LANGFUHR TO VINERY Mr. and Mrs. Ben P. Walden, Jr.'s Vinery announced yesterday that **Langfuhr** (Danzig), winner of this year's GI Met Mile and champion sprinter in Canada last year, will enter stud at the Midway, Kentucky farm in 1998. Bred and owned by Gustav Schickedanz, the five-year-old ran the second-fastest Met Mile in history, going in 1:33 under top weight of 122 pounds in his final career start May 26. He also won the GI Carter H., GI Vosburgh and GII Forego H. and retired last month with a record of nine wins, seven seconds and a third in 23 starts and earnings of \$698,574. "On dirt, at a mile, I believe this son of Danzig is the most important American stallion prospect since Gulch, and we're extremely proud that Gus Schickedanz has entrusted us with the management of Langfuhr's stud career," said Ben Walden, Jr. Langfuhr will stand for a fee of \$20,000, live foal.

SURGERY FOR GONE WEST **Gone West** (Mr. Prospector) was sent to Hagyard, Davidson and McGee Associates after suffering a bout of colic July 29. The 13-year-old stallion underwent exploratory abdominal surgery after arriving at the clinic. He was found to have a mild gaseous distension of the small intestine with no significant compromise to the intestinal tract. He has been recovering well since the surgery and the multiple graded stakes winner, whose progeny have earned over \$16 million, is expected to make a complete recovery.

SANTOS REACHES 3,000 Jockey Jose Santos won his 3,000th race yesterday at Saratoga Racecourse when he guided Pulsatilla to victory in the seventh race. The 36-year-old native of Chile rode his first winner at the age of 14 and won the Eclipse Award as the top rider in the U.S. in 1988. "It was getting on my nerves (trying to reach the milestone)," Santos admitted. "The winners were coming slowly. I was trying too hard and nothing was coming out right. Today it came out right." The jockey has won five Breeders' Cup races, three editions of the GI Whitney H. and two runnings each of the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup, GI Haskell Invitational, and GI Florida Derby.

Double Trigger (Ire) put up a typically gutsy display to gain the G2 Crowson Goodwood Cup, the race that he won in 1995. Double Trigger led throughout the two-mile contest and had to fight off the challenge of Classic Cliche (Ire), who was last at the half-mile pole, and Double Eclipse for a 1 1/2-length success. The winner's next run will be a bid for a hat trick of wins in the G3 East Coast Doncaster Cup Doncaster Sept. 11, where he is the track-record holder. "So many people had written him off for three bad runs," said an emotional winning trainer Mark Johnston, who saddled the brothers to be first and third. "Only four runs ago, he broke the Doncaster track record. He has never had a serious problem, and it's great to see him win again."

Confirming his position at the head of the betting for the 1998 English 2000 Guineas, Dagggers Drawn put up an impressive performance to keep his perfect record intact after two races. Bodyguard (GB) set the pace while Dagggers Drawn was held up in the rear. Lord Kintyre (GB) took over the lead at the eighth-pole, but was unable to contend with the acceleration of Dagggers Drawn inside the final furlong. The winner's next target is the G2 Laurent-Perrier Champagne S. over seven furlongs at Doncaster Sept. 12. "He is by a long way the best colt I've ever ridden, and I have always thought a lot of him," said winning jockey Kieren Fallon. "He's still a baby and will be a different horse next year." Bookmakers were sufficiently impressed to install the colt as 7-1 favorite for next year's English 2000 Guineas. Philip Freedman, representing Cliveden Stud, said the dam Sun and Shade (GB) would return to be covered by Diesis (GB) next year.

BREEDERS' CUP PICK 6 WAGER DEBUTS Officials of Breeders' Cup Limited announced the introduction of a Pick 6 wager at this year's Breeders' Cup Championship at Hollywood Park November 8. The wager will require players across the country to correctly select the winners of the Breeders' Cup Sprint, Distaff, Mile, Juvenile, Turf and Classic on one mutuel ticket. This new wager replaces the Breeders' Cup Pick 7 first instituted in 1991. The Breeders' Cup Pick 6 will be a \$2 base wager and will be conducted as a co-mingled national bet. Tickets containing six-of-six winners will share 70 percent of the total pool and tickets containing five-of-six winners will share the remaining 30 percent of the pool as a consolation payout. "We want to continue to provide our fans with a multi-million dollar wager that offers substantial rewards for meeting the challenge of racing's greatest day," Breeders' Cup President D.G. Van Clief, Jr. said.
