Winning his first Group 1 stakes race, Ali-Royal (Ire) gave trainer Henry Cecil his fifth win in the Sussex S., comfortably reversing the form of the G2 Queen Anne S. at Ascot June 17 where he finished third to Allied Forces. Towards the rear for the first half-mile, while Starborough (GB) led at a good pace, Ali-Royal found the perfect split with five-sixteenths of a mile to race, grabbed the lead entering the final eighth of a mile and ran on too strongly for the gallant Starborough, who fought back in the closing stages. The winner's next targets will be the G1 Prix Jacques Le Marois over this distance at Deauville August 17 and the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. at Ascot September 27. "He's very consistent and genuine, with lots of guts and he deserved this," said Cecil. Winning jockey Kieran Fallon said: "I intended to be up near the front early on, but they went so guick. I had no choice but to ease him back. But, unlike Ascot when he was unlucky behind Allied Forces, everything went his way today. I was concerned about finding an opening at one stage, but I eased him through and he guickened well and kept on well at the end." Favorite Starborough appeared to find the mile too sharp at Goodwood and is now likely to be aimed at longer distances. Kieran Fallon later picked up a five-day suspension (August 8-12) for careless riding on Memorise in the Tote Gold Trophy.

Favored Central Park (Ire) won for the third time in four lifetime starts and captured his second straight stakes race with a commanding performance here. After breaking his maiden by 10 lengths at Haydock June 6, he went to Ascot June 19 and upset Robert Sangster's highly-rated filly Cape Verdi in the Listed Chesham S. by 11/2 lengths. Racing behind the pacesetter for the first half-mile, he cruised through to take the lead and went clear entering the final furlong to win with ease. His main target is now the G1 Dewhurst S. October 18. Winning trainer Paul Cole said: "He's a really good prospect. He's bred to stay and mile and a half and will get better as he strengthens up and goes further. He had been worrying us at home because he's such a lazy worker, but he's done it very well today." Winning rider Pat Eddery was impressed with his mount's performance: "He has to be one of the best two-year-olds seen out this year. I haven't seen much better except possibly Daggers Drawn (who runs in today's G2 Richmond S.). He looked good at Newmarket, but he would have to go some to beat Central Park." Bookmakers were impressed too, some making Central Park a 12-1 chance for next year's 2000 Guineas and Epsom Derby.


