KEENELAND JULY WRAP-UP Despite predictions that it might not be able to keep pace with last year's strong performance, the 1997 Keeneland July Selected Yearling Sale which concluded Tuesday night showed gains in both average and gross, while the median, which jumped a healthy 50 percent in 1996, held steady at \$300,000. Demi O'Byrne, agent, was the leading buyer at the sale, purchasing 12 yearlings for a total of \$8,535,000. Taylor Made Sales Agency was the leading consignor by gross, selling 27 hips, including the \$1.5 million sales-topping son of Storm Cat, for a total of \$10,535,000. Trainer Bob Baffert confirmed vesterday that he had bought the sales topper for Aaron Jones. The top consignor by average was King Ranch, which sold four yearlings for an average of \$615,000. FASIG-TIPTON JULY NUMBERS UP The Fasig-Tipton Kentucky July Yearling Sale posted a 36.3 percent increase in average sales price as the 1997 average jumped to \$52,708--up from \$38,662 in 1996. Top price at the one-day sale was paid for hip number 109. The bay colt by Saint Ballado--Brilliant Melody, by Cornish Prince, was consigned by Eaton Sales, agent and brought a final bid of \$290,000 for trainer Bob Baffert on behalf of Robert and Beverly Lewis. The top-priced filly was hip number 96--a filly by Lord at War (Arg)--Anitas Surprise, by Mr. Redoy-who brought a final bid of \$270,000 from Prince Ahmed Salman's Thoroughbred Corp. and was consigned by McMakin's Longue Vue Farm, Highclere (Jeffry Morris), agent. Fasig-Tipton Director of Yearling Sales Bill Graves said, "We are extremely happy with the strength of our sale. The number of horses selling for \$100,000 or more increased from 15 in 1996 to 25 in 1997 with fewer horses offered for sale. In addition, the median prince increased 32 percent from \$28,000 in 1996 to \$37,000 in 1997." At last year's two-day sale, 259 horses were sold for a total of \$10,013,500. With only one day in this year's sale, 185 horses were sold for a total of \$9,751,000.

PULPIT RESUMES GALLOPING After jogging at Churchill Downs for two weeks, GII Blue Grass winner Pulpit (A.P. Indy) resumed galloping this week and could return to the races this fall, according to trainer Frank Brothers. Pulpit has not raced since finishing fourth in the May 3 Kentucky Derby. After the race, he was found to have a bone chip in his left front knee. The chip was surgically removed May 7. Brothers said Pulpit will be among the 16 horses he takes to Saratoga, and that his first breeze was still at least a month away. "It could come toward the end of August," said Brothers. "It could either be late at Saratoga or after he comes back (to Churchill Downs)." Brothers said he hoped Pulpit could return to competition this fall at either Keeneland or Churchill, and that the Nov. 8 Breeders' Cup at Hollywood is not under consideration.

MCCARRON EARNS 6,500TH WIN Hall of Fame jockey Chris McCarron became the seventh rider in Thoroughbred racing history to win 6,500 races when he guided Le Casque Gris to the Hollywood Park winner's circle in Wednesday's second race. McCarron, 42, joins jockeys Bill Shoemaker (8,833), Laffit Pincay, Jr. (8,534), David Gall (7,096), Angel Cordero, Jr. (7,057), Pat Day (6,973) and Jorge Velasquez (6,791). "I forgot all about (the milestone) until I heard Luke (track announcer Luke Kruytbosch) announce it during the stretch run," McCarron said. "Fortunately, I've been able to ride against the world's top jockeys throughout my career. To be included with the six riders in front of me, it's something that I'm very proud of."

## Local News, Churchill:

Three-year-old filly Leo's Gypsy Dancer (Leo Castelli), winner of the Dogwood and Ellis Park Debutante S., will be sidelined for at least three months as she recovers from arthroscopic surgery to remove a small chip from her right front ankle. The filly finished sixth in the GII Pucker Up S. at Arlington in her most recent effort, and trainer Hal Wiggins discovered the injury after the race.

Undefeated Sky Blue Pink (Strawberry Road {Aust}) has been sidelined with vasculitis in her front legs, a condition in which the lining of the blood vessels becomes inflamed. The filly is undergoing treatment at Lexington's Hagyard-Davidson-McGee Clinic, where attending veterinarian Doug Byars said the condition was uncommon. The filly is being treated with antibiotics and steroids and has been "very responsive" to her treatment. The filly is four-for-four, and was being pointed toward the July 26 GIII Ak-Sar-Ben Oaks. Trainer Tom Amoss said all plans are now on hold.

Joining the ever-expanding band of Northern Hemisphere 'shuttle' stallions travelling to Australia and New Zealand next month will be the 1992 English and Irish 2000 Guineas winner Rodrigo de Triano (El Gran Senor), who won those Classics and the same year's G1 Juddmonte International and Champion S. in the colors of Robert Sangster. The chestnut stallion was sold to the Japan Racing Association at the end of 1992 and has stood in Japan ever since. This will be his first 'shuttle' to the Southern Hemisphere. 

## STORM CAT TOPS KEENELAND SIRES by Bill Oppenheim

I hadn't been to the July sale for the last couple of years (breaking my string at 16 in a row), so this was my first experience of the one-session night format. I liked the one session, but I think everybody agreed 130 catalogued a night is too much ... those of us who waited around for the sheets didn't hit Versailles Rd. until 12:30 a.m. Monday night ...

Strong sale: it felt really strong Monday night, and the consensus seemed to be Tuesday would drop off this time, but it didn't. Still, with 40 more catalogued, there were only eight more listed sales than last year (175 vs. 167). The gross was up \$4-million to \$62.5-million, and the average up a little over 2%, from \$349,880 to \$357,514 ...

Bob Baffert's \$1.5-million Storm Cat colt--hip 185, out of Grade I winner Shared Interest--propelled Storm Cat to the sale's sire leadership--he had 11 sell, averaging \$584,545, with Mr. Prospector, Danzig, and Seattle Slew each also (narrowly) topping the \$500,000 average mark ... last year's Golden Boy, Kingmambo, plunged to 16th in average among the 18 sires with 6+catalogued. His eight averaged \$239,375 ... typical, isn't it?

Combining Baffert's saletopper to the purchases of Demi O'Byrne (12), the Maktoum family (16--12 by Darley and four by Shadwell), and a number of different interests for Japan (at least 31 yearlings), four buyers snapped up 60 yearlings--over 30% of the listed sales--and spent just under \$27-million, about 43% of the \$62,565,000 gross. Japanese interests were very steady in the middle market, Darley's resurgence was perhaps a bit unexpected, and the Tabor-Coolmore-O'Byrne axis dominated at the top.

First-year sires: interesting, but inconclusive ... Dehere edged out Holy Bull and Colonial Affair, but each had just two sell, and all three averaged between \$250,000-\$275,000. Saratoga and September will be especially instructive in this regard ...
