FREE HOUSE DEFINITE FOR HASKELL John Toffan, who co-owns top three-year-old Free House (Smokester) with Trudy McCaffery, confirmed yesterday that the colt will make his next start in the GI Buick Haskell Invitational at Monmouth Park August 3. "The horse will be on the plane with Touch Gold (Deputy Minister) and Anet (Clever Trick) next Wednesday and we will be arriving next Friday," said Toffan. As for the decision to head to the Jersey Shore, he said, "Just the fact that he came out of the Swaps in such good shape was a big part of our decision. The size of the purse didn't discourage us, either." As a Grade I winner, Free House is eligible for a \$250,000 bonus on top of the \$600,000 winner's share of the Haskell purse.

STRONACH NAMED TOBA'S "JUNE OWNER OF THE MONTH" Frank Stronach, whose Touch Gold (Deputy Minister) gave him his first U.S. classic win in the GI Belmont S. June 7, has been honored with the Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association "Owner of the Month" Award for June. Touch Gold, co-owned by Robert McNair, denied Silver Charm a Triple Crown with his three-quarter length win in the "Test of the Champion." Stronach, who has farms in Canada, Florida and Kentucky, also picked up the prestigious GIC Queen's Plate at Woodbine last month with his lightly raced Awesome Again (Deputy Minister) June 29. A native of Austria, the horseman immigrated to Canada in 1954 and became involved in racing in 1968. He has earned two Sovereign Awards as leading owner and campaigned Eclipse winner and Canadian Horse of the Year Glorious Song, Stronach has approximately 600 Thoroughbreds, including racing stock, broodmares and top stallions such as champion sprinter Lit de Justice. The TOBA "Owner of the Month" Award is sponsored by Gainsborough Farm.

CHRB APPROVES 1998 RACING CALENDAR The California Horse Racing Board approved a 1998 racing calendar Thursday that mirrors the current 1997 schedule while placing strict limitations on the number of races that can be run during any one meet and emphasized coordinated racing and simulcast programs throughout the state. The southern California calendar actually begins December 26, 1997, with Santa Anita running through April 20, Hollywood will be open April 24-July 20, Del Mar runs July 22-September 9, Oak Tree at Santa Anita is September 30-November 9, and then back to Hollywood November 11-December 21. The Northern California calendar starts December 26, 1996 through January 19 at Golden Gate, which is also open April 1-June 21 and November 18-December 21; Bay Meadows will be in action January 21-March 29 and again September 4-November 15.
