RIVERMAN FILLY TOPS KEENELAND DAY

FOUR Mrs. Elizabeth Moran's Brushwood Stable paid the session-topping price of \$270,000 for a daughter of Riverman--Chain Bracelet (Lyphard) Thursday at the 1997 Keeneland September Yearling Sale. Consigned by Mill Ridge Sales, agent, the dark bay filly is out of the Grade I winning dam of Group stakes-placed Brace Blu (Blushing Groom {Fr}). Dehere, whose first foals are yearlings of 1997, had the two highest priced colts at the session. Consigned by McMillin Brothers, a colt out of SW Fine Dining (State Dinner) brought a final bid of \$260,000 from John Peace. Just four hips later, a colt out of Fond Romance (Fappiano) consigned by Camas Park Stud, agent, was purchased for \$210,000 by Foye Genetics, agent. A total of 307 yearlings sold for an aggregate \$17,301,000 on the fourth day of the 10-day auction, up 8.7 percent from the corresponding session last year when 293 horses grossed \$15,902,100. The average of \$56,355 was up 3.8 percent from the 1996 figure of \$54,273. The median held steady at \$40,000. The sale continues through Wednesday, with bidding to begin at 10 a.m. daily.

Suited by the fast ground and over his ideal distance, Canon Can won for the third time in five starts this term, landing the first stakes win of his career and giving trainer Henry Cecil his seventh Doncaster Cup victory. Outstaying the field, the gelding reversed his seventh-place form of the July 31 Goodwood Cup and broke the course record. Odds-on favorite DOUBLE TRIGGER (IRE) (Ela-Mana-Mou {Ire}) led from the gate, pursued by Canon Can and Persian Punch (Ire), but jockey Kieren Fallon sent Canon Can into the lead at the three-eighths pole and he was always in control from there. "He's a very game horse and that was a great win," said Cecil. "He looked moderate early on in his career, but he has improved over longer distances. He's very tough and loves his racing and he'll stay in training next year." Canon Can now moves on to contest the valuable Cesarewitch H. on "Champions Day" at Newmarket October 18.

In new course record time, Midnight Line followed up her win in the G3 Prestige S. at Goodwood August 22 and gave trainer Henry Cecil his 11th win in this event since 1978. Midnight Line was well back early and appeared to be struggling. At the three-sixteenths pole Flawless (GB) grabbed the lead and went clear, but Midnight Line made gradual progress from the rear to get up at the wire. "She was drawn on the outside and didn't like that," said Cecil. "It wasn't until they straightened that she got into the race. It was a good effort, as she made up a lot of ground and the second is a decent filly." Either the G1 Fillies Mile at Ascot September 29 or the G1 Prix Marcel Boussac at Longchamp October 5 could be next for the winner.

The stewards of the Jockey Club have revised the finishing order of last Friday's (September 5) G1 Haydock Park Sprint Cup following an appeal from trainer Brian Meehan, whose **Tomba (GB)** (Efisio {GB}) originally finished third behind **Royal Applause (GB)** (Waajib {Ire}) and **Danetime (Ire)** (Danehill). Tomba has been promoted to second, with Danetime demoted to third. The latter's rider Michael Kinane had already been suspended for two days for careless riding.

According to yesterday's *Racing Post*, trainer Henry Cecil's **Reams of Verse** (Nureyev), a champion in England at two and winner of this year's G1 Epsom Oaks, and **Yashmak** (Danzig) could both be headed to the U.S. this fall. Reams of Verse makes her next start in the G2 Sun Chariot S. at Newmarket next month, then ships to California for the G1 Yellow Ribbon Invitational at Santa Anita November 2. DEHERE TOPS BOOK 1 'FIRSTERS'

At The Sales with Bill Oppenheim

It's Deputy Minister's year, so it figures that his son Dehere, the 1993 champion two-year-old in North America, would be prominent among 1997 first-year yearling sires. The Ashford Stud stallion has certainly led the way in representation: his 12 summer sale yearlings averaged just over \$170,000, and 14 more in September's Book 1 averaged over \$191,000, leaving him with 26 sold, averaging over \$181,000 by close of business Tuesday. That put him in the lead among the seven first-crop sires with four or more yearlings in Book 1, or seven or more overall, through Tuesday. His old nemesis, Holy Bull, is not far behind, with 15 yearlings to date averaging over \$168,000. Colonial Affair, whose three summer yearlings sold well, had eight average around \$95,000 in Book 1, and he now ranks a clear third, his 11 yearlings thus far averaging over \$117,000. Claiborne's Boundary averaged \$112,000 in Book 1, and ranked fourth through Tuesday, with 14 yearlings averaging over \$93,000. Whatever happens in the rest of the September sale, these four have established themselves as solid commercial horses.

Three other stallions had averaged more than \$60,000 with seven or more yearlings sold through Book 1: Lane's End's Miner's Mark (over \$83,000) and Brocco (over \$71,000), and last year's weanling sire sensation, Twining, whose \$62,000 average through Tuesday was actually below his '96 weanling average.

There aren't any real surprises among this group of seven, though clearly Dehere was able to sustain a high average over a large number sold and Boundary certainly sustained the good impression he's been creating. But four horses who've had just a few yearling sell also deserve a mention. Just two yearlings from Lure's first crop sold in Book 1 and averaged \$480,000; he would have been runaway leader among this group had he had enough foals sell. One who has created a big impression is 1993 Kentucky Derby winner Sea Hero, who had a \$460,000 colt at Saratoga and a \$575,000 colt Tuesday night, and is now averaging over \$237,000 with five yearlings sold. Another Lane's End inmate, he shares the prize with Dehere, really, for creating the biggest impression at the sales. Two others who had a single big yearling in Book 1 were the \$2,500 fee stallion Mi Cielo, who had a \$300,000 colt on Monday; and the top grass stayer Bien Bien, who had a colt bring \$185,000 on Tuesday.
