**HASKELL HAPPENINGS** The August 3 \$1 million GI Buick Haskell Invitational will be shown live on espn2 from 5-6 p.m. ET., as a special edition of the "Racing to the Breeders' Cup" series. The one-hour telecast, hosted by Dave Johnson and Charlsie Cantey, will originate from Monmouth Park in Oceanport, New Jersey. "We are very pleased to be able to underwrite this important broadcast which will showcase some of the nation's best three-year-olds," D.G. Van Clief, Jr., president of Breeders' Cup Ltd., said. "We're delighted that the Haskell and Monmouth Park will be the focus of a broadcast that reaches over 40 million households," added Hal Handel, executive vice president and chief operating officer of the New Jersey Sports and Exposition Authority. With the addition of the Haskell, the "Racing to the Breeders' Cup" series has been expanded to 11 shows--10 of which are televised by ESPN. This year's series is now comprised of 18 races, 13 of which are Grade I events. Yesterday, Monmouth Park Racing Secretary Mike Dempsey released the weights for the GI Haskell. GI Santa Anita Derby winner **Free House** (Smokester) and GI Belmont S. victor **Touch Gold** (Deputy Minister) are co-highweighted at 125 pounds. "Free House and Touch Gold are superb horses and we weighted them equally," Dempsey said. Just behind the top two, at 120 pounds, are GII Ohio Derby winner **Frisk Me Now** (Mister Frisky) and Lone Star Derby winner **Anet** (Clever Trick). The lone filly in the prospective field is GI Kentucky Oaks winner **Blushing K.D.** (Blushing John). She is scale weighted above Anet and Frisk Me Now at 121 pounds, but will carry 116 pounds with a five-pound sex allowance. **Tale of the Cat** (Storm Cat), undefeated in his only two lifetime starts, was weighted at 114 pounds.

Countess Diana, a winner of her debut June 6 at Pimlico, was able to gain some revenge here after suffering a half length loss to Love Lock in the June 28 GIII Debutante S. at Churchill in her last outing. The second choice dictated the pace before drawing clear when roused and finishing with something left. "In her last race (Debutante), she was going so easy and when we got run down at the end and lost, I couldn't believe it, that was a real tough loss," winning jockey Shane Sellers said. "However, this time was a different story completely. She got off to a great start, and I was able to get her relaxed. She was moving so easy on the lead and no one was pressing her until the turn. She's very good, and she ran a very good race, she's a special filly." "I told Shane that if she broke well to let her run her race," winning trainer Patrick Byrne said. "We're looking to stretch her out and rate her because I think she's Breeders' Cup potential." Byrne indicated that the winner may start next in the GI Spinaway S. at Saratoga August 29.

### HELP WANTED

Ask most trainers and they'll tell you good help is hard to find. People don't want to work seven days a week, days that often start at 5 a.m. and at times end long after the last race.

That is true of the American work force. But the backstretch has become a sanctuary for people trying to find a new life in the States. Most of the men and women come to this country from Mexico, Canada and Europe also send their share of workers without papers. All are looking for a better life than the one they left behind.

"Tony" is 23 and he has been working on the backside of a major track since he was 15. Born in a small town south of Piedras Negras, Mexico, he was the oldest of eight brothers and sisters. His family worked a farm in exchange for food and lodging; the owner also paid his father a meager wage.

One of Tony's first jobs was caring for the horses on the farm. "I grew up around horses," he said. "I always loved working with them."

While he was growing up, he and his friends talked about running off to America to make their fortunes. The horses became Tony's ticket across the Rio Grande.

Everyone knew of the man in town who could get the "proper" papers to work in America. Tony's family saved over \$1,000 to send him. The plan was for Tony to work and send money home so others could follow.

Driven across the border into Texas, friends put him on a bus to a major city where he could work at the track. He spoke no English, but with the help of a contact he was able to get a state license and find a trainer who would give him a job walking hots.

It took a couple of years and a couple of trainers, but Tony worked his way up to groom at one of the better stables. He married a girl from Mexico; they found an apartment and started a family. Now the father of two girls, he has a phony social security number and has been paying into the social security system since 1989.

But he is still an illegal immigrant.

The trainer he works for knows Tony doesn't have the proper papers to work, but says, "What am I supposed to do? He shows up every day, works hard and doesn't complain. I don't see a line of people looking for work when I drive in the stable gate every morning. I'd hire someone who was born here, but nobody comes looking for work. Tony asked me for a job five years ago, and he's been here every day since. I've had a lot of other people come and go since then."

On the other side of the issue are people like Diane Neuro, who works for the Florida Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering's enforcement division.

During the course of the three South Florida race meetings, Neuro can be seen riding a golf cart around the backside with a stack of envelopes in her hand. The envelopes contain warning notices to people who have illegal papers or no papers at all. Neuro finds the illegals by running their social security numbers through the computer. If the number raises a red flag, the worker receives a warning that he or she has 21 days to produce a valid number or face deportation. Usually the workers disappear.

Neuro is just doing her job. In recent years, Attorney General Janet Reno, who was born, raised and worked in Miami before President Clinton tapped her for the AG job, has been cracking down on illegal immigrants.

But there are those trying to help the illegals.

Tony received a letter from someone like Neuro. He talked to a lawyer, Martin Arburua of Solano Beach, California. Arburua specializes in helping people who have worked in America with fraudulent papers. His office is down the street from Del Mar and 50 miles from the Mexican border. For an average of \$800, Arburua or one of his staff can walk a person through the process of getting legal papers while they wait to become a citizen.

The Catch 22 is that the law requires those people to go back to their own country for three months each year. For many workers, going back to Mexico for three months without the prospect of income to support their families, as well as the travel expenses involved, make this a solution which is not viable.

Tony's wife no longer works, staying home to care for their two daughters. Tony pays his taxes and still sends a portion of his paycheck back to his family each month. He can't afford to be without work for three months. He explained this to a paralegal in Arburua's office--and just after his interview for this story, Tony and his family disappeared.

There are some stories with happier endings.

Robin Metz, the executive secretary of the Delaware Park Horsemen's Association, knows a lot of people like Tony. She's been working for the past couple of years to try and get illegal workers on Delaware Park's backside to apply for the proper papers. In the beginning it wasn't easy, especially when Metz told people they would have to return to their homeland for three months every year. But with the cooperation of the Delaware Department of Labor, Metz has successfully fashioned a plan that works for both the state and the track.

Because Delaware Park runs eight months out of the year, grooms and hotwalkers can take advantage of the down time. The state's Department of Labor works with Metz to expedite the paper work. Each year, 80 to 90 people, mostly from Mexico, migrate back to Delaware.

"It was hard in the beginning, because people didn't trust us," said Metz. "But little by little the word got around that we wouldn't turn people in. Now we have a good supplementary work force that we know will be here each spring when we open. It works out for the horsemen, the state and especially the people looking to work around horses."
