HENBIT PUT DOWN The 1980 Epsom Derby winner Henbit (*Hawaii) was put down earlier this week at the age of 20 after sustaining back injuries while covering a mare at Helshaw Grange Stud in Shropshire, England, where he had stood for the past six years. Trained by Major Dick Hern, Henbit won both the G3 Sandown Classic Trial and the G3 Chester Vase prior to his Epsom triumph, winning four times in his career and earning \$446,161. He was voted champion three-year-old middle-distance horse that year. In the Derby itself he sustained a hairline fracture of his off-fore cannon bone and yet ran on bravely for his Classic victory. Forced to miss the rest of 1980, he returned as a four-year-old, but failed to hit the board in two starts. He retired to stud in 1982 and became the sire of the winners of more than 350 races on the flat, but it was as a jump sire that he enjoyed his major successes, his progeny including the 1990 Champion Hurdle winner Kribensis (Ire).

OJC SELLS FORT ERIE George Hendrie, chairman of the Board of Trustees of The Ontario Jockey Club, announced yesterday that the Board has agreed to sell Fort Erie Racetrack to a group of Niagara Region businessmen including Henry Muller, president of MGI Packers Inc.; and Chester Waxman, president of I. Waxman & Sons Ltd.; and American businessman Nunzio DeSantis, chief executive officer of International Thoroughbred Breeders. The sale is scheduled to close July 11; the purchase price for the track was described as "nominal." "From our perspective, the purchase price is represented by the financial commitment necessary to carry on live racing at Fort Erie and to invest in the track's future," said David Willmot, OJC president and CEO. "This agreement is conditional only upon regulatory licensing. We are especially pleased for our Fort Erie employees and horsepeople to be able to resolve this matter in an expeditious manner."

"Northern Afleet seems to like Belmont a lot." The four-year-old has two Grade II wins to his credit this year, and his career earnings are \$438,900. "I think he has got a legitimate chance (in the Met Mile)," said the trainer. "He's got the right running style and the right temperamant for the race. He's got enough speed to lay close and can kick on."

MONMOUTH PARK OPENS TODAY Monmouth Park opens its 52nd season of racing on the Jersey Shore today. The highlight of the meet's stakes schedule is the GI Buick Haskell Invitational. On August 3, the race that has produced a champion in each of the past three years will become the first million-dollar race at Monmouth. Other features of the stakes program include the GII Molly Pitcher Breeders' Cup H. June 8, the GII Reeve Schley, Jr. S. July 19 and the GII Philip H. Iselin H. August 23. The seaside track looks to add to the successes of recent seasons. Hal Handel, Executive Vice President and Chief Operating Officer of Racing for the New Jersey Sports and Exposition Authority, said "For the past three seasons Monmouth has bucked the national trend with our on-track attendance increasing each year and our total handle up seven of the last eight seasons. We've already seen a lot of positive signs that make us optimistic about the '97 season." The opening average daily purse at Monmouth this year is \$240,000--the highest in track history. The 72-day meet runs through September 1. There will be no live racing on Mondays and Tuesdays, with the exception of Memorial Day, Monday, May 26. The track will also be open seven days a week for simulcasting.

When Hialeah Park trainer George Parrish sold four-year-old maiden **Aldrovandi** (Ten Keys) to Samuel Carter for \$1,000, he was under the impression the horse would be sent to Georgia. Carter explained he was taking the horse north to the daughter of friends who would use Aldrovandi as a riding horse. What Parrish didn't understand was Carter intended to ride the horse north. Carter got as far as Calder Race Course, 18 miles north of Hialeah, when he decided to rest on a bench outside the stable gate, tying a dehydrated and much the worse for the wear Aldrovandi to the bench while he napped. Calder security guards called track vets who brought in the South Florida Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals. Laurie Waggoner of the SPCA took charge of the horse and had cruelty-to-animal charges filed against Carter. What was left unanswered was how Carter get Aldrovandi out of Hialeah and through 18 miles of Miami's mean streets undetected.
