KEENELAND OPENER A GOLD MINE: MR. PROSPECTOR COLT BRINGS RECORD

\$2.3 MILLION Burying the Keeneland September record price of \$1.4 million set by a yearling son of Gone West last year, a colt by Gone West's sire Mr. Prospector brought the opening-day crowd at the 1997 Keeneland September Yearling Sale to a standstill as he drew a final bid of \$2.3 million Monday in Lexington. The gray, a May 31 foal out of the multiple Grade I winner Missy's Mirage (Stop the Music), was consigned by Eaton Sales, agent, and purchased by Satish Sanan for his Padua Stables. "We were just going to go home, to be honest," said Sanan, founder of an international software engineering company called Information Management Resources. "We had actually originally rejected this horse, but then we went back, talked to the vet, had him rescoped and decided it was worth taking a chance. We took it--big chance. He's the only Mr. Prospector colt here, and everybody was waiting for him. If you like something, you have to go for it. I don't know who will train him, but he'll go to Lane's End Farm and they'll break him in Camden, South Carolina." Sanan, a native of India who now lives in Clearwater, Florida, was the leading new buyer at the Keeneland July Sale, purchasing six yearlings for a total of \$2,070,000. The second highest price at Monday's opening session was also a record as a daughter of Danzig out of GISW I'm Sweets (Alydar) brought a final bid of \$950,000, highest price ever for a yearling filly at the sale. Also consigned by Eaton Sales, agent for Elizabeth Moran, the May 30 foal was purchased by Demi O'Byrne, agent for John Magnier and Michael Tabor. "The mare was just so great, and she's a Danzig," said O'Byrne. "What more can you say? We're going to send her to Europe and we'll see if we get lucky." The previous mark for a filly at the auction was \$735,000, paid for Alydar's Gift (Alydar) in 1983. A total of 257 yearlings sold for \$40,808,000 during the first session of the sale, up 11 percent from last year's opener when 264 horses grossed \$36,786,000. The 1997 first-day average of \$158,786 was up 14 percent from the 1996 figure of \$139,341. The median, however, was down 8.3 percent, from \$120,000 last year to \$110,000 this year. The 10-day sale continues through Wednesday, September 17, with bidding beginning at 10 a.m. daily.

ARLINGTON TO SHUT ITS DOORS? Officials at Arlington International Racecourse yesterday informed the Illinois Racing Board that it has withdrawn its application for 1998 racing dates. The track, which rose from the ashes of the 1985 fire to reopen in 1989, may close down permanently when the 1997 meeting ends October 10. "We cannot hold out every year, hoping the Governor and the legislature will do something," said Arlington Chairman Dick Duchossois. "It's as though someone has a terrible toothache and keeps taking aspirin. The aspirin may provide a little relief, but the problem is still there and will keep getting worse. The time has come to stop taking aspirin. Since we reopened in 1989, the situation has completely changed. Wisconsin has dog racing and Indian gaming. Illinois has all those riverboats, Indiana has riverboats, Iowa has riverboats. We simply can't operate the way we did in the 1970s and 1980s. The economics aren't there. The losses are gigantic and the quality of racing keeps going down. Racing is completely micromanaged by people outside the industry. These people don't understand racing and they're so completely out of touch with what's happening in racing. How can we increase purses when we can't increase revenue? How can we maintain quality when we can't increase purses?" Duchossois did leave the door open a crack for a return to racing at Arlington, saying, "The company hasn't stopped, only the racing has stopped. The track is not for sale. If there are changes, I certainly would evaluate them." Although withdrawing his request for live racing dates, Duchossois has asked for approval to use Arlington as an inter-track wagering facility; he would also continue to operate his four off-track betting parlors and his now-defunct harness track, Quad City Downs, which offers simulcasting programs.

MILLKOM NEARS COMEBACK Millkom (GB) (Cyrano de Bergerac), who has not competed since his victory in the GI Man o'War S. at Belmont Park September 16, 1995, will make his return to the races in Wednesday's Live The Dream S. at a mile over the Del Mar turf. Now six, the bay was a champion in France at three and has won 12 of his 18 career starts, including the G1 Prix Jean Prat and G1 Grand Prix de Paris. He suffered two tendon injuries in the Man o'War, his lone previous start in the U.S. Trainer Ben Cecil has had the horse in his barn since January. "He's as ready as I think we can get him off training," he said. "It's been a long process bringing him back. If he runs well and comes back from this race fine, we'll point him toward the Oak Tree Turf Championship (GI, October 12)."

Local News: Kentucky

James E. Bassett III, chairman of the Committee to Save the Calumet Trophies, said his group is in a "holding pattern" after meeting with parties involved in the Calumet heir bankruptcy litigation. The Committee hopes to purchase the historic collection in order to keep it intact and on public display at the Kentucky Horse Park. "We're in a holding pattern until there is a specific plan to sell the trophies, either by private sale with sealed bids, or at public auction," said Bassett. "We are also trying to determine whether the trophies will be sold individually or as a collection. We do not feel it is prudent to submit a bid until the ground rules are clarified." The Committee has been raising funds for the purchase of the collection and Bassett said the fund raising would continue, although it has been impacted by the release of the recent Guernsey appraisal which assesses the collection at approximately four times the value of the figure released previously by Sotheby. He also said that if the group is unable to acquire the trophies, "every dollar will be returned to those who contributed."

Texan Cash Asmussen has lost the mount on Sunday's G1 Emirates Prix du Moulin de Longchamp runner-up **Helissio (Fr)** (Fairy King) in next month's Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe. Asmussen was not on board Helissio Sunday, but instead rode **Spinning World** (Nureyev) to beat last year's Arc winner. However, he did have the mount on Enrique Sarasola's colt when he could finish only third in Ascot's King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. July 26. Announcing the decision to seek a new rider, Sarasola's racing manager Bruno Ridoux said Monday: "It is felt that Cash and Helissio are not suited to each other and that is the reason behind the decision to end the partnership. The search is now on for a new rider." One rider who is not expected to be free to partner Helissio in the Arc is Olivier Peslier, who was on board in the Prix du Moulin and for the victory in the 1996 Arc, but is almost certain to be claimed to ride Prix du Jockey Club (French Derby) winner **Peintre Celebre** (Nureyev), trained by Andre Fabre.

The pattern has already produced graded stakes winners Power Lunch and La Rosa and the good sprinter Wild Harmony, and a new graded stakes winner joined the club when **Omi (f, 4, Wild Again--Flying Heat, by Private Account)** captured the GIII Arlington Matron H. Sunday. In all four cases, the second strain of Khaled comes in through his son Swaps.

We have mentioned before that Lear Fan has worked well with mares carrying Thong, a sister to his broodmare sire Lt. Stevens, this cross having produced French Champions Loup Solitaire and Verveine and this year's graded stakes winner Fantastic Fellow. However, **Hot Lear (f, 2, Lear Fan--Medicine Woman, by Dr. Blum)**, who took her record to two-for-two with a win in Sunday's Bay Meadows Debutante S., takes things one step further. She actually has Lt. Stevens himself 3x3. She should be very interesting with stallions carrying Thong when it comes her time to retire to stud.
