to (803) 642-2747. The award, \$5,000 and a bronze sculpture of Dominion, will be presented at a luncheon at the Saratoga Reading Room Wednesday, August 6.

"Anyone who can access the Internet and has *Netscape Navigator 3.0* or higher only has to call us to get an ID and password and they can be using the system literally in minutes," said Rick Bailey, manager of The Jockey Club Registration services. "It takes a little longer to hook people up on the direct-dial network, but it's still an awfully easy process." A second win from three starts this season for the progressive Germano (GB), who went to the front a quarter-mile out and looked a comfortable winner, only for the Frankie Dettori-partnered King Alex (GB) to produce a good finish down the center of the track which only just failed. Winning trainer Geoffrey Wragg will now aim higher with Germano, with Group races in Germany on the colt's agenda. "He had back trouble last year," he said, "so he spent three months having therapy at his owner's stud in Germany and that has done the trick." Germano's rider Michael Hills had earlier collected a four-day suspension after winning the opening maiden race on Good Reputation, who was disqualified after a stewards' inquiry. Fortunately for him, Hills will not miss the Vodafone Epsom Derby on June 7, which he won last year on Shaamit (GB), his most important success to date.

King Of Swing worked in company with stablemate and MGSW Sandpit yesterday at Hollywood Park. The colt drilled a half-mile on the turf in :47 4/5. Bookmakers currently quote King Of Swing as a 100-1 shot for the race, while English 2000 Guineas winner **Entrepreneur (GB)** (Sadler's Wells) is even-money favorite.
