STEVENS GUARANTEES BELMONT WIN While Silver Charm (Silver Buck) was relocating from Churchill Downs to Belmont Park yesterday morning, jockey Gary Stevens was predicting the grev colt would win Saturday's Belmont S. to become racing's twelfth Triple Crown winner. "I'm guaranteeing it. Yessir, I am," the Hall of Fame rider said. "We've got to make it exciting. It's been a long time since Joe Namath did that in New York. Someone's got to do it." Explaining his confidence, Stevens said, "(Trainer) Bob (Baffert) was nervous before the Preakness, which made me uneasy. I didn't feel he had trained him quite as hard as he had for the Kentucky Derby. For me, that was genius. He knew if he went hard for both races, he'd probably be sitting on empty for the Belmont. He said he relied on class for the Preakness to get us by. That's why I'm guaranteeing a win. If what Bob tells me is true, then I'll guarantee the win." Meanwhile, Silver Charm and trainer Bob Baffert were late leaving Churchill Downs yesterday morning. "We were a little bit behind schedule because I didn't pack last night," Baffert explained. But once packed, the trip progressed without incident. Once landed in New York, the Triple Crown hopeful received a police escort for the trip from JFK International Airport to the track. "The police escort was great," Baffert admitted. "People were looking around to see who was coming. It was fun." Baffert said his colt would jog Thursday morning and gallop Friday and Saturday.

TDN: What will you wear for Belmont Day?

Silver: I guess I'll be wearing that old blue shadow roll again--something about it being lucky now, I guess. But it really doesn't match my silks. Maybe they'll buy me a new one after the Triple Crown, and the rest of the colts will quit busting on me.

TDN: If they made a movie of this year's Triple Crown, who would you want to play you?

Silver: I know--that cool T. Rex from Lost World. And at the end of the movie, instead of going back to my stall, I could invade Manhattan!

TDN: What is your philosophy for getting through the trials of the Triple Crown?

Silver: Simple--just win. I'll tell you, I didn't think I was going to get it done last time. That Free House just wouldn't give it up. But then Captain Bodgit tried to get by me, too--I would have been third! Can you imagine? I've never been third in my life. So I put my head down, and like I said--just win.

FIRST ISLAND'S FUTURE IN DOUBT Mollers Racing's First Island (Ire) (Dominion {GB}) has suffered a serious injury on the Newmarket gallops and his future racing career is in doubt. The five-year-old, winner of the G1 Lockinge S. over a mile at Newbury May 16, is to have an operation next week. He had been pointing towards the June 17 G2 Prince of Wales S. at the Royal Ascot meeting where he would have faced champion filly Bosra Sham (Woodman) and South African champion London News (SAf) (Bush Telegraph {SAf}). His trainer Geoffrey Wragg said: "First Island's racing career looks in doubt after he suffered a spiral fracture of the right cannon bone while working today (Wednesday). He will need to have surgery, but the prognosis appears favorable." First Island, victorious in the 1996 G1 Sussex S. and G2 Prince of Wales S., has started 19 times in Great Britain, with seven wins for earnings of \$621,580.


