BAFFERT HAPPY WITH SILVER CHARM'S

WORK Trainer Bob Baffert is as certain as ever that his Kentucky Derby and Preakness winner Silver Charm (Silver Buck) is ready to become racing's twelfth Triple Crown winner after the colt worked seven furlongs in 1:27 3/5 and galloped out a mile in 1:42 yesterday morning at Churchill Downs. "I feel confident about him winning the Belmont," Baffert said during a teleconferance hosted by the Thoroughbred Racing Communications. "He's bright, he looks sharp, and he's eating well. Unless there's a horse with super powers, I don't see him getting beat." Silver Charm will ship to Belmont Park from Kentucky on Wednesday. "He won't be there too long to stir him up too much," he said. "I was up there this week, and we figured out where to keep the horse at Mark Hennig's barn. It's a nice barn, and it's nice and quiet." The 44-year-old trainer noted the horse's great physical condition, pedigree, and determination as reasons for a possible Belmont victory. "The Derby was his best race," he explained. "In the Preakness, he ran good enough to win. That was totally heart and guts." As for the man himself, the Arizona native is trying not to let the pressure of winning the Triple Crown get to him. "I try to keep the pressure at the back of my mind, he said. "It's like taking a long putt on a golf course, the more you think about it, the more chance of blowing it." Baffert also acknowledged the importance of a Triple Crown winner to the sport. "When you have a horse running in the Triple Crown, it special," he said. "It's on T.V., and if you're not on T.V., then you're nothing these days. People are following Silver Charm, so now they have something to follow like other sports have Michael Jordan or Ken Griffey Jr."

VISA UPS TRIPLE CROWN ANTE In a move to underscore the significance of the Visa Triple Crown Challenge and with the possibility of the first Triple Crown winner in 19 years looming, Visa U.S.A. and Triple Crown Productions announced yesterday that they have increased the bonus for winning the Belmont S. by an additional \$1.5 million to a total of \$5 million. In previous years, purses from the Kentucky Derby, Preakness S. and Belmont S. would have counted toward the guaranteed \$5 million total. Under the new structure, in addition to the purses from the three races, owners Bob and Beverly Lewis will be awarded a \$5 million bonus if Silver Charm sweeps all three classics.

Churchill Downs has increased overnight purses by 15 percent, effective today. The increase is the second of the meet and follows an eight percent boost May 14. "This is a direct reflection of our on-track and national simulcast business," said Churchill Downs Vice President and Racing Secretary Jerry Botts. "Fortunately, the totals have surpassed our pre-meet estimates, allowing us to readjust our overnight purses. Our initial increase earlier this month was due to record Kentucky Derby wagering." The increase will boost Churchill's lowest purses to \$10,000, before added monies, with the top allowance purses jumping to \$48,000 without added monies.

WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES

by Alan Porter

DESERT KING (IRE) (c, 3, Danehill--Sabaah, by Nureyev)

Synchronicity seems to have been at work in the results of two of the weekend's most prestigious mile contests. On Monday, the GI Metropolitan H. was won by Langfuhr, a son of Danzig inbred 3x3 to Nearctic in the male line of the sire and dam. The previous day saw an impressive G1 Lexus Irish 2,000 Guineas victory for Desert King, a grandson of Danzig inbred 3x3 to Nearctic's son, Northern Dancer, in the male line of sire and dam.

We have tackled Langfuhr in a previous column, so we will turn the spotlight on Desert King. Perhaps the first thing to note is that he is bred on similar lines to the Group 1 winning miler Maroof, who is by Danzig out of Desert King's granddam Dish Dash.

Danehill seems to positively enjoy getting more Northern Dancer in his mates and at least eight of his stakes winners are inbred to Northern Dancer. Of course, Danehill is virtually unique for a Northern Dancer sire in that his granddam is a half-sister to Northern Dancer, which means that every Danehill with Northern Dancer in the dam has a triple of Natalma, once through a daughter. Note that Machiavellian, who is free of Northern Dancer but who also has Natalma as his third dam, has already sired nine stakes winners out of mares carrying Northern Dancer, and that Machiavellian's half-brother Exit to Nowhere sired a 1996 first crop Group 1 winner out of a mare by a son of Northern Dancer.

Danehill's propensity for Northern Dancer in the dam may not be due to Natalma alone. Danzig supplies him with Petition, and like Langfuhr, Danehill has Alibhai on the distaff side. Whereas the daughter strain of Natalma balances the distaff side of Northern Dancer's pedigree, Petition and Alibhai provide balance for Northern Dancer's sire, Nearctic. Petition is by a son of Fairway out of a mare by a son of Gainsborough, and has Tracery and Desmond close up on the distaff side. Nearctic is by a son of Pharos (brother to Fairway) out of a mare by a son of Gainsborough with Tracery and Desmond close up on the distaff side. When we come to Alibhai, we find that he is by Hyperion out of a Tracery mare, and Nearctic's dam, Lady Angela, is by Hyperion out of a mare by a son of Tracery.

PEDIGREE SHORTS

We couldn't help but be intrigued by the pedigree of Sunday's Irish listed winner Dr. Johnson (c, 3, Woodman--Russian Ballet, by Nijinsky II). Out of a three-parts sister to El Gran Senor, Dr. Johnson has Buckpasser 3x3 and Busanda, her three-parts sister Striking and Striking's brother Mr. Busher 4x5x5x4. Woodman has already sired a stakes-winner out of a mare by El Gran Senor's brother Compliance, so he looks a natural to try with El Gran Senor mares.

One combination which we find extremely hard to explain but which keeps coming up with good winners is that of Roberto and Sharpen Up. The latest example is Classic Park (GB) (f, 3, Robellino--Wanton {GB}, by Kris {GB}), surprise winner of the classic G1 Airlie/Coolmore Irish 1,000 Guineas Saturday. The pedigree is extremely similar to an earlier classic-winning miler, the 1994 2,000 Guineas winner Mister Baileys, who is by Robellino out of a Sharpen Up mare. The combination of Robellino's sire Roberto with Sharpen Up's sons Kris and Diesis is easier to understand than with Sharpen Up himself. The brothers are out of a mare by Reliance II, whose broodmare sire is Relic. Roberto is inbred 4x4 to Blue Larkspur, a very close relative to the dam of Relic. Oddly enough, Relic is by War Relic, which brings us to the very successful combination of Roberto with In Reality, a horse inbred to War Relic. To complete a full circle. In Reality's best son is probably Known Fact. who is out of a half-brother to Atan, sire of Sharpen Up.

With regard to Sharpen Up's family, we also noted the pedigree of Out West (f, 3, Gone West--Chellingoua, by Sharpen Up {GB}), winner of a listed stakes at Goodwood in England May 22. She is inbred 4x4 to the mare Mixed Marriage, third dam of Gone West and dam of Atan. This is the second stakes winner by Gone West out of a Sharpen Up mare, and there are also a couple of stakes winners inbred to Mixed Marriage through Sharpen Up and Known Fact, a grandson of Mixed Marriage.

Late Friday night, the GII Jersey Derby was taken by Rob 'n Gin (c, 3, Farma Way--Windy Mindy, by Honey Jay), who streaked home in track record time. Rob 'n Gin's pedigree is interesting in that he has a rarely seen duplication of the South American-bred Endeavour II. What's more, in both Rob 'n Gin's grandsire Marfa and his third dam Supreme Endeavour, the Endeavour II strain is combined with Nasrullah. There is another notable cross in the pedigree, too. Farma Way goes back to the Idle Hour-bred mare Beanie M., and she is a three-guarters relative to Balladier, who is in the male line of Rob 'n Gin's maternal grandsire Honey Jay. Farma Way's third dam, En Casserole, is by War Relic out of Beanie M., and Farma Way stakes winners Beefchopper and Grant Road both have Relic, a threeguarters relative to En Casserole.
