\$1.7 MILLION COLT TOPS KEENELAND'S

SECOND SESSION Tuesday's second session was another banner day for the Keeneland September Yearling Sale with a top bid of \$1.7 million for hip number 689 capping off a brilliant day. The dark bay or brown colt, a son of Gone West--My Song for You, by Seattle Song, was consigned by Dr. John and Alice Chandler's Mill Ridge Sales, agent and purchased by Shadwell Estate Company Ltd. "He was a lovely horse," admitted John Chandler. "I've been watching him for five days and he never put a foot wrong. He showed as good today as he did Friday." Chandler speculated the colt would be sent to Europe. One hip later, bidding on hip number 690, a colt by Storm Cat--My Turbulent Miss, by My Dad George also reached seven figures, but in the end owners Bob and Beverly Lewis and John Moynihan bought back the dark bay or brown yearling. The Lewises purchased the colt as a weanling for \$525,000 at the 1996 Keeneland November Sale and the couple brought him here with the intention of pinhooking him. When the bidding stalled short of the set reserve, the Lewises brought the voungster home again with a bid of \$1.475 million. "We were here pinhooking," confirmed Bob Lewis, "We took hard money at \$1.45 million and \$1.475 million was our bid." Despite the unexpected turn of events. Lewis was not disappointed, "We're pleased to be going home with the colt. We think he's a tremendous animal, a tremendous athlete. He was nominated to the July Sale, but we thought we'd give him another 60 days, he's a May foal, and he's certainly developed in that time." The dark bay yearling, a daughter of Deputy Minister--Triple Strike, by Secretariat, was consigned by North Ridge Farm, agent, and brought a final bid of \$700,000 from Kay Shigeta of Silky Green, Inc. Shigeta bought the filly for Toyomitsu Hirai, owner of Japan's Eishin Farm. The \$700,000 bid was the third highest price ever for a filly at the September Yearling Sales, "She's going to Japan," said Dr. John Weld, who helped Shigeta purchase the filly. "The trainer is unknown at this time. We hope she's lucky." The numbers continued the upswing of Monday's opening session. During Tuesday's session, 248 hips sold for a total of \$38,291,000--up 17.4 percent from last year's figure when 265 yearlings sold for \$32,620,000. The average price of \$154,399 was up 25.4 percent from the \$123,094 average of last year's second session. The median price rose 22 percent from \$82,000 last year to \$100,000 in 1997. During the first two days of the sale, both the median and average prices showed increases. The average of \$156,632 is up 19.4 percent and the median of \$105,000 is up five percent. The sale continues tomorrow beginning at 10 a.m. and runs through Wednesday, September 17.

TOBA AWARDS DINNER The Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders' Association's annual stallion season auction, held during the National Breeders' Awards dinner September 5 at The Vinery in Midway, Kentucky, "surpassed our expectations," said TOBA President Drew Couto. The event raised \$210,900 from the sale of 12 stallion seasons. The yearly auction of donated no-guarantee stallion seasons is conducted by the Fasig-Tipton Company and raises funds for a range of projects developed by TOBA. "Last year, the proceeds from this sale helped to make America's Day at the Races a reality and this year they will be used to help the racing industry respond to the issues raised by the National Gambling Impact Commission," Couto said. A season to Belmont S. victor Touch Gold sold for \$40,000 as the highest bid at the auction. Kentucky Derby winner Silver Charm brought the next highest bid at \$27,000 with Epsom Derby winner Benny the Dip bringing in \$22,000. The TOBA Breeder of the Year Award was presented to owner-breeders John Toffan and Trudy McCaffery. The TOBA Industry Service Award was presented to D. G. Van Clief Jr., acting chief executive of the newly created National Thoroughbred Racing Association and vice president of the TOBA.

The Roberto Revolution:

At the Sales with Bill Oppenheim

OK, maybe not a revolution...but Monday saw some pretty healthy trade on behalf of the Roberto sire line. Silver Hawk led the way, with six colts selling for an average of just a tick over \$300,000. Silver Hawk's been seriously popular with the Europeans for a few years now, culminating in Benny the Dip's win in this year's Epsom Derby, so no huge surprise that five of the six went to Europe--but get this: all five of them were bought by Maktoums. Sheikh Hamdan's Shadwell Estates bought the two most expensive of the five, hip 340, for \$675,000, and hip 203, for \$430,000. Sheikh Mohammed's Darley Stud scooped the other three for another \$600,000 total. Incidentally, I love Seth Hancock's buy of Benny the Dip for Claiborne.

Sheikh Maktoum's Gainsborough Stud has a very 'nearly' horse in Lear Fan's Labeeb, who I thought might have won the Arlington Million this year but unfortunately seems to have gone astray in the head department. Nevertheless, Gainsborough bought two of three Lear Fan colts sold Monday, including hip 285 for \$340,000. The three Lear Fan colts averaged just over \$157,000.

This year sees the first Dynaformers coming after his move to Three Chimneys, and three colts and a filly from that first Three Chimneys crop averaged just under \$219,000 on Monday, including hip 41, a \$310,000 filly to trainer Mike Bell, as agent, and a \$300,000 colt, hip 191, to Gainsborough Stud. In all, there were 13 yearlings by these three stallions sold on Monday, and eight of them were bought by the Maktoum brothers.

The fourth Roberto I want to mention is Red Ransom, who I thought had terrific pedigrees in this sale, these from the first year after he was leading freshman sires. Ben Walden, Jr., certainly got him the mares. Five yearlings by Red Ransom averaged \$156,000 on Monday, with another due to sell on Tuesday. When you consider how good-looking the Red Ransoms have been all along--including the last two years when the pedigrees, uh, left a little to be desired--there will have been plenty of punters ready to bet on him staging a comeback at the racetrack as well as in the sales ring.

All of this enhances the chances the next great sire will pop out of the Roberto line, a possibility that's been tantalizing pedigree buffs as the era of Northern Dancer and Mr. Prospector draws to a close ... unless the next sire of that caliber is already named Sadler's Wells, or A. P. Indy ...

WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES

by Alan Porter

ROYAL INDY (f, 3, A.P. Indy--On to Royalty, by On to Glory)

Just a few weeks ago we commented on Runup the Colors, who became the first Grade I winner for A.P. Indy when taking the GI Alabama S. Runup the Colors' five-race winning streak ended Saturday in the GI Gazelle H., but the race still reflected further glory on A.P. Indy as it was captured by his daughter Royal Indy.

A half-sister to the 1996 Preakness hero Louis Quatorze, Royal Indy became the eighth stakes winner for A.P. Indy, and lest he should be labeled a filly sire, we should note that the group also includes the graded stakes winning colts Pulpit and Accelerator.

Runup the Colors' pedigree was notable for its linebreeding to sisters from the La Trojenne family. The La Troienne influence is still present here, but it is a more distant one. Royal Indy's granddam Royal Ties has La Troienne and her three-parts sister Adargatis 6x3 in her pedigree. So in this case, it would seem that another pattern is the key. Royal Indy's classic winning half brother Louis Quatorze has the three-parts sister and brother Bold Princess and Bold Lad 2x3 in his pedigree. Bold Lad is again a focal point in the pedigree of Royal Indy, but this time his importance resides in the fact that he is a three-quarters genetic relative to A.P. Indy's broodmare sire Secretariat, both being by Bold Ruler out of Princequillo mares, which gives the three-quarters relatives 3x3 in the pedigree. Rarely do we see an ancestor used so cleverly and in distinctly different ways in two successive matings. The cross which produced Secretariat and Bold Lad--by sons of Nasrullah out of daughters of Princequillo--has further reinforcement in A.P. Indy's pedigree. Seattle Slew's broodmare sire Poker is by a son of Princequillo out of a daughter by Nasrullah, and A.P. Indy's third dam is by Sir Gaylord, a half-brother to Secretariat and a grandson of Nasrullah's three-parts brother Royal Charger.

When she is retired to stud, Royal Indy should also be open for some clever matings. Her fourth dam Stavroula is a sister to Nashua, himself broodmare sire of Mr. Prospector and Roberto. Her pedigree lacks the duplication of the great mare Grey Flight, which is so important to her half brother Louis Quatorze, so adding that strain might be of benefit. Of course, she is also bound to be suited by additional strains of La Troienne. So, all in all, she's a very exciting prospect.

PEDIGREE SHORTS

Several times stakes-placed Fortitude (c, 4, Cure the Blues--Outlasting, by Seattle Slew) finally broke through when winning Saturday's GIII Belmont Breeders' Cup H. in a new course record. Like the high-class sprinter American Chance, Fortitude is by Cure the Blues out of a Seattle Slew mare. This is a rather interesting pattern in that Cure the Blues is by a son of Hail to Reason and his granddam is by Bold Ruler. This reverses the cross which produced Seattle Slew's sire Bold Reasoning, who is by a son of Bold Ruler out of a Hail to Reason mare.
