ISITINGOOD RETIRED Isitingood (Crusader Sword) suffered a condylar fracture of his left front cannon bone during a workout Tuesday at Del Mar and has been retired from racing, according to the *Daily Racing Form*. The six-year-old broke Dr. Fager's 29-year-old world record for a mile in February when he won the Bart S. at Santa Anita in 1:32 and set track records in winning the Gill New Orleans H. at the Fair Grounds in March and the Texas Mile at Lone Star Park in April. Isitingood retires with 11 wins in 24 starts for earnings of \$1,219,430. Stud plans have not been finalized.

BELONG TO ME JOINS LANE'S END STALLION

ROSTER William S. Farish's Lane's End Farm has purchased an interest in 1997 leading freshman sire **Belong to Me** (Danzig--Belonging, by Exclusive Native). The eight-year-old stallion, who previously stood at Questroyal Stud in New York, will soon relocate to the Versailles, Kentucky farm where he will stand the 1998 breeding season. **Belong to Me**, winner of the Gill Boojum H. and Gill Best Turn S. in 1992, has already sired three stakes horses in his first crop, including stakes winners Jersey Girl, who won Belmont's Astoria S., and Dancewiththebride, who took the Francis Labelle Memorial S. at Delaware Park. His 1998 stud fee will be announced at a later date.

HASKELL HOPEFULS WORK Across the country, the top three-year-olds in training had their final preparations yesterday morning for Sunday's GI Buick Haskell Invitational at Monmouth Park. GI Belmont S. victor **Touch Gold** (Deputy Minister) and GI Santa Anita Derby and GI Swaps S. winner **Free House** (Smokester), co-highweights in the race, worked within minutes of each other at Hollywood Park. **Touch Gold** drilled five furlongs in :59 3/5 and galloped out six furlongs in 1:12. After the move, trainer David Hofmans said, "(Jockey) Chris (McCarron) was very happy with the work. He said the horse did great." **Free House** zipped a half-mile in :47 3/5. His trainer Paco Gonzalez said, "It was a nice easy work. I asked him to work in :48, but this was good." The two colts will be joined by Lone Star Derby winner **Anet** (Clever Trick) today on a plane from California scheduled to arrive at Newark Airport at 1:45 p.m. Also having his final work for Sunday's race yesterday morning was **Tale of the Cat** (Storm Cat). The John Forbes-trainee went five furlongs in :59 at Monmouth Park.

With a dramatic finish down the stands rail, Averti (Ire), who finished fourth in the G2 King's Stand S. at Ascot June 20, gave his trainer William Muir his first Group race success and jockey Kieren Fallon his 100th winner of the season. Early on in the race, Averti was well in rear as EVENINGPERFORMANCE (GB) (Night Shift) and DEEP FINESSE (GB) (Reprimand) set a blistering pace down the Goodwood hill. That pair were still at the head of affairs at the eighth pole before Cathedral (Ire) came through to take the lead, only to have Averti storm through for his second win in six starts this campaign and his 5th from 25 lifetime starts. Muir said, "We have had a few disappointments with him. I always thought he was a Group horse, but he's had all sorts of problems and has also been unlucky in some of his races."

Stowaway (GB) was an impressive winner here and is now a possible for the final Classic of the season, the Doncaster St. Leger on September 13. Having only his third lifetime start and second this season, Stowaway was always travelling well behind the early leaders, took command at the three-eighths pole and was soon clear, being eased in the closing stages. Godolphin's racing manager Simon Crisford said: "Stowaway has always had plenty of talent and his superior class came through today. The secret is to get him to settle, as he is a free-running horse and is always hard on himself." Jockey John Reid was given a five-day suspension (August 7-11) after the stewards found him guilty of "irresponsible riding" for allowing his mount SILENCE REIGNS (GB) (Saddler's Hall {Ire}) to cause interference at the quarter-mile pole. Silence Reigns finished fourth but was demoted to sixth.

WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES

HIDDEN LAKE (f, 4, Quiet American--Friendly Circle, by Round Table) With three graded stakes victories in her last three starts, Hidden Lake has emerged as a strong contender for honors as champion older mare. Whether or not she ends the year regarded as the best older mare around, her remarkable fighting performance in the GI Go For Wand H. indicated that she might well deserve a title as the gamest.

Hidden Lake is one of three stakes-winning fillies to emerge from the first crop by NYRA Mile hero Quiet American. This son of Fappiano is a remarkably inbred horse, the superlative Dr. Fager appearing 3x2 in his pedigree--via the three-parts sister Killaloe (dam of Fappiano) and Demure (Quiet American's own dam)--this pair both being out of daughters of the mare Cequillo. The close inbreeding is backed up by a clever twist as, while Dr. Fager has Bull Dog 3x4 in his own pedigree, Quiet American's sixth dam is Marguerite de Valois, a sister to Bull Dog.

Friendly Circle, the dam of Hidden Lake, provides an ideal foil for Quiet American. Unlike that horse, she is a complete outcross at six generations (which means that at that distance there are no ancestors common to both sire and dam). However, her broodmare sire Reneged is inbred 3x3 to Sir Gallahad III, a brother to Bull Dog and Marguerite de Valois, and Reneged's sire Revoked combines a son of Black Servant with a daughter of Sir Gallahad III, while Dr. Fager's dam combines a daughter of Black Servant with a son of Bull Dog.

Friendly Circle doesn't just compliment the Dr. Fager inbreeding in Quiet American's pedigree. She is by Round Table, a son of Princequillo, and of course Quiet American has Princequillo's daughter Cequillo 4x3 in his pedigree. The Princequillo strain is pretty common in U.S. pedigrees, so we should be careful how we interpret this, but it is worth noting that all three of Quiet American's stakes-winning daughters have a son strain of Princequillo, two in the male line.

We must admit that we wouldn't have thought of Dr. Fager, Round Table and Revoked as travelling companions, but the combination appears in at least a couple of other graded stakes winners. Dr. Fager's son Practitioner was out of a mare by Round Table with a second dam a mare bred on the same Round Table/Reneged cross as the dam of Hidden Lake.

PEDIGREE SHORTS

On Saturday, **Fabulously Fast (f, 3, Deputy Minister--Fabulous Notion, by Somethingfabulous)** lived up to her name with a storming five lengths victory in the GI Test S. Deputy Minister is enjoying a remarkable run of success right now and Fabulously Fast joins Touch Gold, Victory Speech, Awesome Again (G1C) and Always a Classic as one of his five individual 1997 Grade I winners. She is, however, unique in one respect, as to the best of our knowledge she is the first of the more than 50 stakes winners which have represented her sire to be out of a Northern Dancer-line mare (although inbreeding to Northern Dancer via Deputy Minister and a daughter appears in graded scorers Touch Gold, Daijin, Visible Gold and Run Softly). Before concluding that this marks a significant departure, we should consider the source of the second Northern Dancer strain. This is Somethingfabulous, a Northern Dancer half-brother to Secretariat and Sir Gaylord. There is a possibility that Deputy Minister has something of an affinity for Somethingroyal as his champion Dehere and stakes winner Edgy Diplomat are out of Secretariat mares and stakes winners War Deputy, Deputy Commander and Deputy Bodman are out of mares carrying Sir Gaylord.

An outstanding performer on the racecourse, Nashwan hasn't yet made quite as much impact as a sire, but the victory of his son **Swain (Ire) (h, 5, Nashwan--Love Smitten, by Key to the Mint)** in the G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. Saturday underlines that it is too early to write him off. Nashwan only had one stakes winner in his first crop, but that was champion Wandesta, and five-year-old Swain is one of six stakes winners to emerge from Nashwan's second crop. Swain has commonalities with Grade I winner You'd Be Surprised (by Nashwan's sire Blushing Groom out of a mare by Key to the Mint). Tucked away further back in his pedigree he also has Tom Fool, a horse who frequently appears with Blushing Groom, the reason being that both Tom Fool and Spring Run (dam of Blushing Groom's sire Red God) are by Menow out of Bull Dog mares.

We recently wrote about the success enjoyed by Danzig and his sons with mares carrying Alibhai. The latest addition to the list is **Greenlander (GB) (f, 2, Green Desert--Pripet, by Alleged)**, who won the G2 Prix Robert Papin in France Saturday. His dam has Alibhai 5x4 in her pedigree. The most probable reason for the success of this formula is the close relationship between Alibhai and the distaff side of the pedigrees of two horses in Danzig's pedigree, Nearctic and Petition. In all three cases, Gainsborough, Tracery and Gallinule are closely combined. There was another variation on this theme last week in the shape of Gil Schuylerville S. heroine

Countess Diana (f, 2, Deerhound--T.V. Countess, by T.V. Commercial). She is by a son of Danzig and has Northern Dancer (by Nearctic) 3x4. Alibhai appears here as the broodmare sire of her broodmare sire, T.V. Commercial. Oddly enough, T.V. Commercial's grandsire Indian Hemp is a very close genetic relative to Nearctic and like Northern Dancer, T.V. Commercial has a second dam by Mahmoud. Countess Diana's dam has also produced multiple stakes winner Count On Numbers, by Polish Numbers (a son of Danzig), and other Northern Dancer/T.V. Commercial crosses include Grade I winners Videogenic and Polaris Flight.

Cryptoclearance is enjoying his best season to date, and his success continued with the victory of **Cryptocloser (c, 3, Cryptoclearance--Cuddle Up Closer, by Vice Regent)** in Sunday's GIC Prince of Wales S., the second leg of the Canadian Triple Crown.

Cryptoclearance is a son of Fappiano, and this pedigree represents something of a proven cross as Fappiano himself sired at least three stakes winners out of Vice Regent mares, including Canadian GI winner Comet Shine and GI winner Surging. Cryptocloser's dam Cuddle Up Closer never won a race herself, but is a sister to the talented Canadian two-year-old Regal Stafford. She has a very unusual pedigree, as she has Vice Regent's grandsire Nearctic 2x3 and Vice Regent's granddam Victoriana 3x4.

The Tyro S. is often a useful pointer to later juvenile sprint tests, and this year's running on Sunday was taken by **Unreal Madness (c, 2, Unreal Zeal--Marilyn's Madness, by Shananie)**, who is now unbeaten in two starts. Unreal Madness is a Florida-bred and owns the great Florida cross, a double of Rough 'n Tumble through his best son, Dr. Fager (broodmare sire of Unreal Zeal) and his best daughter, My Dear Girl (dam of Shananie's sire In Reality). For good measure, Unreal Madness is also 4x4 to Cohoes.

The growing legion of stakes winners with multiple relatives from the La Troienne family gained at least two more members over the weekend with the victories of **Runup the Colors (f, 3, A.P. Indy--Up the Flagpole, by Hoist the Flag)** in Sunday's Delaware Oaks and **Lasting Approval (c, 3, With Approval--La Gueriere, by Lord at War)** in Saturday's Cumberland S. Runup the Colors has the sisters Glamour and So Chic 5x4, with their dam Striking and Striking's sister Busher appearing 6x6x5. Runup the Colors' half brother Top Account had Glamour and So Chic 4x4 with Striking and a three-parts sister Busanda 4x5x5. In the case of Lasting Approval, she has Busanda and her three-parts sister Searching 4x4.

When it comes to sire power, there seems to be no stopping the Thong family at the moment. Sadler's Wells (a great-grandson of Thong) has been represented by 22 stakes winners in 1997, including classic scorers Ebadiyla and Entrepreneur. Nureyev (a grandson of Thong) has sired 1997 classic winners Peintre Celebre and Reams of Verse, and Geiger Counter (a son of Thong) was recently represented by the Australasian Oaks winner Minegold. Of course, last year, Sadler's Wells' younger brother Fairy King was champion sire in

France, following the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe victory of his son Helissio. The latest member of the Thong family to join the stallion ranks is Sheikh Mohammed's **Chequer (h, 5, Mr. Prospector--Number, by Nijinsky II)**, who will enter stud at Vinery in Midway, Kentucky in 1998. Winner of the GIII William P. Kyne H., Chequer is a full brother to another young Kentucky sire, Numerous, and also to the G1 Grand Criterium winner Jade Robbery, who retired to stand in Japan and currently ranks sixth on the Japanese leading sires list for 1997. Chequer's dam, the MGSW Number, is out of Thong. As a granddaughter of Northern Dancer, Number is a three-parts sister to Nureyev and very closely related to Sadler's Wells and Fairy King.
