
BOSTON HARBOR RETIRED The 1996 Champion Two-Year-Old Boston Harbor (Capote) has been retired from racing and will return to owner Overbrook Farm in Lexington, Kentucky to stand the 1998 breeding season. The three-year-old, winner of last year's Breeders' Cup Juvenile, has not raced since finishing fourth in the February 2 Santa Catalina S. at Santa Anita. During a workout a few weeks later, the colt suffered a condylar fracture of his left foreleg. According to Overbrook syndicate manager Ric Waldman, Boston Harbor never returned to training after the injury. "We have had time to reaccess the original injury and have decided it is in his best interest to retire him," Waldman said. He added that Boston Harbor will be moved to Overbrook in approximately 30 days. His stud fee has not been determined. Boston Harbor retires with six wins and one second in eight starts for earnings of \$1,934,605. In addition to his win in the Breeders' Cup. Boston Harbor earned victories in the GII Breeders' Futurity, GIII Bashford Manor S. and GIII Kentucky Cup Juvenile S.

KEENELAND JULY STAR YEARLING

WITHDRAWN Eaton Sales announced yesterday evening the withdrawl of hip number 142--the potential sales topper of the Keeneland July Selected Yearling Sale--after test results showed he was suffering from sesamoiditis. The bay colt, a son of Mr. Prospector out of the Riverman mare Korveya, is a half brother to champions Bosra Sham (Woodman) and Hector Protector (Woodman) and French 2000 Guineas winner Shanghai (Procida). "The colt came to the sale in great condition and was on the grounds to start showing tomorrow when we received the results of routine pre-sale repository radiographs, which showed inflammation in the front sesasmoids," said Reiley McDonald, Eaton Sales partner.

TOUCH GOLD WORKS Touch Gold (Deputy Minister) had his first work since winning the June 7 Gl Belmont S. yesterday at Hollywood Park. The colt drilled five furlongs in 1:04 1/5, with company. "I thought he worked okay," trainer David Hofmans said. "I wanted a little quicker work, but I didn't care. It was just a conditioning work. He'll come back and work three-quarters next Wednesday, probably with (regular rider) Chris McCarron up." Touch Gold is four-for-eight with earnings of \$675,627. "Our goal with him is the Breeders' Cup Classic here," Hofmans said from his Hollywood Park base. "But our immediate target is the Haskell Invitational." The Gl Buick Haskell will be run at Monmouth Park August 3.

OUEEN'S PLATE FINISH APPEALED William A. Sorokolit, co-owner of runner-up Cryptocloser (Cryptoclearance), has filed an appeal with the Ontario Racing Commission regarding the order of finish in this year's GIC Queen's Plate S., run June 29. According to the Daily Racing Form chart of the race, Cryptocloser "was three-wide at the quarter-pole and coming on, lacked room turning into the stretch on the heels of Cowboy Cop (Silver Deputy), finally got clear and finished well..." The 6-5 favorite, Cryptocloser went on to be second, beaten 31/2 lengths by Awesome Again (Deputy Minister), who ran coupled with Cowboy Cop as part of owner Frank Stronach's three-horse entry. Sorokolit's appeal claims that Cowboy Cop and jockey R. C. Landry "deliberately and recklessly swerved so as to interfere with Cryptocloser," thereby allowing his stablemate to win the race. An inquiry immediately following the race was denied and Awesome Again declared the official winner. The Ontario Racing Commission will schedule a hearing on the matter in early August. Earle Mack, who co-owns Cryptocloser with Sorokolit, is not participating in the appeal.

DARBY DAN CHANGES HANDS Darby Dan Farm in Lexington, Kentucky has been sold to John W. Phillips, grandson of its founder, John W. Galbreath. The interfamily transaction was completed July 1 and consolidates the ownership solely to Phillips. In 1988, the business passed from John Galbreath to his son Dan who died in September, 1995. Dan Galbreath's children agreed to the sale for an undisclosed price. The name will remain Darby Dan Farm. John Phillips has been the principal manager of the Lexington operation since 1988. "I am obviously thrilled with the transaction," Phillips commented. "It is a huge commitment for me, but as a practical matter, the operation will appear virtually the same."

Giving his trainer James Toller and jockey Seb Sanders their first Group 1 success, Compton Place (GB) became the longest-priced winner ever of the July Cup, which was first run in 1876. Racing home at odds of 50-1 (he was in fact 64-1 on the Tote) and winning for the third time in eight lifetime starts, the winner settled in behind Indian Rocket (GB) on the far side of the track, while the 11-10 favorite Royal Applause (GB) led the group down the center. Compton Place came to grab the lead at the guarter-mile mark and galloped on resolutely up the hill for a famous victory, which stunned the large crowd. Toller said: "I hoped he'd run well and I was slightly insulted by his odds. He had done nothing wrong in his races. The only time he finished out of the first two was when he couldn't handle the soft ground at Ascot (June 20) and was unplaced in the King's Stand S. We now know he cannot handle the soft and likes the fast ground we have today. Until today we hadn't really seen the best of him." Sanders was ecstatic, saying: "It's a dream. I've liked this horse for a long time and he ran a great race in the (G2) Gimcrack as a two-year-old. James (Toller) told me to get him covered up and give myself plenty of time and he settled brilliantly. That's the first time we've been able to get him to settle and it worked great."


