CHAMPION STORM SONG RETIRED Last

year's champion two-year-old filly Storm Song (Summer Squall) has been retired from racing. Plaqued by ulcers this year, the Eclipse winner could not reproduce the form that won her the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, GI Frizette and GII Adirondack at two. She was off the board in three-of-five starts at three, most recently running seventh in the GI Acorn S. May 31. She did finish third in the GI Ashland S. in April and was moved up to third in the GI Kentucky Oaks in May. Storm Song won four of her 12 career starts for a bankroll of \$1,020,050. "She was magnificent in 1996," said Cot Campbell, president of Dogwood Stable. "However, she has not approached that form this year. She is sound physically, but mentally her heart isn't in it. If she can't compete at her true level, she's better off retired." The filly will be sold in the Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale.

SMOKE GLACKEN TO STAND AT GAINESWAY

Graham J. Beck's Gainesway yesterday announced they have purchased an interest in top sprinter **Smoke Glacken** (Two Punch), and the three-year-old will stand at the Lexington stallion farm at the end of his racing career. Winner of the GII Frank J. DeFrancis Memorial Dash over older horses last out, the Eclipse contender has won or placed in 13 of his 14 career starts, including 11 wins at a mile or less; the Defrancis Dash was his third consecutive graded stakes win. Owned by the partnership of William Roberts, Alex Karkenny, Robert Levy and trainer Henry Carroll, Smoke Glacken also won the GI Hopeful as a two-year-old; he has earned \$774,560 to date. He will make his next start in the GII King's Bishop S. at Saratoga August 23, and then point for the GI Vosburgh at Belmont September 27.

LONE STAR PARK WRAPS UP INAUGURAL

MEET Lone Star Park, which brought Class 1 racing back to Texas after a 60-year absence, ended its inaugural season Sunday. The Grand Prairie track saw 712,673 fans pass through the gates during the 73-day meeting for a healthy daily average of 9,762. On-track handle on live racing totaled \$56,936,165, a daily average of \$779,947, while on-track wagering on simulcast races was \$40,821,298, an average of \$559,196. The live card at Lone Star also generated \$117,887,248 of handle from simulcasting outlets across the country, an average of \$1,614,893 daily. "We couldn't be more pleased with the way our inaugural season has gone," said Corey Johnson, vice president and general manager of Lone Star. "The business side has been strong. We drew over 700,000 fans and there was a handle sufficient enough to support our excellent purse structure. But I think just as important was the fact that this meeting was an artistic success. Thanks to the support of all our horsemen, we were able to provide fans with excellent racing. The crowds had a good time. It was obvious everyday and it is something that we can build on in the future," Daily average purse distribution was nearly \$175,000, and the track featured an average field of 10 starters. Lone Star's Fall Meeting of Champions, a mixed meet of Thoroughbreds and quarter horses, will run October 3 to November 30.

GENTLEMEN SHARP AT DEL MAR GI Hollywood Gold Cup winner **Gentlemen (Arg)** (Robin des Bois), who won his first North American race at Del Mar last year, worked a mile in 1:38 4/5, handily, at the seaside oval yesterday. The five-year-old started a five-race winning streak in a Del Mar turf allowance July 27, 1996 in his second U.S. start; he makes his next appearance in the GI Pacific Classic August 9. Also prepping for that race, stablemate **Siphon (Brz)** (Itajara {Brz}), runner-up in the '97 Gold Cup and Dubai World Cup and winner of the GI Santa Anita H. in March, breezed a mile in 1:39 1/5 Sunday at Del Mar.
