STEVENS SURGERY SUCCESSFUL Hall of Fame jockey Gary Stevens, who rode **Gentlemen (Arg)** (Robin des Bois) to his four-length Hollywood Gold Cup victory Sunday, underwent a 45-minute arthroscopic procedure on his right knee Monday and came out of it well, according to his agent, Ron Anderson. The operation was performed by knee specialist Dr. James Tibone at the Kerlan-Jobe Medical Center. "They took a little cartilage out," Anderson said. "The procedure went very smoothly. Dr. Tibone said his return time depends on the swelling. But when Gary had his left knee operated on, it took about two weeks for him to return. That's what we're expecting here--12 to 16 days."

ILLINOIS HORSEMEN PROTEST SIX-DAY RACE WEEK

The Illinois Thoroughbred Horseman's Association held a membership meeting Wednesday to discuss the resumption of the Chicago circuit's traditional six-day racing week, scheduled to start this Monday at Arlington. "We don't have enough horses," ITHA President Christine Janks said. "We're down half a horse per race from last year, when we lost an average of \$30,000 on Mondays." Arlington is sympathetic and has been seeking a five-day week throughout its meeting. But the Illinois Racing Board in drafting the schedule last fall granted Arlington's request only for the first eight weeks of its meeting. The six-day week is scheduled to resume this Monday and continue through the middle segment of the meeting. Starting September 8, Arlington will go back to a five-day week but, in an unprecedented twist to the schedule, Hawthorne Race Course will be in action on the two days Arlington is dark. Janks asked ITHA members to express their opinions on a ballot, offering six alternatives. The results: 13 votes to do nothing; 14 to make a public protest through the press; 22 to meet with the Board and request that it not schedule Monday racing next year; 32 not to enter horses on Mondays for the remainder of the meeting; 35 to race one Monday and evaluate; and 27 not to enter horses for the next two Mondays.

He's done everything he's supposed to since then and is 100 percent right now. Hopefully, he can change the tides."

TOP ACCOUNT TO SILVERLEAF David W. Hutson, owner of Silverleaf Farms near Ocala, Florida, has purchased **Top Account** (Private Account) for stallion duty at his farm in 1998. Upon his purchase last week, Top Account was retired from racing. The five-year-old won 10 of 30 starts for earnings of \$466,818. His triumphs included a victory in the GII King's Bishop S. at Saratoga in 1995. He also placed in three graded stakes--the GI NYRA Mile, GII Jerome H. and GII Forego H. Out of the GII Delaware Oaks winner Up the Flagpole (Hoist the Flag), the well-bred Top Account is a half-brother to five stakes winners, including Flagbird, the Highweight Older Mare in England, Ireland and Italy in 1995; and Prospector's Delite, a MGI winner of \$432,953. In addition, his three-year-old half-sister by A.P. Indy, Runup the Colors, took a \$42,000 Belmont Park allowance yesterday by 6 3/4-lengths. Silverleaf plans to syndicate Top Account. Share price, stud fee and terms will be announced at a later date.

Jersey Girl was beaten a neck when running second in a May 25 maiden race in her debut but came right back to win a June 19 maiden by 3 1/2 lengths, both at Belmont. The second choice bobbled at the start but recovered enough to force the pace before taking the lead around the far turn and edging clear in the stretch. "She just ran a really great race," winning jockey Mike Smith said. "She probably broke out of the gate too sharp, and it may have cost her a step. When I was able to get her settled, she responded when I asked her." Jersey Girl's trainer Todd Pletcher added, "We've been high on this filly since we bought her at the sales at Calder. I saw her breeze over there, and she really caught my eye. She's a real big, strapping filly. Right now, we'll see how she comes out of this race and hopefully point toward something in Saratoga." Jersey Girl is the first stakes winner for first-year stallion **Belong to Me** (Danzig), who also took third in this race with **Rose to the Moment**.
