FREE HOUSE WORKS Preakness runner-up and Belmont S. hopeful Free House (Smokester) worked five furlongs yesterday morning in 1:01 3/5 with exercise rider Sal Gonzalez up. He galloped out six furlongs in 1:13 3/5. Splits for the work were :24 4/5 and :36 4/5. "He did it easy," trainer Paco Gonzalez said. "My brother Sal said he was thinking, 'Boy I hope we're not going too slow,' because he was just on a long lead galloping along." The grey colt went to the Belmont track shortly before 6 a.m. vesterday, earlier than scheduled due to the threat of heavy rains. Gonzalez made the decision to stage Free House's work earlier thanks to a meteorological-minded taxi driver. "The taxi driver said it might rain for the next three or four days," Gonzalez said. "I said, 'Shhheee, I have to work this horse. I hope they don't seal it and make it hard." Paco and his brother inspected the track upon his arrival, saw it was not sealed, decided it looked as good as it was going to get and tacked up Free House. The colt will walk Tuesday and then gallop up to the race. Robert Perez's Mr. Energizer (High Energy) also worked in preparation for Saturday's Belmont S. The colt, a winner of six straight in Panama, breezed seven furlongs in 1:29 in a steady rain on the "good" main track.

LOUIS QUATORZE TO ASHFORD Coolmore Stud has reached an agreement in principle with owners William Condren, Joe Cornacchia and Georgia Hoffman for the purchase of 1996 GI Preakness S. winner Louis Quatorze (Sovereign Dancer). He will stand the 1998 stud season at Coolmore-owned Ashford Stud in Versailles, Kentucky. Louis Quatorze is undefeated in two starts this year, including a 13-length triumph in the April 23 GIII Ben Ali S. at Keeneland. The four-year-old suffered an ankle chip following that race and has not run since. He has earned \$2,054,434 with seven wins in 18 starts.

#### THE SILVER CHARM REPORT

It doesn't seem that long ago, but it has been eight years since Sunday Silence headed to Belmont Park with two-thirds of the Triple Crown already in his back pocket, ready to test arch rival Easy Goer in the "Test of the Champion," the mile-and-a-half Belmont Stakes. Easy Goer, of course, silenced Sunday's attempt to become racing's 12th Triple Crown winner, running away with the Belmont by eight lengths. Eight years since the possibility existed; 19 years since the Triple Crown dream became a reality with Affirmed's unbelievable victory over Alydar in the 1978 Belmont S.

Now we approach the final jewel in the 1997 Crown, crossing fingers and toes in the hopes that the gallant grey **Silver Charm** (Silver Buck) can overcome the longest of odds and add the Belmont to his stirring successes in the Kentucky Derby and the Preakness. A time for racing to stand up and cheer--and a time to spend a moment with the connections of this wonderful colt.

We asked owner Bob Lewis to share some of his thoughts as the Belmont draws near.

TDN: What were you doing during when Affirmed ('78), Seattle Slew ('77), Secretariat ('73) and Citation ('48) won their Triple Crowns?

Bob: I can't remember what we did for the last three. We were either attending or had some type of party, but I can tell you exactly where we were in '48. Television was not broadly available back in 1948, and the price for a t.v. set was, of course, an arm and a leg. So, back in those days, we'd go to the El Patio Grill in Pomona, California. That's where we saw all three of Citation's Triple Crown races. Goodness, that was 49 years ago! TDN: How has the publicity changed your life?

Bob: Well, following the Derby our home became a florist shop--we had a corner on the beautiful rose market. We got jillions of them--they were just everywhere! Also, I have to agree with Chris McCarron, who said during a teleconference that the time between the Derby and the Preakness flew by, but the time from the Preakness to the Belmont seems like an absolute eternity. People are coming out of the woodwork. Every waking hour, if we're not doing an interview, we're on a radio broadcast or a t.v. show. It truly impacts your life, but it's delightful. We'll always look back on this time with great joy. It's fun seeing the level of enthusiasm the whole Triple Crown has brought to racing.

TDN: What do you to relax?

Bob: We just go to bed. We were asleep by 1:30 a.m. last night and then up with the phone ringing at 6:15. We're on a mad tear and enjoying every minute of it.

TDN: Who is the most interesting person you have met on the Triple Crown trail?

Bob: Well, that would be trainer I know by the name of Bob Baffert. Hasn't he been a blessing to be associated with? He's just a great young man--a breath of fresh air, He's just what the industry needed. And he does a marvelous job.

TDN: Do you have any superstitions, maybe a lucky outfit to wear on Belmont Day?

Bob Lewis: I won't let myself have any superstitions--I don't have any hang-ups, unless not having any superstitions counts as one. But the Baffert ladies--Bob's mother and his sisters and his lovely wife, Sherry--made up these green and yellow ribbons with pretty little silver charms hanging from them, and they gave one to Beverly to wear as well. They all had them on for the Derby and the Preakness, and you can bet they'll all be wearing them for the Belmont.

TDN: What will you be doing Sunday morning?
Bob: We have Sunday morning blocked out to get a little rest. Whichever way the ball bounces, we've had a magnificent ride, a wonderful experience. How many connections have had the winner of the first two races in the Triple Crown? Just to be in that select group is an honor and a privilege. We're very lucky. The Belmont will be a magnificent race, the epitome of what Thoroughbred racing has to offer.

TDN: If they made a movie of your lives, who would you want to play you?

Bob: What's that young man's name--Tom Cruise. And Beverly said, if we are going to be totally outrageous, she'd like Madonna to play her.

TDN: What is your philosophy for getting through the trials of the Triple Crown?

Bob: Just take it as it comes. After we won the Derby, the first person to congratulate us was D. Wayne Lukas. He threw his arms around me and said, `Enjoy it for all it's worth.' It's a period of elation that few people are privileged to enjoy.

Silver Charm will have his final Belmont S. workout this morning at Churchill Downs. The breeze is scheduled for between 8:15 and 8:30 a.m. EDT.
