ANOTHER MILLION-DOLLAR BABY AT FASIG-TIPTON SARATOGA

A bay colt by Gulch brought spectators to their feet as he brought a bid of \$1.4 million to top the final session of Fasig-Tipton's 1997 Saratoga Yearling Sales last night. The first foal from Weekend Storm (Storm Bird), a full sister to Summer Squall and a half-sister to A.P. Indy (Seattle Slew), the January foal was consigned by Lane's End, agent, and purchased by Demi O'Byrne, agent for John Magnier and Michael Tabor. "I think we'll keep him here in America," said O'Byrne. "His pedigree is like Thunder Gulch--same cross. He's very like him, except for his color. All the omens are there." John Ferguson Bloodstock was the underbidder on the colt. The top-selling filly Thursday was a daughter of hot sire Deputy Minister out of graded stakes winner Stardusk (Stage Door Johnny). Consigned by Denali Stud (Craig Bandoroff), Agent I, the chestnut was purchased by trainer D. Wayne Lukas, agent for Fusao Sekiguchi. Sekiguchi, who founded a firm in Japan which provides engineering services to companies, was also the buyer of the co-top colt Wednesday, the son of Gone West which sold for \$475,000. Lukas will train both for the Japanese businessman, who will have horses racing in the U.S. for the first time. Building on last year's impressive growth, the totals for the sale showed increases across the board. Thursday night's session saw 46 yearlings gross \$10,537,000 for an average of \$229,065, up 33.7 percent from last year's final session when 53 hips brought \$9,079,000, an average of \$171,302.--Overall, a total of 151 hips brought \$27,691,000 for an average of \$183,384, up 13.5 percent from the 1996 auction which saw 169 yearlings bring an aggregate of \$27,311,000, an average of \$161,604. Last night's median price was \$200,000, up 66.6 percent from \$120,000 on the closing night a year ago. The median price for the three days of the sale was \$150,000, up 15.3 percent from \$130,000 in 1996. "It was a landmark sale," said Fasig-Tipton Chairman D. G. Van Clief, Jr. "It was a very gratifying sale for the company and it's also nice after a hiatus of six years to see a \$1 million and a \$1 million-plus yearling go through the ring here. The approach we set six years ago was to emphasize the selection process to put better horses on the grounds. The sale is beginning to build on itself now."

SMOKE GLACKEN INJURED According to the *Daily Racing Form*, top sprinter **Smoke Glacken** (Two Punch) has developed a chip in his knee and could now be retired to stud. "It was a small chip," the colt's co-owner, Robert Levy, told the *Form*. "He never took a bad step, and he's not even lame. We sent the X-rays to Dr. (Larry) Bramlage." A winner of 10 of his 14 career starts including the GI Hopeful at two, the three-year-old has captured his last three starts, the GIII Riva Ridge S., GIII Jersey Shore Breeders' Cup S. and GII Frank J. DeFrancis Memorial Dash over older horses in his latest July 19. He has earned \$759,560 to date. Plans call for the Maryland-bred roan to stand stud at Gainesway Farm in Lexington at the conclusion of his racing career.

FLORIDA DERBY PURSE RAISED The purse for the 1998 edition of the GI Florida Derby has been boosted \$250,000 and will be worth \$750,000 guaranteed. The mile-and-an-eighth test for three-year-olds will be run March 14 next year. "The Florida Derby is one of the most significant races for three-year-olds prior to the Triple Crown and the increased purse is in keeping with its national prestige," said Gulfstream President and CEO Douglas Donn. "The Florida Derby has been strongly supported by horsemen through the years and we believe they should be rewarded with an even greater financial incentive in the future." The race will now match the GI Santa Anita Derby as the richest Triple Crown prep, and will once again be televised on ABC's "Wide World of Sports." The Florida Derby highlights a stakes program offering 36 events worth a Florida-record \$5,225,000. Also on the schedule are the GI Donn H. February 7 and GI Gulfstream Park H. February 28. While the purse for the GII Pan American H. has been decreased \$50,000 to \$250,000, two stakes have been given increases of \$50,000 to \$200,000--the GII Gulfstream Park Breeders' Cup H., set for February 14; and the GIII Gulfstream Park Breeders' Cup Sprint Championship, to be run March 13. Four stakes will receive \$25,000 boosts; going up to \$100,000 will be the purses for the GIII Swale S. March 14, GIII Broward H. January 10, GIII Mac Diarmida H. January 11 and the Deputy Minister H. January 18. The purse for the GIII De La Rose H. March 15 has been lowered \$25,000 to \$75,000.

A # will distinguish first-time stakes-winners, a @ will indicate first-time graded stakes-winners, a + will denote winners who are first-time starters, an (S) will be used for state-bred races, a (C) will be used for maiden-claiming races, and an (R) will be used for other restricted races.

OAK TREE ANNOUNCES FALL STAKES

SCHEDULE Oak Tree at Santa Anita's 29th season, which runs October 1-November 3, 1997, will feature a 26-race stakes calendar worth \$4.2 million. New on the schedule is the \$250,000 Oak Tree Derby, a Grade II stakes formerly known as the Volante H. and run last year for a \$125,000 purse. The mile-and-an-eighth turf test will be held on the same card as the GI Yellow Ribbon Invitational November 2. Oak Tree will also offer two Breeders' Cup preview weekends; the GII Goodwood Breeders' Cup H., which **Alphabet Soup** (Cozzene) used as a springboard to his Classic victory last year, and six-furlong GIII Ancient Title Breeders' Cup Championship are on tap for October 11 and the GI Oak Tree Turf Championship is set for October 12, while the GI Oak Leaf S. for two-year-old fillies and GIII Oak Tree Breeders' Cup Mile are set for October 18 and the GII Norfolk S. for two-year-olds and GII Lady's Secret Breeders' Cup H. for the distaffers will be run October 19. The purse for the Oak Tree Breeders' Cup Mile has been increased \$75,000 to \$250,000, while the distance of both the Oak Leaf and Norfolk have been decreased to one mile. Also set for the Oak Tree fall season is California Cup Day, a 10-stakes event for Cal-breds worth \$1.2 million set for October 25.

LOUIS QUATORZE RETIRED The *Daily Racing Form* reports that 1996 GI Preakness winner **Louis Quatorze** (Sovereign Dancer), unraced since suffering a chipped ankle following his 13-length triumph in the GIII Ben Ali S. at Keeneland April 23, has been retired. The four-year-old was purchased by Coolmore Stud in June and will stand at their Ashford Stud in Versailles, Kentucky in 1998. He goes to the breeding shed with a record of seven wins, five seconds and one third from 18 starts and earnings of \$2,054,434.

Santa Anita will not be open for inter-track wagering during the September 11-29 meet at Fairplex Park. The track is undergoing more than \$10 million in renovations and improvements. The "facelift" will include new paint, new flooring and new decor in the grandstand, box seats, Club House and Turf Club, and renovations to the grounds, infield, paddock gardens and barn area. The Santa Anita meet opens October 1.
