HIS GOLD CUP RUNNETH OVER: MANDELLA TOPS AT HOLLYWOOD After

saddling five of the six starters, it came as no surprise when trainer Richard Mandella finished one-two-three in vesterday's GI \$1,000,000 Hollywood Gold Cup. There were really no surprises in the second leg of the MGM Grand Classic Crown as the first three from the Santa Anita H., opening race in the series, again came home on top. But this time it was GI Pimlico Special winner Gentlemen (Ara) (Robin des Bois), third in the Big 'Cap, carrying the day as he shadowed 6-5 Siphon (Brz) (Itajara {Brz}), the Big 'Cap winner, to the top of the stretch, then collared his stablemate and powered away to a four-length victory at 8-5. Sandpit (Brz) (Baynoun {Ire}), second at Santa Anita, ran evenly to be third. "These three horses are just fantastic, just unbelievably good," said Mandella. "I have to say I'm real proud I could send out my horses and have them run good. But it still boggles my mind why there weren't more horses in there." What was it like running a quintet in a milliondollar race? "I have a lot of help and they're all very gualified," said Mandella. "To be honest, I had thoughts of saddling the horses and then catching a plane to Hawaii and letting them call me to tell me what happened." Mandella will point his talented trio to the final race in the Crown, the GI Pacific Classic August 9.

SUN SHINES ON HELISSIO AT SAINT-

CLOUD Becoming the first horse since Rheingold (Ire) in 1972-73 to win back-to-back runnings of the prestigious event, Helissio (Fr) (Fairy King) led every step to take Sunday's G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud at Saint-Cloud. In great form, the four-year-old set a good pace, guickened in the straight and left the opposition floundering en route to a five-length romp. Cash Asmussen, riding the champ for the first time, said: "He is a man, quite phenomenal. I have only ever seen his backside in the past. I am very happy to have only seen his head this time. I have to rank him as one of the best I have ever ridden." Owner Enrique Sarasola added, "Perhaps he can go on to win the Arc as a four-year-old, too. I kept him in training this year, despite having had many very big offers. I don't know whether I can do that again at the end of this year, but I would be sad to lose him as he might be just as good next year and become the first horse to win the Arc de Triomphe three times."

Desert King (Ire) became the 11th horse to land the Irish 2000 Guineas-Irish Derby "double" and give his 27-year-old trainer Aidan O'Brien his third consecutive Irish Classic winner. Settled off the pace early, the colt finished full of run, banishing the memory of his lacklustre display in the G1 St James' Palace S. at Ascot June 17, O'Brien has now become the first trainer since Michael Stoute in 1986 to train three Irish Classic winners in a season. Favored SILVER PATRIARCH (IRE) (Saddlers' Hall {Ire}) was ridden hard to gain the lead at the half-mile mark, but he was under pressure early in the straight as Dr Johnson and Loup Sauvage swept past. The former appeared to have the race in his grasp, but jockey Christy Roche brought Desert King with a smooth run on the outside and the Irish 2000 Guineas winner ran on strongly to win impressively, laying to rest any doubts about his stamina. O'Brien was quick to blame himself for the Ascot debacle, saying: "It was my fault. I hadn't got him sharp enough. But we learnt a lot from that trip. We always thought he was an Irish Derby horse and he's proven himself a champion now." Silver Patriarch failed to boost his Epsom Derby form and his trainer John Dunlop was initially inclined to blame faulty tactics, but after calling for his colt to be scoped, he revealed that there were signs of an infection.

Gentlemen (Arg), a champion in his native land, put together five straight U.S. victories before running third as the favorite in the GI Santa Anita H. March 2. Freshened for two months after that start, the South American import showed his appreciation for the vacation with a sparkling effort to best Eclipse winner Skip Away in the GI Pimlico Special May 10. He added to the new streak here, stalking the pace of stablemate Siphon (Brz) through a mile in 1:34.18, moving to challenge as they straightened for home and proving the better of the two in the final furlong. "I had a lot of confidence in what (Gentlemen) could do in the final guarter today," said winning rider Gary Stevens. "I had a lot of horse left underneath me. This horse, he's incredible." Runner-up Siphon had not started since running second in the Dubai World Cup April 3. "He made a run, but he got a little tired today," said his rider, David Flores. "He kept trying, but Gentlemen was best today."

Making short work of this short field, French champion Helissio (Fr) sprinted to the lead right out of the gate and made all the running to take his eighth victory in 10 career starts. Three-year-old Magellano raced down the centre of the track to finish a well-beaten second. Third in a dead-heat in last year's Japan Cup to end his three-year-old season, Helissio was set to run in this year's Dubai World Cup but was scratched when heavy rains postponed the race. He returned to France to win the G1 Prix Ganay April 27, but then came down with a high fever in mid-May and missed a scheduled start in the G1 Coronation Cup June 6. The four-yearold adds his second Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud win to victories in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe and G1 Prix Lupin at three. Said trainer Elie Lellouche: "That was a good run. Maybe he went a little faster than I anticipated down the backstretch, but I told Cash (Asmussen) to make him work so that he got something out of the race in preparation for the King George VI (July 26), where he will meet some very fit horses. I am relieved he has come back so well after being sick. You can never be sure how they will come back.'

With Queen Elizabeth II on hand for the race, the Queen's Plate drew a crowd of 20,098 to the track, up 25.4 percent from last year's attendance.



Bookmakers have the colt at odds as low as 5-1 for next year's English 2000 Guineas. O'Brien may run the colt again in two weeks' time in the G3 Anglesey S. Said O'Brien, "If he won by eight lengths every time this year, there would be no 2000 Guineas for him next season. I have to be happy with this effort because we've not really trained him since his last run (May 25). He's done everything at home that we've asked of him, but we use races as his serious pieces of work. He's a very relaxed horse and when he got in the clear today, he didn't think he was racing."
