#### SAINT BALLADO TO TAYLOR MADE Saint Ballado (Halo--Ballade, by \*Herbager), sire of Kentucky Derby runner-up Captain Bodgit, will stand the 1998 breeding season at Taylor Made Farm in Nicholasville, Kentucky as the property of Aaron U. Jones and Taylor Made. "This is one of the most important stallion families in the stud book today. said Ben Taylor, head of Taylor Made's stallion division. "The performance of this family on both the racetrack and in the sales ring is overwhelming. Anyone who recognizes the horse business as a home run game will recognize Saint Ballado as a home run horse." The eight-year-old stallion is from the family of leading sires Rahy and Devil's Bag, Canadian Horse of the Year Glorious Song and 1996 Champion Turf Horse Singspiel. Saint Ballado had nine two-year-old winners from his first crop of 29 foals, headed by GI Florida Derby winner Captain Bodgit, and already has two undefeated two-year-olds from his second crop in I'm in Heaven and Evening Hush. I'm in Heaven followed a 15-length maiden win with a score in the Toddler S. In the sales ring, Saint Ballado had the sales topper at the 1997 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky July Yearling Sale with a \$290,000 colt, which sold to Bob Baffert as agent for Bob and Beverly Lewis with Bailey-Ellenberg Select as underbidder. Saint Ballado will stand the 1998 breeding season for \$20,000 live foal.

#### THROUGH THREE, DEAUVILLE NUMBERS UP

After three sessions of Agence Française's six-day August Yearling Sale in Deauville, France, 204 horses sold for an aggregate of \$15,904,062, up 20 percent from the 1996 figure. The average price of \$77,961 is up nine percent from last year. "The market is up again," declared Philippe Augier, president of the Agence Française. "This confirms the advance of last year and we are delighted to see new buyers from the United States, Japan, England and China." Among the new buyers are Americans B. Wayne Hughes, Richard Santulli, Gary Biszantz, Jerome Brody and Richard Attwood. At Tuesday's fourth session of the sale, top price was paid for hip number 322. The filly by Highest Honor (Fr)--Numero Privee, by Private Account was consigned by Haras du Quesnay and brought a final bid of \$88,831 from Frederic Saugue. At yesterday's session, 58 yearlings sold for a total of \$1,544,052 and an average of \$66,596. The sale runs through August 28.

## WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES

TALE OF THE CAT (c, 3, Storm Cat--Yarn, by Mr. Prospector) Not every tale is for real, but Tale of the Cat has turned out to be. A few weeks ago trainer John Forbes was telling the tale of his three-year-old's potential as he prepared for a Haskell clash with Touch Gold and Free House. There Tale of the Cat ran a brave race before tiring close to home to finish fourth, suffering the first defeat of his short career. Returning to action in the seven furlong GII King's Bishop S. at Saratoga Saturday, Tale of the Cat turned in a brilliant exhibition of sprinting to score by 5½ lengths, taking his record to three wins in four starts.

Tale of the Cat comes from a family which is redhot this year. His dam Yarn was only a minor winner, but she is a sister to the GI Frizette S. heroine Preach, dam of this year's early season three-year-old star Pulpit. Realm, a three-parts sister to Yarn and Preach by Mr. Prospector out of State (the granddam of Yarn and Preach), is dam of last year's speedy juvenile Haint. In addition, Announce, a son of Forty Niner (by Mr. Prospector) and State won the GIII Equipoise Mile earlier this year. State, the ancestress of all of these notable runners, was only useful on the racecourse, winning three races and \$54,234, but she certainly owned an outstanding pedigree as she was by Nijinsky II out of Round Table's stakes winning sister Monarchy. OBS YEARLING SALES RESULTS At yesterday's first open session of the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's August Yearling Sale in Ocala, Florida, 220 horses sold, grossing \$2,632,200 compared to the \$1,903,000 grossed when 208 horses sold at the corresponding 1996 session. The average price of \$11,965 was up 30.7 percent from last year's average of \$9,149, while the median price of \$9,250 rose 54 percent from \$6,000 a year ago. The session topper was Oke From Roanoke, a colt by Roanoke--Peaceful Snow, by Hold Your Peace. Consigned by Johnson Hollow Farm, agent, as hip number 426, the yearling brought a final bid of \$51,000 from Jimmy Miranda of Givens Farm. "I thought demand remained strong throughout the session," said OBS Director of Sales Tom Ventura. "The buyers were there in all price ranges and correct individuals went for a premium." The Open Yearling Sale continues Wednesday at 10:30 a.m. and runs through Thursday.

The appearance of Nijinsky II brings us another interesting aspect of the pedigree. Somewhere around 10 years ago in his book Quest for a Classic Winner. Ken McLean predicted that the related Storm Bird, Nijinsky II and The Minstrel would eventually combine well in pedigrees. It has taken a little time to happen, as Storm Bird in particular has only just receded far enough back into pedigrees to make it feasible to combine him with the other two sons of Northern Dancer. Last year however, saw the appearance of champion two-year-old filly Storm Song, who is by Storm Bird's son Summer Squall and out of a daughter of a mare by The Minstrel. We have also had the G1 Gran Premio Carlos Pellegrini victor Fregys, who is by Storm Bird's son Combsway out of a daughter of a Nijinsky II mare, and 1997 threeyear-old stakes winner Zede, by Nijinsky II's grandson Strawberry Road (Aus) out of a mare by Storm Bird. Now Tale of the Cat, who has Storm Bird/Nijinsky II 2x4, has joined what looks likely to be a rapidly growing club.

For those thinking of employing the cross there are a couple observations worth making. So far each one of the stakes winners has had Storm Bird with Nijinsky II or Storm Bird with The Minstrel, and in each case there has been a son strain of one of those horses and a daughter strain of the other. We are still waiting for the combination of The Minstrel and Nijinsky II to deliver and since The Minstrel and Nijinsky II carry opposite sex strains of Flaming Page (dam of Nijinsky II, granddam of The Minstrel), it may be less important that they themselves are represented through son/daughter combinations. In fact, since writing this we have noticed groupplaced juvenile Elshamms, who is from the first crop of Zafonic (dam by The Minstrel) out of a mare by Nijinsky II's son Green Dancer.
