FASIG-TIPTON SARATOGA NUMBERS DOWN

SLIGHTLY Fasig-Tipton's Saratoga Yearling Sale continued its three-day stand last night at the Humphrey S. Finney Pavilion. Two colts shared the top price of the second session. Trainer John Kimmel, acting on behalf of Robert Waxman, went to \$475,000 for hip number 110, a chestnut colt by Miswaki--Love From the Air, by Deputy Minister. "He'll go to Kentucky for a month or so--until we send the rest of the Waxman yearlings to Florida," Kimmel said. "I thought he was one of the horses in the sale who would have Classic aptitude from the physical standpoint and cardiac profile. I thought he looked like a serious racehorse who might not be an early twoyear-old, but might be around in the spring of his three-year-old year." The yearling was consigned by Dromoland/Hartwell, Agent III. Also selling for \$475,000, was hip number 111, a bay colt by Gone West--Love You by Heart, by Nijinsky II. Trainer D. Wayne Lukas purchased the yearling, consigned by Darby Dan Farm, agent, for an unnamed client. The underbidder for hip number 110 was Buzz Chace. Rick Pitino was the underbidder for hip number 111. The top-priced filly at vesterday's second session was hip number 151. Consigned by Lane's End, agent, the bay filly by Cozzene--Purity, by Fappiano, brought a final bid of \$360,000 from Laddie Dance. Dance said his new yearling will be trained by Scotty Schulhofer. "She'll go back to the farm in Maryland now and then she'll go to Florida to be broken," Dance explained. "We'll know this time next year whether we were wise or not." During the second session, 53 horses were sold for a total of \$8,035,000. At last year's corresponding session, 59 horses were sold for \$9,123,000. The average of \$151,604 was down two percent from last year's figure of \$154,627. The median price remained constant at \$130,000. The two-day median was \$135,000. The sale concludes tomorrow night, with the third session beginning at 8 p.m.

NAKATANI SUSPENDED THROUGH DEL MAR

MEETING Jockey Corey Nakatani was suspended for the remainder of the Del Mar meeting after knocking apprentice rider Ryan Barber off his mount as the pair were galloping out after Sunday's seventh race. During the race, Barber's horse appeared to drift in at midstretch, causing Nakatani to take up sharply. After a hearing on the incident, the stewards issued a statement citing the 26-year-old rider for disorderly conduct and conduct detrimental to horse racing and suspended him through September 10. The stewards also directed Nakatani to seek counseling to "address the issues of impulsive behavior and anger management."

THE OTHER YEARLING SALE By: Jack Werk

If you are looking for a Kentucky-bred yearling but are not looking forward to fighting the masses at Keeneland in September or paying the high prices commanded by the Keeneland July and Saratoga August sales, then you might want to consider heading to America's far Northwest to attend the annual Washington Thoroughbred Breeders Summer Yearling Sale on August 19.

This sale may be the industry's best-kept secret. Each year I am amazed by the quality of the pedigrees of the yearlings offered in this sale, but in my opinion, this is the best catalogue the WTBA has ever published. What is most interesting about this year's offerings is that of the 200 yearlings catalogued, 84 of them are sired by Kentucky stallions -- that's a whopping 42 percent! While these 84 yearlings were conceived in Kentucky, only 39 of them are actually registered as Kentucky-breds. The other 45 Kentucky-conceived yearlings include two California-breds, five Canadian-breds, one Florida-bred, one Illinois-bred, five Oregon-breds, and 31 Washington-breds.

From a pedigree standpoint, this is a good group of yearlings representing a variety of proven stallions such as Clever Trick, Cozzene, Time for a Change and Silver Deputy and a number of exciting young stallions including Dixie Brass, Fly So Free, Marquetry, Pine Bluff, Quest For Fame, Sheikh Albadou and Strike the Gold. Their dams also make them worth a look. Five of them have already produced stakes winners, 22 of them are stakes winners themselves, and 37 of them are half or full sisters to stakes winners. These yearlings have the types of pedigrees you'd expect to find after the first three days of the Keeneland September sale. But unlike the 11-day September sale, where prices averaged \$46,742 with a median of \$22,000 in 1996, the 1996 WTBA sale averaged \$16,164 with a median of \$10,000. If the conformation of these yearlings is as good as their breeding, there will be some bargains coming out of this sale, especially when you consider that few buyers or their agents will want to journey to Washington state during the Saratoga and Del Mar race meets. And after facing lower purses during Emerald Downs's second race meeting, local racing interests may not be willing to spend much for yearlings, especially non-Washington-breds.

A few of the more intriguing pedigrees include Hip 5, a colt by Williamstown out of a stakes-producing full sister to Bold Forbes; Hip 81, a Houston filly who is a full sister to Daiwa Alamo, a Japanese stakes winner of \$411,788; and Hip 86, a filly by Olympio out of a half sister to G1 winners Rose's Cantina and Fancy Naskra. Hip 169 is a Marquetry filly who is a half sister to two stakes winners who earned nearly a quarter of a million dollars each. Hip 179 is a filly by Roanoke out of a half sister to G1 winner Kamikaze Rick. The sale also includes some very attractive yearlings by Washington-based stallions, led by Washington's "supersire" Son of Briartic with 24 yearlings.

You may not buy yourself a Kentucky Derby contender, but you should have a shot of purchasing a useful stakes winner without having to mortgage the farm. And there are worse places to spend an August weekend than in Seattle.

WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES

PEDIGREE SHORTS...

Danehill, a grandson of Northern Dancer whose granddam is a half-sister to Northern Dancer, continues to work well with additional Northern Dancer strains, and the victory of Daneskaya (GB) (f, 4, Danehill--Boubskaia {GB}, by Niniski) in the G2 Prix d'Astarte at Deauville Sunday means that there are at least 10 stakes winners by Danehill bred on this cross. Boubskaia has Northern Dancer's dam Natalma 4x4x5. Runner-up in the Prix d'Astarte, Rebecca Sharp (GB) (f, 3, Machiavellian--Nuryana {GB}, by Nureyev) has Natalma 4x4 and her dam Almahmoud 5x5x5.

By general consensus, the best two-year-old seen in England so far this year is Daggers Drawn (c, 2, Diesis {GB}--Sun and Shade {GB}, by Ajdal), winner of the G2 Salomon Brothers Richmond S. at Goodwood July 31. Daggers Drawn is the result of a very unusual pedigree pattern. The granddam of Diesis is the Champion Two-Year-Old Filly Soft Angels, and Daggers Drawn's own third dam is the talented filly Milly Moss, a three-parts sister to Soft Angels, so the three-quarters sisters appear 3x3. This is not the first time a similar pattern has occurred. French group winner Steward has as his granddam the mare Axyaa. She is by Kris (GB)--a brother to Diesis--and out of a daughter of Milly Moss.

A move to the grass proved to be just the thing for Wild Event (c, 4, Wild Again--North of Eden {Ire}, by Northfields), a half-brother to Turf Champion Paradise Creek who recorded his first stakes victory when winning Saturday's GII Arlington H. Wild Event is one of four graded stakes winners sired by Wild Again out of mares by sons of Northern Dancer. This is significant, as Wild Again's sire Icecapade and Northern Dancer are both by Nearctic out of Native Dancer-line mares, and this combination gives the genetic relatives 2x3.

Champion Hansel has not yet really fulfilled the hopes held out for him at stud, but he did have a stakes winner July 31 at Del Mar in the shape of Mufattish (g, 4, Hansel--Regent's Honey, by Vice Regent). As we so often find in these circumstances, Mufattish is the result of a very clever mating. Hansel's dam Count On Bonnie is by a son of Northern Dancer out of a mare by Victoria Park. Vice Regent, the broodmare sire of Mufattish, is by Northern Dancer out of a half-sister to Victoria Park.

Champion Two-Year-Old and 2,000 Guineas winner Zafonic was represented by his first Group winner when Xaar (GB) (c, 2, Zafonic--Monroe, by Sir Ivor) took Saturday's G3 Prix de Cabourg at Deauville. Xaar has Somethingroyal 5x4 in his pedigree through Secretariat and Sir Gaylord, and it is also worth noting that he is a half-brother to the speedy Masterclass, a son of Zafonic's broodmare sire, The Minstrel. This is a useful reminder that when a sire of a previous good winner from the family is unavailable and doesn't have any sons which appeal--as was the case with The Minstrel here--it can often pay to use a stallion out of one of his daughters.
