\$1.5 MILLION STORM CAT COLT TOPS

KEENELAND TUESDAY He lost the connection when the bidding reached \$600,000, but trainer Bob Baffert got "the new guy" back on the telephone in time to go to \$1.5 million for the sales topper at the 1997 Keeneland July Selected Yearling Sale in Lexington last night. Hip number 185, a bay son of Storm Cat and the GISW Shared Interest (Pleasant Colony), was consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency, agent for R.S. Evans, and purchased by Baffert for a player to be named later--the trainer of this year's Kentucky Derby and Preakness winner Silver Charm said the buyer would reveal himself in the next few days. As for his million-dollar acquisition, Baffert said, "Right now he's immature, he's not there yet. But he has the breeding and everything else. I figured he'd top the sale. You never pay too much money for a horse that can run. I'll take my time with him." The pair was in the hunt for Monday's session topper, hip number 55, the \$1,050,000 Gulch filly, but Baffert told his mystery shopper, "Let's go for the colt. The plan was to go to a `mil' (for the Storm Cat colt), but he just said `don't let him go.' In this market, if you don't buy what you like you're going to be left out in the cold." The underbidders on Tuesday's sales topper were Silver Charm's owners, Robert and Beverly Lewis, and The Thoroughbred Corporation. Also reaching seven figures yesterday was hip number 188, a colt by Seattle Slew out of MGSP Sophisticated Girl (Stop the Music). Consigned by Eaton Sales, agent, the dark bay half-brother to GSP Proper Dance (Nureyev), GSP Private interview (Nureyev) and G1SP Dancing Tribute (Nureyev) was purchased by Demi O'Byrne. The top-priced filly during Tuesday's second session was hip number 145, a daughter of Seattle Slew out of Horse of the Year Lady's Secret (Secretariat). The bay was consigned by Fares Farm, Inc. and purchased by Takao Watanabe; she will head to Japan for her racing career. A total of 84 hips sold for \$29,115,000 Tuesday, an average of \$346,607. Overall, the July Sale saw 175 yearlings gross \$62,565,000, up 7 percent from 1996 when 167 head sold for \$58,430,000. The 1997 average of \$357,514 was up 2 percent from last year. "Last year was certainly a test," said Rogers Beasley, Keeneland Director of Sales. "There was a lot of talk about how last year was very positive, and this year maintained it. We were very pleased with that."

FASIG-TIPTON JULY SET FOR TODAY Bidding for the one-day Fasig-Tipton Kentucky July Selected Yearling Sale begins at 11 a.m. this morning at the Newton Paddocks in Lexington. A total of 254 yearlings have been catalogued for the auction. Top sires represented include Carson City, Deputy Minister, Mt. Livermore and Unbridled. Last year's top freshman sire Salt Lake has nine offspring in the sale; also on offer are yearlings from such promising freshmen for 1997 as Belong To Me, Exbourne, Fly So Free, Gilded Time, Kingmambo, Line In The Sand, Marquetry, Mountain Cat and Strike The Gold. Last year, Fasig-Tipton sold 259 yearlings over two days for a gross of \$10,013,500, up 52 percent from 1995's single-session aggregate. The 1996 average of \$38,662 was up 3.9 percent from the previous year's auction.

MONTY ROBERTS BOOK DUE AUGUST 18 "The Man Who Listens To Horses," which chronicles the life of horse trainer Monty Roberts, will hit bookshelves this August 18. Published by Random House, the book follows Roberts from his childhood days as a stunt double for such stars as Elizabeth Taylor in *National Velvet*, to his stint as a rodeo rider, and on to the development of his unconventional method for introducing horses to bridle and saddle. Suggested retail price for the book is \$23.

NICK CARAS WINS DOGWOOD DOMINION AWARD Nick Caras, the recreation director for the New York Racing Association, has been honored with this year's Dogwood Dominion Award. A member of the NYRA for 18 years, Caras was appointed to his present position in 1991, and has since been credited with expanding the backstretch programs and improving morale at Aqueduct, Belmont Park and Saratoga. "Nick has taken a job and turned it into a personal mission to add pleasure, excitement and hope to the world of backstretch workers. Far beyond his job requirement, Nick has organized countless educational field trips... initiated English-speaking programs, driven needy people to doctor's appointments, helped with immigration problems, job placement, educational needs and counseling referrals, to name just a few of his self-imposed duties," said Dogwood Stable President Cot Campbell. Caras will receive his award, a bronze statue of the horse Dominion and \$5,000, at a luncheon at the Reading Room in Saratoga Springs, New York August 6.

WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES

EBADIYLA (IRE) (f, 3, Sadler's Wells--Ebaziya {Ire}, by Darshaan {GB})

Few breeders in the world more persistently use inbreeding and linebreeding techniques than His Highness the Aga Khan. The policy is certainly paying dividends this year and when Ebadiyla captured the G1 Kildangan Stud Irish Oaks on Sunday she followed Daylami and Vereva as the third Aga Khan classic winner of the season.

In some respects Ebadiyla's pedigree is conventionally classic. She is by Sadler's Wells out of a mare by the Aga Khan's French Derby winner Darshaan. Since Darshaan is a grandson of Mill Reef (by Never Bend), this is yet another good Sadler's Wells runner with a duplication of Lalun (dam of Sadler's Wells' broodmare sire Bold Reason and of Never Bend).

The more unusual aspect of the pedigree is the linebreeding to strains developed by Marcel Boussac. Ebaziya, the dam of Ebadiyla, is inbred 5x3 to the mare Albanilla, who appears in the tail female line of Ebaziya's sire, Darshaan and as Ebaziya's own third dam. Albanilla just happens to be out of Tourzima, who in turn is three-parts sister to Djeddah, the sire of Lalun. Thus, the very successful Lalun duplication is further supplemented by linebreeding to a three-parts sister to her sire.

Since Boussac virtually elevated close inbreeding to an ideology, it should come as no surprise to learn that Djeddah and Tourzima were themselves both closely inbred. Djeddah had the sisters Durban and Heldifann 2x3 and Tourzima the same pair 2x2.

Conventional wisdom says that continual crossing of mile and a half horses will end up with a horse too slow to be competitive, even at European classic distances. The late Aga Khan had a doctrine of "speed, speed and more speed," but the current Aga Khan frequently succeeds with very stoutly-bred runners. For example, Ebadiyla's first five dams are by Darshaan, Ela-Mana-Mou, Dan Cupid, Pharis II and Tourbillon, who all stayed a mile and a half. Is it the technique of inbreeding and linebreeding particularly to genetic relatives which endows these stoutly-bred horses with Classic speed?

A # will distinguish first-time stakes-winners, a @ will indicate first-time graded stakes-winners, a + will denote winners who are first-time starters, an (S) will be used for state-bred races, a (C) will be used for maiden-claiming races, and an (R) will be used for other restricted races.

PEDIGREE SHORTS

We must admit that when Cadeaux Genereux began his stud career, we couldn't see a lot in the common perception of him as an ideal cross for Northern Dancer mares. At first glance, apart from a son strain of Northern Dancer's broodmare sire Native Dancer and a daughter strain of Northern Dancer's grandsire Nearco, the pedigrees didn't seem to have a tremendous amount in common. In Europe, however, such is the overwhelming predominance of Northern Dancer, that any quality performer free of that strain is viewed as an ideal cross.

Now despite our preconceptions, the Cadeaux Genereux/Northern Dancer combination is actually working rather well and when **Cadeaux Tryst (GB) (h, 5, Cadeaux Genereux {GB}--Trystero {GB}, by Shareef Dancer)** won the Daily Mail Classified Silver Trophy H. in England on Saturday he became the seventh stakes winner by Cadeaux Genereux out of a Northern Dancer-line mare and the third out of a mare by Shareef Dancer. This is sufficient cause to reconsider why the combination might be working. A potential key is the fact that Cadeaux Genereux is linebred to the brilliant miler Tudor Minstrel, who in turn is by champion Owen Tudor. Owen Tudor is by Hyperion out of a mare by Pharos and is therefore bred on a reverse cross to Northern Dancer's sire, Nearctic (by Nearco, by Pharos, out of a Hyperion mare). In the male line of Cadeaux Genereux, the Tudor Minstrel strain is combined with a daughter of Nearco. On the dam's side of Cadeaux Genereux's pedigree, Tudor Minstrel comes together with Native Dancer in the pedigree of Atan (sire of Sharpen Up), which gives opposite sex crosses of the Pharos, Hyperion and Native Dancer strains (all in Northern Dancer's first three generations). For good measure, Cadeaux Genereux carries the mare Mah Iran, a three-parts sister to Mahmoud, the sire of Northern Dancer's second dam.

**Pedigree Shorts cont.**

One oddity we note here is that Cadeaux Genereux has had three stakes winners out of mares by Shareef Dancer and two out of mares by Northfields. In addition to being sons of Northern Dancer, this pair both carry the sire Challenger II. This horse has a very special relationship with the famous mare Selene and in Cadeaux Genereux's pedigree there are four crosses of Hyperion and five of Selene.

Stakes winners from the male line of Epsom Derby winner Mahmoud are something of a rarity these days, but Saturday's GII Washington Park H. resulted in a victory for **Beboppin Baby (c, 4, Hatchet Man--Liltin Jill, by Verbatim)**, a great-grandson of The Axe II. **Beboppin Baby's** dam is inbred to Nasrullah, who is out of a three-parts sister to Mahmoud, and the pedigree has another nice twist with a duplication of the sisters Big Event (granddam of The Axe II) and Busanda, whose son Bupers is the sire of **Beboppin Baby's** second dam.

Mahmoud also has a major part to play in the pedigree of **Boyce (g, 6, Lord Avie--True Charmer, by His Majesty)**, who captured Saturday's GIII Oceanport H. He has Mahmoud 5x6x5, but also carries Mahmoud's three-parts sister Mah Iran.

Doubling Mixed Marriage seems to make for a happy marriage. **Nakayama Express (Ire) (c, 4, Warning {GB}--Bluebook, by Secretariat)** became the second stakes winner we have noticed in Europe this season with a double of Mixed Marriage when he won the Emirates Airline EBF Rockingham H. Sunday at The Curragh. This time it comes through a daughter (Tamerett, dam of Warning's sire Known Fact) and a son (Atan, sire of Sharpen Up, who in turn is sire of Nakayama Express's second dam). With Mixed Marriage also appearing in Gone West and Lion Cavern as well as Known Fact and Sharpen Up, expect to see many more good winners bred on the cross.
