ROYAL ASCOT A ROLLER COASTER RIDE

FOR STEVENS Riding at his first Royal Ascot meeting, jockey Gary Stevens earned his first victory at the prestigious event with a sensational effort on Predappio (GB) (Polish Precedent) in vesterday's G2 Hardwicke S. But just one race after celebrating the win. Stevens was handed a two-day suspension by the Ascot stewards for "improper use of the whip" after finishing second on Michael Tabor's heavilybacked Danetime (Ire) (Danehill) in the valuable Wokingham H. His suspension was scheduled to be in effect June 29-30, but Stevens is booked to ride Gentlemen (Arg) in the GI Hollywood Gold Cup and Donna Viola (GB) in the GI Beverly Hills H. June 29, and so he will instead be out of action June 30 and July 6. As for his Royal Ascot triumph, Stevens said, "It might be raining, but when you ride a winner the sun comes out. It's been a great fun week for me. This is right up there with my wins in the Kentucky Derby. It is such a thrill to be led into the winner's circle at Roval Ascot." News cont. p3

Predappio (GB), a close runner-up to Bosra Sham in the G3 Brigadier Gerard S. May 27, outgamed 1996 Breeders' Cup Turf hero Pilsudski (Ire), the 2-1 favourite, to take the race in the final strides. Jockev Garv Stevens, who replaced the suspended Frankie Dettori, moved Predappio to join pacesetter BUSY FLIGHT (GB) (Pharly {Fr}) at the half-mile pole and the Godolphin colt took command as they straightened for home. Quickly challenged by Pilsudski, Stevens conjured another effort out of Predappio, who fought back in a battling finish to the wire. Stevens was quick to pay tribute to Dettori, saying: "It's tough luck for him, but I am sure he was rooting for me today. He advised me that if the field moved over to the wide outside for the better ground, I should go with them. When I kicked for home on the turn, my horse really gave it everything. When Pilsudski came and took us I thought we were beaten, but Predappio found new heart." Predappio was the second winner of the day for the Godolphin team, following the very promising Asfurah in the Windsor Castle S., and team 'boss' Sheikh Mohammed al Maktoum said: "I'm very happy that our horses have started to come back to form. I spoke to Major Dick Hern and he said horses would come and go and I would never know what had happened. So I took his advice and stopped looking at them and they have come right again. I'm sorry Frankie Dettori missed our two winners today, but Gary Stevens did very well on Predappio. More American jockeys should travel the world." Predappio's next target will be the G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. at Ascot July 26.

The French-trained Don't Worry Me (Ire) sprang a 33-1 surprise as she just held on to best fellow French challenger Titus Livius (Fr), one of the co-favourites, in a driving finish to the wire. Don't Worry Me was rated at the back of the pack by French champion jockey Olivier Peslier, but with a furlong to run the mare found a perfect split between the leaders and shot through to hit the front. She had just enough in reserve to hold the strong late finish of Titus Livius. Winning trainer Guy Henrot, who trains near Le Mans in the French provinces, was saddling a runner in England for the first time. "Perhaps I should stop now, " he said. "One runner, one winner. But I hope to come back again. This mare has improved since she was bought as a threeyear-old in England. She had run a lot in England that year and we gave her almost six months' rest. I was not too worried about the soft ground today because she had won on very soft ground at Longchamp last October in a good time. She needed her first three starts this season and came here in very good form, and Olivier Peslier rode a great race." Peslier remarked: "The trainer said to ride her off the pace and come very late. She loved the ground. I saw Titus Livius coming, but his effort stopped just before the line. I've ridden three winners this week and I've enjoyed every minute."

Lord Howard de Walden's homebred Kingfisher Mill threw down a challenge to the best middle-distance horses in Europe with this authoritative wire-to-wire victory here; his next target is the King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. at Ascot July 26, when the opposition is likely to include the mighty Helissio (Fr), Always in command of the race, Kingfisher Mill, who had delayed the start after losing a shoe in the post parade, went for home on the turn and extended his lead with every stride. Said winning trainer Julie Cecil: "I am so delighted for Lord Howard, who has been so loyal to me. The colt ran well in the Dante S. at York (May 14) and stayed on really well behind Benny The Dip. He's a grand horse and didn't seem worried by the ground." Winning jockey Pat Eddery added: "He got rather stirred up before the Dante but he behaved himself today, even when he had to be re-shod. He didn't like the slow pace at York and pulled too hard. He should have been second to Benny The Dip that day. These Rivermans like this ground and he could have won by a lot more than eight lengths. He has a great future. I am sure he will win a Group One. You've to be good to win by eight lengths at Royal Ascot."

BLUSHING K.D. SHARP AT CHURCHILL GI Kentucky Oaks winner Blushing K.D. (Blushing John), a disappointing fourth as the 1-10 favorite in the GII Black-Eved Susan last time out, worked five furlongs in a bullet 1:00 at Churchill yesterday morning, prompting jockey Lonnie Meche to comment, "She's back." Trainer Sam David Jr. at first blamed a negative reaction to Lasix for the poor performance at Pimlico May 16, but a blood test revealed the threeyear-old filly was suffering from a low potassium level. "We're still kind of baffled by it," said David. "The potassium level keeps changing on us. It's something you can't see on a normal blood test. I think it was coming back in just two weeks (after winning the Oaks May 2)...her potassium level had been dropping after each of her last few races and it just caught up with her." Another blood test will be taken today, and the results evaluated by Lexington's Hagyard-Davidson-McGee Clinic. If the results are encouraging, David will likely point Blushing K.D. for the GII Monmouth Breeders' Cup Oaks July 5.
