**KEENELAND DAY THREE RESULTS** The session topper at yesterday's third day of Keeneland's September Yearling Sale was hip number 1002, a bay colt by Jolie's Halo--Hop a Jet, by Riva Ridge. Consigned by Paternostro & Herbener, agent, the bay brought a final bid of \$350,000 from Bob and Beverly Lewis. Trainer Bob Baffert, purchasing the colt for the Lewises, said, "He had everything. He looked like a great horse. When he walked in there, he was the horse. It looked like a no-brainer." Baffert added, "He'll go down to the McKathan brothers to be broke and then he'll go to California to race." The highest priced filly of Wednesday's session was hip number 953. The dark bay yearling, by Phone Trick--Fabulous Notion, by Somethingfabulous, was consigned by Fares Farm, Inc. and sold for \$275,000. She is a half sister to GI Test winner Fabulously Fast (Deputy Minister). Dr. John R. S. Fisher purchased the filly for F. Eugene Dixon, Jr. "She'll go back to Pennsylvania and ought to make a nice two-year-old," Fisher said. "I loved everything about her. I particularly loved her pedigree. She's out of a Grade I winner and a half to a Grade I winner and the Phone Trick says she ought to be precocious. She's an attractive individual." During yesterday's session, 292 horses sold for a gross of \$18,292,200, down two percent from last year's corresponding session when 287 horses sold for a total of \$18,675,800. The average sales price decreased by 3.7 percent, from \$65,072 in 1996 to \$62,645 this year. The median price remained constant at \$45,000. Through three days, 797 horses sold for a total of \$97,391,200, up 10.6 percent from the same period last year. The average price increased 13.2 percent from \$107,943 last year to \$122,197 this year. The median price is up 6.1 percent to \$80,000.

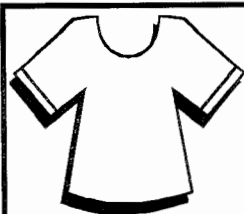

**FASIG-TIPTON, FRANK STRONACH PLAN**

**UNIQUE SALE** Fasig-Tipton and owner/breeder Frank Stronach announced yesterday that they will join forces to hold a unique annual auction of approximately 90 young, quality broodmares in foal to stallions standing at Stronach's Adena Springs Farm. The mares will be offered without reserves or buybacks. The sales will be conducted in what Stronach called a "party atmosphere," following a special dinner at Fasig-Tipton's Lexington, Kentucky venue. The first annual event is set for this November 10, with 94 mares--all under 10 years of age--scheduled to sell. The Adena Springs stallions they are in foal to include Lit de Justice, Demaloot Demashoot, Birdonthewire, Wild Zone, Explosive Red, Friendly Lover, El Prado (Ire) and Lite the Fuse, who stands at Vinery but is owned in part by Adena Springs.

**JOCKEY CLUB RELEASES '96 STATS**

The Jockey Club released its North American breeding statistics yesterday. As of September 9, 5,220 stallions covered 59,719 mares in 1996. These coverings have resulted in 33,448 foals of 1997 being reported to the Jockey Club on Live Foal Reports received as of September 8. The number of stallions decreased by 3.8 percent from 5,427 reported in 1995 at this time. There was a .9 percent decline from the 60,284 mares reported in 1995. Thoroughbred breeding activity in Kentucky outpaced all other regions, with 16,895 mares reported bred in 1996 producing 11,288 live foals. The year before, 16,006 mares were bred, producing 10,652 foals. Florida reported 5,895 mares bred and 3,455 live foals, while California reported 4,919 mares bred and 2,985 live foals.

**NTRA NAMES CHIEF PLANNING OFFICER**

The National Thoroughbred Racing Association (NTRA) announced yesterday the appointment of Hubbard Enterprise's President Mark Wilson as interim Chief Planning Officer. The announcement came on the heels of the appointment of Nick Nicholson to a full-time position as interim Chief Operating Officer of the organization. "Clearly, we've reached the stage where some areas need more than part-time attention," NTRA President D.G. Van Clief, Jr., said. "Nowhere is this truer than in the complex and intensive process of developing the business plan. I can think of no better person to help us through this critical stage than Mark and am grateful to Dee Hubbard and his organization for making him available." Wilson, a Kentucky native, is the former vice president and counsel to Churchill Downs.

**SIBERIAN SUMMER RETIRED**

**Siberian Summer** (Siberian Express--Mia Karina, by Icecapade), winner of the 1993 GI Charles H. Strub S. has been retired from racing and will stand the 1998 breeding season at Capehart and Liebau's Valley Creek Farm in San Diego County, California. "Siberian Summer is a large, attractive horse conformed similarly to In Excess," said Valley Creek General Manager Leigh Ann Howard. "We expect him to become a leading sire in California." The eight-year-old gray has not raced since September 1995 and was purchased from Buckram Oak Farm in August just as the homebred was preparing for a return to the races. Siberian Summer won six of 32 starts for earnings of \$501,615.

## WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES

### PEDIGREE SHORTS

We often mention in this column what has become known as the "zig-zag"--the line which on a pedigree chart is traced through the broodmare sire, his dam, her sire and so on. We wouldn't want to be dogmatic about this, but it seems that the strains on the zig-zag of a sire or dam are sometimes duplicated a disproportionate number of times in their best winners. A case in point would be Chief's Crown (dam by Secretariat out of Somethingroyal). Somethingroyal is duplicated in around 30 percent of his stakes winners, but in only 10 percent of his offspring. We were reminded of this again over the weekend when **Santa Amelia (f, 4, Cozzene--Carry, by Mr. Long)** won the GII C Seaway S. The broodmare sire, Mr. Long, is out of a mare by the English St. Leger winner Chamossiare. This is a name rarely found in U.S. pedigrees, but he does appear as broodmare sire of Cozzene's sire Caro and is therefore 5x5 in the pedigree of Saint Amelia. The year before producing Saint Amelia, Carry produced Natalma S. winner With Care. She is by Caro's son With Approval and therefore also has the Chamossiare double.
