KEENELAND SEPTEMBER SALE GETS

UNDERWAY Hoping to continue the trend set by a record-breaking 1996 September Sale and a strong 1997 July Sale, Keeneland opens its 1997 September Yearling Sale today in Lexington. A total of 3,668 horses, including 1,925 colts, 1,735 fillies and eight geldings, were catalogued for the auction, third highest in its history. Yearlings by such top stallions as A.P. Indy, Caerleon, Capote, Danzig, Deputy Minister, Forty Niner, Gilded Time, Gone West, Gulch, Mr. Prospector, Seattle Slew, Seeking the Gold, Storm Cat, Woodman and Unbridled will be represented. The first day's offering includes Hip #4, a half-brother to GI Preakness winner Louis Quatorze (Sovereign Dancer) by Storm Cat: Hip #27, a half-brother to European champion Priolo (Sovereign Dancer) by Kingmambo; Hip #85, a half-brother to Eclipse Award-winner Gold Beauty (Mr. Prospector) by Theatrical (Ire); Hip #131, a son of champion and Kentucky Derby heroine Winning Colors by Rahy; Hip #161, a daughter of MGISW and gradedstakes producer Banker's Lady by Seeking the Gold; Hip #243, a half-sister to champion and top sire Gilded Time (Timeless Moment) by Housebuster; Hip #246, a half-brother to multi-millionaire Bet Twice (Sportin' Life) by Gilded Time; and Hip #333, the second foal from MGISW Missy's Mirage by Mr. Prospector. Last year's Keeneland September Sale established records for gross sales, \$137,358,600, and average, \$46,578. The 10-day auction runs September 8-17, and bidding begins at 10 a.m. daily.

HAWTHORNE OPENS TODAY Hawthorne Race Course, the nation's fifth oldest racetrack, opens its 80-day fall Thoroughbred meeting today. The meet features a 27-event stakes schedule, highlighted by the October 11 GIII \$300,000 Hawthorne Gold Cup for three-year-olds and up. Another top attraction on the stakes program is the October 12 GIII Hawthorne Derby at nine furlongs on the turf. The Illinois track will offer live racing two days each week--Monday and Tuesday--from opening day through October 7. Beginning October 11, racing will be conducted six days a week, with Thursday the lone dark day. Post time throughout the fall meet will be 1 p.m. The only exception will be November 8, when an expanded 16-race card, including the Breeders' Cup from Hollywood Park, gets underway at 10:30 a.m.

Another impressive run from the Niarchos family's Spinning World, who followed his win in the G1 Prix du Haras de Fresnav-Le-Buffard Prix Jacques le Marois at Deauville Aug. 17 with a demolition of this field. Only 1996 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe winner Helissio (Fr) was making any kind of race of it inside the final quartermile, but he was simply outpaced in the closing stages. Spinning World, winning for the third time in four starts this season, made his move at the same time as Helissio, but his speed took him clear with a furlong to run and he was only ridden out hands and heels to the finish by Cash Asmussen. Helissio battled on bravely for second and showed himself in good form for his attempt of a repeat win in the Arc at Longchamp Oct. 5. French 2000 Guineas winner Daylami (Ire) prevailed in a threeway photo for third. The Niarchos family's representative Alan Cooper said, "This horse has done very well between three and four years of age, as he showed this time, finding himself in front earlier than usual, resisting all challenges and drawing away. Now Spinning World will be freshened up and prepared for the Breeders' Cup, either the Classic or the Mile. We will discuss it between ourselves to see if we can try him over a mile and a quarter on the dirt." Winning rider Cash Asmussen said, "When Helissio went to make his move, maybe I had to make my move a little earlier than I wanted, but you can't let Helissio get too far in front of you." Trainer Elie Lellouche was delighted by Helissio's effort, saying, "I am very, very happy and satisfied with him. He ran a great race. It had to be tried and now it's over, and he has lost nothing in defeat. Now on to the Arc." Weekend Results cont.

Under a perfect tactical ride from Kieren Fallon, German Derby winner Borgia (Ger) landed her second Group One stakes of the year with a comfortable victory over older males. She may now be supplemented for the Prix de L'Arc de Triomphe at Longchamp Oct. 5. At the rear of the tightly-bunched field early, the filly began to make progress on the outside on the final bend. A battle had developed between Predappio (GB) and Luso (GB), but Borgia came through smoothly to gain the lead, giving her ailing trainer Bruno Schutz his ninth winner at the Baden-Baden meeting. Schutz has in fact won all bar one of the German Group One races to date this season. Borgia's full-sister was sold Saturday night at the Baden-Baden yearling sales for \$326,673, a new record for the sale, and will now be trained by the Schutz team or go to Andre Fabre in France.


