BLUSHING K.D. TO TAYLOR MADE Leading three-year-old filly **Blushing K.D.** (Blushing John), still recovering from the fractured sesamoids that ended her racing career, will move to Taylor Made Farm in Nicholasville, Kentucky to begin her new career as a broodmare. Currently recuperating at Monmouth Park, the GI Kentucky Oaks heroine will be shipped to Kentucky in the next few days. Breeding plans for the filly are still being finalized.

TURFWAY OPENS TODAY Racing returns to Turfway Park tonight, with a first post time of 7 p.m. The 23-day 1997 Fall Meet runs through October 3. The highlight of the stakes schedule will be the fourth renewal of the \$1,150,000 Kentucky Cup Day of Champions on Saturday, September 13. The opening night feature is the Dangerous Leader Purse. Turfway will race Wednesday through Sunday with first post Wednesday, Thursday and Friday at 7 p.m. Saturday and Sunday, the racing action begins at 1 p.m., with the exception of Kentucky Cup day when first post is 12:30 p.m.

MONMOUTH PARK CONCLUDES RECORD SEASON The 1997 Monmouth Park meet ended with total attendance up for the fifth straight season and single-day records shattered for handle and attendance on Haskell Day '97. Total attendance for the meet was 733,217--up 2.7 percent from last year's figure of 714,053. On-track handle for the meet was \$117,219,349, down three percent from last year's aggregate of \$120,847,066. Total 1997 handle was \$279,286,433 compared to \$294,591,928 a year ago. The clear highlight of the meet was Buick Haskell day when 39,219, the largest crowd in Haskell history, bet \$9.7 million--the most ever wagered in New Jersey on a single day. Top riding honors went to veteran jockey Rick Wilson while Juan Serey took his third straight trainer's title. James A. Riccio, D.J. Stable and Briardale wound up in a three-way tie for top owner honors.

WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES

FAVORITE TRICK (c, 2, Phone Trick--Evil Elaine, by Medieval Man)

We have watched Favorite Trick's continued dominance over the early and mid-season two-year-olds with a degree of trepidation. This is not an adverse reflection on an admirable and truly talented youngster, but a reflection on a pedigree which is hard to explain in a limited space. However, Favorite Trick's victory in the GI Hopeful S. urges us to see if we can rise to the challenge.

In terms of his sire line/broodmare sire combination, Favorite Trick represents a variation on the cross of Nearctic over Star Kingdom, which, when Nearctic has been represented by Northern Dancer rather than Phone Trick's grandsire Icecapade, has produced at least 88 stakes winners. This part of the conundrum is straightforward enough, as the successful combination of Nearctic with Star Kingdom is not particularly surprising given that Nearctic's dam, Lady Angela, and Star Kingdom both share a background in which Hyperion, Tracery and Swynford are prominent.

This pattern apart, Favorite Trick has Royal Charger and his three-parts brother Nasrullah 4x5, Djeddah 5x6 and Bull Lea 5x6. The first significant thing to note is that when we look at Favorite Trick's sire and dam, we find that Bull Lea is in Phone Trick as the broodmare sire of his broodmare sire Finnegan, and in Evil Elaine as the broodmare sire of Tim Tam, who in turn is the broodmare sire of her sire, Medieval Man. So, he is on what we call the zig-zag of both sire and dam.

The second thing to note is that there is a relationship between Bull Lea and another horse duplicated in this pedigree, Djeddah. Bull Lea's fourth dam is a mare called The Apple. She traces back to one of the legion of notable producers sired by Hermit out of daughters, granddaughters or great-granddaughters of the outstanding foundation mare Maid of Masham. Djeddah's broodmare sire Asterus is a member of the same family and Astrology, the fourth dam of Asterus, is a three-parts sister to The Apple. We might pass over this as a coincidence if it weren't for some other significant members of this tribe appearing in the pedigree.

To start with, Last Wave, the dam of Phone Trick's broodmare sire Finnegan, is inbred 3x4 to Colonial, a granddaughter of The Apple. Then, if we trace Favorite Trick's tail female line back, we come to a mare called Pauline, who is by Hermit out of a daughter of Maid of Masham, and therefore extremely closely related to both Astrology and The Apple. Pauline is granddam of Fair Play (sire of Man o' War) and we have at least four Fair Play crosses here. We also have two crosses of Star Shoot, a son of Astrology, and therefore a half-brother to the third dam of Asterus.

The Hermit/Maid of Masham cross will be found numerous times in the background of virtually any modern Thoroughbred. However, the concentrations found here, especially through Bull Lea and his daughter Last Wave, through Djeddah and his broodmare sire Asterus and in the tail-female line, lead us to believe they play a decisive role in Favorite Trick's ability. There is a rough rule of thumb that a deep pattern generally conveys some stamina. If this is so, Favorite Trick may have a good chance of stretching out to the mile and a sixteenth of the Breeders' Cup Juvenile. In that regard, there is an added note of optimism in that Phone Trick's Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies winner, Phone Chatter, was also linebred to Djeddah.

PEDIGREE SHORTS...

The victory of **Grand Royale (c, 2, Danzig--Good Mood, by Devil's Bag)** in the first division of the Continental Mile S. at Monmouth Park Sunday served to remind us that Devil's Bag looks set to make a major impact as a broodmare sire. This should come as no surprise when one recalls that he is not only a son of Halo, but is also a brother to Saint Ballado and Glorious Song, the dam of Rahy, Singspiel and Rakeen. Another factor of considerable influence might be the presence of Herbager in Devil's Bag's pedigree. Herbager carries a three-parts sister to Pharos and Fairway and a half-brother to Selene, the dam of Hyperion, Sickle and Pharamond II, and therefore balances many important modern commercial strains. Grand Royale is himself another example of Northern Dancer combining with Halo and giving linebreeding to Almahmoud.

The victory of **Three Fanfares (f, 4, Chief's Crown--Allie's Tune, by Drone)** in the GIII Gardenia S. Sunday took the total of stakes winners sired by Chief's Crown and having a double of Somethingroyal through Secretariat and Sir Gaylord to nine. This represents nearly a third of his 30 stakes winners, and with five of 16 group or graded winners owning the same cross, the proportion is the same there. Chief's Crown is now deceased, but it should pay to look for youngsters by him with the same pattern, and also to mate his daughters to stallions carrying Sir Gaylord.

We believe that we might be seeing a growing affinity between Danzig and Sharpen Up (GB). Three sons of Danzig have sired stakes winners out of Sharpen Up mares—including two Group 1 winners by Danzig's son, Danehill. Over the weekend, the Prix du Haras de la Huderie at Deauville was won by **Trans Island (GB) (c, 2, Selkirk--Khubza {GB}, by Green Desert)**, who is by a very promising young son of Sharpen Up out of a mare by a son of Danzig.
