DEAUVILLE YEARLING SALE BEGINS TODAY

L'Agence Francaise's 1997 Deauville Yearling Sale opens today in Deauville, France and runs through Thursday, Aug. 28. A total of 509 yearlings have been catalogued including Hip 63, a full brother to G1 Prix Lupin winner Cloudings by Sadler's Wells--Ispahan; Hip 75, a half-brother by Saumarez to Japan Cup runner-up Fabulous La Fouine; and Hip 95, a half-sister by Zafonic to MGSW Titus Livius. In 1996 and 1997, 12 Deauville graduates have won 16 Group 1 or Grade I races. These Deauville stars include Helissio--the third Deauville-sold winner of the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe in five years; French champion Shake the Yoke; and Breeders' Cup Sprint and Eclipse Award winner Lit de Justice.

cox's RIDGE PENSIONED Top racehorse and stallion cox's Ridge (Best Turn) has been retired from stallion duty, a Claiborne Farm spokesperson confirmed yesterday. He was pensioned due to declining fertility and health problems due to old age. On the racetrack, Cox's Ridge won 11 stakes including the GI Metropolitan H. for earnings of \$667,172. Upon conclusion of his racing career he entered stud at Claiborne Farm in Paris, Kentucky, where he stood through the 1997 breeding season. He is the sire of more than 40 stakes winners and the earners of over \$33 million, including champions Life's Magic, Cardmania and Vanlandingham and Grade I winners Sultry Song, De Roche, Lost Mountain, Twilight Ridge, Scuffleburg, Pine Circle, Little Missouri, Dream Team and Trapp Mountain.

FAVORITE TRICK'S SCHEDULE SET Undefeated two-year-old colt Favorite Trick (Phone Trick), who counts the GII Saratoga Special, GIII Bashford Manor S. and Kentucky Breeders' Cup S. among his five career victories, will start next in the GI Hopeful S. at Saratoga Aug. 30, trainer Patrick Byrne confirmed yesterday. "We are looking at a championship for this colt, and champions come out of Saratoga," Byrne said. "Favorite Trick will have only three more races this year: the Hopeful, the Keeneland Futurity (Oct. 18) and the Breeders' Cup Juvenile (Nov. 8 at Hollywood Park)."

Nicholson, executive vice president and executive director of The Jockey Club, will work closely with NTRA President D.G. Van Clief Jr. in moving ahead with recently-unveiled plans to compete with other professional sports through a national office which will coordinate, promote and market Thoroughbred racing. "We are delighted to have Nick's invaluable assistance on a day-to-day basis and particularly grateful to The Jockey Club for making him available to devote virtually 100 percent of his time to the project over the next few months," said Van Clief.

SUFFOLK MAY HOST HARNESS RACES After a 24-year absence, harness racing could return to Suffolk Downs next month. According to the Harness Tracks of America newsletter, the Massachusetts Racing Commission has granted Suffolk permission to hold Massachusetts Sire Stakes races for standardbreds. The races need a home after Foxboro Raceway was forced to close. The races would be held Sept. 2 and Sept. 9. According to track spokesman Chip Tuttle, Suffolk is "exploring the possibility" of holding the races. According to HTA records, harness racing was last conducted at Suffolk in 1973.
