
SKIP AWAY BREEZES FOR MASS 'CAP Last vear's Champion Three-Year-Old Colt Skip Away (Skip Trial), still looking for his first victory of 1997, breezed five furlongs in :59 flat under jockey Carlos H. Marquez Jr. Monday at Monmouth Park. The work, over a muddy surface, was a full four seconds faster than the next best training move for the distance. "That's all I wanted, something easy," said trainer Sonny Hine. "Carlos looked like he put him to sleep the first part of it, but he picked it up nicely and he got the last eighth in :11 and change and galloped out three-quarters in 1:12 flat." The four-year-old gray is scheduled to van to Suffolk Downs Thursday morning for a start in the GIII Massachusetts H. May 31. In four starts this year, Skip Away has finished second three times and third once, his most recent effort being a runner-up performance in the GI Pimlico Special May 10. In other Mass 'Cap news, last year's Canadian Horse of the Year Mt. Sassafras (Mt. Livermore) has been declared from the race with a virus. However, another horse was added to the list of probables when Geri (Theatrical {Ire}) was scratched from Monday's Met Mile due to a muddy racetrack.

TOUCH GOLD HEADED FOR BELMONT

STAKES Encouraged by the progress made by Touch Gold (Deputy Minister) since grabbing his quarter at the start of the Preakness May 17, trainer David Hofmans declared vesterday that the three-year-old will make his next start in the June 7 Belmont S. Quarter crack specialist Ian McKinlay worked on Touch Gold yesterday and will apply a patch to the injured area tomorrow. "I'm growing more positive and all because of the foot," Hofmans said. "I wasn't as much concerned about his conditioning as I was the foot. I'm starting look forward to the race." The colt, fourth in the Preakness, will work Friday, going "at least six furlongs," according to the trainer. "I want him to go slow and easy," he said. "If he does that easy and isn't too tired, we'll know more. He's taking his gallops strong and good and is acting like he's okay."

The champion sprinter in Canada last year, Langfuhr shipped down from his native land twice in '96, taking the GII Forego H. at Saratoga and the GI Vosburgh at Belmont. Second in the GIC Vigil H. at Woodbine off a six-month layoff April 20, the bay was back on the road for his last start, shipping to Aqueduct to take the GI Carter H., and he earned his fourth straight New York stakes win here. Content to sit at the back of the pack through fractions of :22.29 and :44.45 set by STALWART MEMBER (Claramount), the crowd's third choice made his move around the far turn, joining longshot Western Winter in the stretch and proving narrowly best after a prolonged drive. "There was a lot of speed in the race and the track was favoring speed, but you can't rush this horse or else you lose control," said winning jockey Jorge Chavez. "We stayed back a little, but then we were behind horses and I was worried that I didn't bring enough goggles--I was down to my last ones. That's why we came out a little--so I could see." The 2-1 favorite ISITINGOOD (Crusader Sword), breaking from post 10, was uncharacteristically far back early, sitting sixth after a quarter and seventh after a half; five-wide on the turn, he had nothing left for the final furlong and finished fifth.



In a six-horse field highlighted by such standouts as multiple Grade I winners SANDPIT (BRZ) (Baynoun {Ire}), Sunshack (GB) and Marlin, only one of the entrants had yet to add a graded stakes to his resume. Rainbow Dancer took care of that Monday, upsetting his five competitors and paying \$41.20 for a \$2 win bet. The six-year-old, a listed stakes-winner in France, came to the U.S. for his 1997 campaign and had been winless in two stateside starts, most recently finishing 10th and last behind Marlin in the GII San Luis Rey at Santa Anita March 23. Rested for two months following that effort, Rainbow Dancer displayed his sharpness with a bullet seven-furlong work over the Hollywood turf course May 18. Ridden for the first time here by Alex Solis, he threw his head slightly at the start after being a bit fractious in the gate, saved ground while fifth early, angled outside on the second turn, then closed gamely in the stretch to get up in the final strides. "I was very disappointed after his last race," said winning trainer Jenine Sahadi, who took the Westchester S. with twoyear-old Majorbigtimesheet earlier on yesterday's card. "The chart line didn't show it, but he banged the rail pretty hard." Sahadi wore the same outfit yesterday that she had on when Grand Flotilla won the 1994 Hollywood Turf H., her first major stakes victory. The race's biggest surprise may have been the subpar performance of 3-2 favorite Sandpit, who was making his first start since finishing third in the April 3 Dubai World Cup. The eight-year-old led early through slow fractions of :25 3/5, :49 4/5 and 1:13 2/5 before giving way in the stretch to be sixth and last. "It's hard to believe Sandpit ran like that," said trainer Richard Mandella. "I'm afraid of what I might find tomorrow. But he looked fine walking off. The slow pace shouldn't have been any problem. Back to the drawing board."

MAJOR DICK HERN TO RETIRE After 40 years as a trainer, one of the great names on the British racing scene--Major Dick Hern--has decided to retire at the end of the current season. "The Major" first took out his licence in November, 1957 and since then has trained three Epsom Derby victors--Troy, Henbit and Nashwan. He also saddled three Epsom Oaks heroines--including Her Majesty The Queen's Dunfermline, seven winners of the Doncaster St. Leger, two winners of both the British 1000 and 2000 Guineas, five winners of the G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. and Champion Sprinter Dayjur, voted 1990 Horse of the Year in England. For much of his career, he was No.1 trainer to The Queen, but in recent years he has trained mainly for Sheikh Hamdan al Maktoum, For much of the past decade, The Major has been confined to a wheelchair after suffering severe injuries in a hunting accident, but this did not in any way diminish his enthusiasm or his skill in his career. "I've had a licence for 40 years," said Hern Monday. "I've been fortunate enough to train some very good horses for some very good owners and I've enjoyed every minute of it."
