CHAMPION BAYAKOA DEAD Bayakoa (Arg)

(Consultant's Bid), Eclipse Champion Older Mare in 1989 and in 1990, was put down last Saturday after foundering in both front feet. The 13-year-old mare produced her fourth foal on May 7 at Pennbrook Farm outside of Lexington, Kentucky and foundered shortly after, according to farm owner Frank Penn. "Founder is a hard thing to know what causes it," Penn explained. "We fought it for five weeks, but she had to be put down. We thought we were winning it, but you don't win many of these cases. It wasn't humane to keep going." Her last foal, a filly by Broad Brush, is with a nurse mare and is doing fine. Bayakoa began her racing career in her native Argentina where she won the 1987 G1 Gran Premio Palermo. She was sent to the United States in 1988 and became a dominant force in her division, winning 12 Grade I races in 1989 and 1990. During her march to championship titles in those two years, she won back-to-back editions of the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff, GI Santa Margarita Invitational, GI Spinster and GI Milady H. The bay mare raced 31 times in North America, recording 18 wins and six seconds for earnings of \$2,785,259.

British 2,000 Guineas fourth Starborough (GB) posted a wire-to-wire victory here, defeating Italian & German 2,000 Guineas winner Air Express (Ire), French 2,000 Guineas winner Daylami (Ire) and Irish 2,000 Guineas winner DESERT KING (IRE) (Danehill). Just as he had done when winning the G1 Prix Jean Prat at Chantilly June 1, Starborough jumped to the front from the gate, setting a good pace. At the guarter-mile pole Air Express made his move and tried to challenge the leader, but he never seriously threatened, while neither Daylami nor Desert King could produce any sort of challenge. Winning trainer David Loder was quick to pay tribute to Starborough's owner-breeder, Sheikh Mohammed al Maktoum, saying, "I wanted to send the horse to France at the weekend for Grand Prix de Paris, but Sheikh Mohammed insisted he run here. This was a very impressive effort. I felt that he preferred to go around a bend, rather than tackle Newmarket's straight mile and, with the benefit of hindsight, we might have been better off running in the French Guineas. He certainly showed he likes a bend when he won the Jean Prat. He has improved several pounds since the 2,000 Guineas and I knew it would take a good one to beat him today." With his win here, Starborough earned himself a possible match-up with G2 Prince of Wales's S. winner Bosra Sham in the July 5 Eclipse S.

British racing's favorite lady gave her trainer Henry Cecil his 61st winner at the Royal Ascot meeting with an absolutely stunning victory. She cruised along in fourth early while Alhaarth set a good pace, but at the guarter-mile pole she stormed into the lead and drew further away from the field with every stride, making the official eight-lengths margin look conservative. Cecil paid Bosra Sham the ultimate compliment, saying, "She is probably the best I have ever trained and I've been reluctant to say that before. She has tremendous guts and talent, one of the best ever. She never does too much. Even today she was looking around her, looking at the crowd. The public loves her and so do we. She is the flagship of the stable. She is at her best over a mile and a quarter and will probably run next in the Eclipse S. at Sandown (July 5), but I will discuss it with the owner." When asked about the Breeders Cup, Cecil replied, "She would have to run on the dirt in the Breeders Cup Classic, so we might miss that, but we might go for a race like the Yellow Ribbon, if we go 'international' with her."

The Florida-bred rallied from mid-field here to take his first European group event. Godolphin's racing manager Simon Crisford said, "It's nice to be back in the winner's circle, especially at Royal Ascot. But we were not completely surprised by this win, as Allied Forces has been working well and we were very pleased with him. We will test him against the best now and reckon he has a good future. The Sussex S. at Goodwood (July 30 over a mile) is probably next."

Aidan O'Brien, a 27-year-old Irish trainer in only his fourth season training horses, broke his Classic "maiden" the weekend of May 24-25 when saddling Classic Park to win the Irish 1,000 Guineas and Desert King to land the Irish 2,000 Guineas. O'Brien was training his first winner on the flat in England yesterday and came home with a group stakes winner. It was also an astonishing victory as Harbour Master, wearing blinkers for the first time, appeared to have no chance with a quarter mile left to run, where Bold Fact took command, only to veer sharply across the track and throw away the race. Christy Roche conjured a great finish out of Harbour Master, who was switched to the rail and ran on too powerfully for the favored Desert Prince. O'Brien said, "It's great to be able to come to this great meeting and to have a winner. I'd like to thank all my team here and at home for their part in this victory, as well as Christy, who has been a major part of our success. I have always rated this colt highly, but he ran very green and was slowly out of the stalls at The Curragh last time, when he was well beaten. That was not a happy experience for him, so we decided to put the blinkers on him to teach and guide him. It was only a last-minute decision to run him here."

WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES by Alan Porter

PEDIGREE SHORTS

We have long been keen on the Caerleon/Forli cross, Caerleon's maternal grandsire Round Table having some important connections with Forli. It has so far produced group/grade one winners Shinko Lovely, In a Tiff and Welsh Guide, but until last weekend no graded stakes winners from a version we really like, Caerleon with mares by Formidable. That was put right Sunday when Pinfloron (Fr) (g, 5, Caerleon--Pinaflore, by Formidable) won the GII Shoemaker Breeders Cup Mile. Caerleon's sire Nijinsky II has worked with the family of Formidable as Nijinsky II is sire of graded stakes winner Key Flyer and Key Flyer's sister Dancing Key (dam of Japanese Grade 1 winners Dance Partner and Dance in the Dark) out of a half-sister to Formidable's dam. The success of this combination should come as no surprise when we look at the pedigrees of Nijinsky II's dam Flaming Page and Formidable's dam Dinner Partner. Flaming Page has Bull Dog, Menow, Blue Larkspur and Man o' War all close up in her pedigree. This quartet all reappear in the first three generations of Dinner Partner who is by Tom Fool, the horse who probably has more "assists" for Nijinsky II line stakes winners than any other sire.

The rather similar Spring Run/Tom Fool combination (both Menow out of Bull Dog mares) couldn't let the weekend go without getting in on the act. The improving Subordination (c, 3, Mt. Livermore--Not So Careless, by Desert Wine) produced a game display to win the GIII Hill Prince S. at Belmont on Sunday. He is by a grandson of Red God (dam Spring Run) and is out of a mare with Tom Fool 5x3 in her pedigree.

One pair of relatives which we have tried to combine in pedigrees--Glamour and Never Say Die--appeared together in the GII Stephen Foster H. winner City By Night (c, 4, Slew City Slew--Shift Surprise, by Night Shift). Glamour, who appears in Seattle Slew, the sire of Slew City Slew, is by Nasrullah out of a War Admiral mare. Never Say Die, winner of the Derby and St. Leger in England, is the best male representative of the Nasrullah/War Admiral cross. He appears as sire of City By Night's third dam.
