ANOTHER SPONGED HORSE FOUND The report came in Thursday to the Kentucky Racing Commission: a Thoroughbred stabled at Ellis Park named Early Conquest was found to have a sponge located in his nostril. The Commission was contacted by security personnel at Ellis Park; attending veterinarians determined that the five-year-old remains in good health. Owned by Dennis Townsend and trained by Earl Murphy, Early Conquest most recently raced at Churchill Downs June 8, finishing last in a seven-horse field in a 1 1/2-mile starter allowance. The horse shipped to Churchill Downs from Ellis Park the day of the race; he was the 7-5 morning line favorite and was sent off as the co-favorite with the eventual winner, Cayenne. "Our primary concern is the integrity of Kentucky racing," said Kentucky Racing Commission Executive Director/Chief Steward Bernard J. Hettel. "We will intensify our pre-race testing measures with every horse racing at Churchill Downs in order to ensure the safety of the horses and riders, and to maintain the confidence of the public. This is a senseless activity, and we will use all resources possible to apprehend whoever is responsible." Hettel said the Kentucky Racing Commission will intensify its use of a diagnostic Airflow Measuring Meter designed at the University of Kentucky Gluck Equine Center. The device allows racing officials to check horses for airflow impediments in pre-race screening exams. The device had been used on a random basis with approximately 25 percent of the horses racing in Kentucky. Hettel indicated that as of Thursday, June 12, every horse racing at Churchill Downs will be subject to pre-race screening with the device. In June, 1996, a total of eight horses racing at Churchill were found to have sponges inserted in their breathing passages. Two more incidents turned up in November, but were believed to be "copycats." Hettel also indicated that the investigation into the matter will be intensified. The FBI was contacted immediately, and a \$25,000 reward remains in place for information leading to the conviction of the person or persons involved. In a statement released Friday, Churchill Downs' spokesperson Karl Schmitt said, "We want to send a clear message to our fans that the fairness, integrity and safety of horse racing at Churchill Downs is of utmost priority. We also want to reaffirm our commitment to supporting the Kentucky Racing Commission and to the law enforcement agencies in apprehending those responsible for this reprehensible act."

SILVER CHARM BACK TO WORK Not even the great ones can vacation all the time. After a tough Triple Crown trail that began with victories in the Kentucky Derby and Preakness and ended with a gallant second-place effort in the June 7 Belmont S., **Silver Charm** (Silver Buck) was given six days of well-earned rest. That short respite will end today, when the three-year-old colt returns to the track for the first time since last Saturday's event. He is scheduled to jog a mile shortly after the Churchill Downs oval opens for training at 6 a.m. Silver Charm's current caretaker is trainer April Mayberry, who is filling in for California-based conditioner Bob Baffert. Baffert and Silver Charm will be honored for their accomplishments in a special celebration at Churchill Downs Saturday, June 21.

WILL'S WAY TO HOLLYWOOD? Trainer Jim Bond is strongly considering shipping 1996 Travers champ **Will's Way** (Easy Goer) to Hollywood Park for the \$1 million Hollywood Gold Cup--second leg of the \$4.8 million MGM Grand Classic Crown--Saturday, June 29. "It's at the top of our list, no question," Bond said yesterday by telephone from his barn at Belmont Park. "The horse came out of the Mass 'Cap in good shape and I think it would be the right thing to do to come out there for the Gold Cup, because we hope to come out there in November for the Breeders' Cup." The four-year-old colt was third in the Gill Massachusetts H. May 31, closing from the back of the pack to finish behind Skip Away and Formal Gold. "I was a little disappointed in the way he ran in the Mass 'Cap," Bond said. "I wanted him to be closer to the pace--he was too far off it. It wasn't a disgrace, but it wasn't what we wanted either." Bond said the July 4 Suburban H. at Belmont is the other possibility for Will's Way, who has won five of 10 career starts and \$621,400.

AMERICA'S DAY TRACKS NOW NUMBER 14

With Rockingham Park and Finger Lakes adding their names to the list, the tracks scheduled to participate in *America's Day at the Races* now stands at 14. *America's Day* hopes to establish Labor Day as the holiday Americans celebrate at the racetrack. "We're partnering with our horsemen, the local Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association. We'll be talking with them to coordinate activities," said John Kolomic, director of publicity and marketing at Finger Lakes. "It certainly is a long overdue concept--something like this should have been going on for 20 years. You've got to start somewhere." Rockingham Park will offer a double-header card Labor Day, with first post for the first card set for 10:30 a.m. There has been one defection from the *America's Day* effort; Wyoming Downs has been forced to withdraw due to a reduction in live racing days. The track, normally open through Labor Day, will close August 3 this year.

Grade I winner **Auriette** (Ire) (Caerleon) returns to racing in today's fifth race at Hollywood Park, a one-mile turf allowance for fillies and mares ages four and up. The five-year-old mare, unraced since her sixth-place finish in the GI Matriarch S. at Hollywood Dec. 1, 1996, was turned out for three months following that effort. "She bled after the Matriarch and lost a lot of weight," said trainer Marty Jones. "It's happened with her before, and the best thing to do is to just fill the cup back up and give her some time." Auriette, winner of the GI Gamely H. over the Hollywood turf course last June, has won five of 17 career outings for earnings of \$557,550.

Corey Black rode four consecutive winners at Hollywood Thursday, the first time the 28-year-old jockey has won four races in a day at the Inglewood, California oval. "I knew all four horses had good chances," Black said. "I feel like I'm riding well, but I didn't do anything special today, that's for sure."
