keeneland continues record pace A colt by Premiership--Malastride, by Victory Stride topped yesterday's next-to-last session of Keeneland's 10-day September Yearling Sale. Selling as hip number 3354, the bay yearling was consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency, agent for Just the Beginning Farm and brought a final bid of \$62,000 from Southern Cypress Stable of Ocala, Florida. Keeneland sold 312 horses during Tuesday's session for a total of \$3,749,100. The average price of \$12,016 was up 2.5 percent from last year's figure of \$11,718 when 249 horses sold for \$2,917,900. With only Wednesday's session remaining, 2,644 horses have been sold for a record \$2,917,900, an average of \$57,713. Keeneland results cont. p. 2

STUD FEE SET FOR ATTICUS Three Chimneys Farm announced yesterday that GISW Atticus (Nureyev), who holds the one-mile world record, will stand for \$20,000 guaranteed live foal, payable September 1. The five-year-old won seven of 18 career starts, including the GI Oaklawan H. and retired in April with earnings of \$1,200,120.

FABRE EXPELS NIARCHOS HORSES In a sensational twist to Sunday's defeat of the Andre Fabre-trained 1-10 favorite Peintre Celebre (Nureyev) in the G2 Prix Niel, the French champion trainer has requested the removal from his Chantilly stable of the four horses he has been training for the Niarchos family. Peintre Celebre's jockey Olivier Peslier complained bitterly after the Prix Niel that jockey Cash Asmussen, riding the Niarchos-owned colt Ithaki (Ire) (Saddler's Wells), had deliberately caused him to lose the race won by the Francois Doumen-trained Rajpoute (Fr) (Double Bed {Fr}). Asmussen is retained by the Niarchos family and Fabre has said that he will not allow the American to ride the horses he trains for them.

JOCKEY DIES AT MASSACHUSETTS FAIR

Jockey Miguel Figueroa died Saturday from injuries suffered in a spill Friday at Great Barrington Fairgrounds in Massachusetts. The 33-year-old Brooklyn native suffered severe head injuries after he was thrown from his mount and trampled by a following horse. Figueroa's death is the second fatality at a Massachusetts fair meeting in two years, following the death of jockey Raymond Garry last August at Northampton Fair.

"Unfortunately, it comes after something like this, but the need for an identification program had been recognized for some time," said Charlie Colgan, NSA executive vice president. "This will place steeplechasing on the same page with the rest of Thoroughbred racing." At St. James, Sundin won the day's second race (a maiden claiming hurdle) while running as Dothebucket. Ineligible for the race, Sundin was disqualified and declared a non-starter. Sundin was subsequently scratched from the day's third race, an open claiming hurdle. WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES

by Alan Porter

LAYDOWN (c, 2, Cryptoclearance--Pushing Fifty, by Forty Niner)

It is said that for every rule, there is an exception. There are really no rules in Thoroughbred breeding, genetic variation ensuring that any attempt at dogma will be rendered foolish, almost certainly sooner than later. There are, however, observable trends, and as a "general rule" inbreeding to a stallion via the male line of the sire and dam gives disappointing results. Once again, though, there are exceptions. For example, the cross of Raise a Native-line sires over Raise a Native-line mares has generally been much less successful than opportunity would have dictated. On the other hand, the cross of sires going back to Raise a Native through Mr. Prospector onto mares going back to Raise a Native through Majestic Prince (and particularly through Majestic Light) has outperformed opportunity by a considerable margin.

The 5 1/2-length victory by Laydown in Saturday's GIII Kentucky Cup Juvenile may be a pointer to another emerging exception. In his first crop, Cryptoclearance sired near champion Strategic Maneuver, a dual Grade I winner who was out of a mare by Conquistador Cielo and therefore inbred 3x3 to Mr. Prospector, grandsire of Cryptoclearance and sire of Conquistador Cielo.

In similar fashion, Laydown also has Mr. Prospector 3x3, this time as grandsire of Cryptoclearance and sire of Laydown's broodmare sire, Forty Niner. Intriguingly, Cryptoclearance and Forty Niner are somewhat related, as Cryptoclearance is out of a mare by Hoist the Flag (by Tom Rolfe), while Forty Niner is out of a mare by Tom Rolfe himself, which means that Tom Rolfe appears 4x4 through a son and a daughter. This means the structure of the pedigree is rather similar to that of Gentlemen, who has Northern Dancer 3x4 in the male line of both sire and dam.

We should be cautious how we interpret the evidence gained from just two horses. Cryptoclearance certainly doesn't depend on Mr. Prospector inbreeding as evidenced by a total of at least 10 individual stakes winners in 1997--but in some ways it would not be surprising if he did continue to show an affinity for Mr. Prospector-line mares. Cryptoclearance is a son of Fappiano, and of the four stakes winners known to us who are inbred to Mr. Prospector through the male line of the sire and the dam, three are by sons of Fappiano. This is in line with a phenomenon noticed by a number of pedigree researchers: the tendency for inbreeding to sires to work particularly well when that inbreeding is

through physically or aptitudinally different individuals. Recent examples include the previously mentioned Raise a Native through Mr. Prospector and Majestic Prince, Northern Dancer through Nijinsky II and various other sons, and Secretariat and various other sons of Bold Ruler. Fappiano had all the speed one associates with Mr. Prospector, but in type he was far more typical of his broodmare sire Dr. Fager, and it will be no surprise if the combination of Fappiano and other sons of Mr. Prospector continues to flourish.

PEDIGREE SHORTS...

Pilsudski (Ire) (h. 5. Polish Precedent--Cocotte {GB}, by Troy {GB}) surged to the forefront of the betting for the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe with an impressive 4 1/2-length victory in the ESAT Digifone Champion Stakes (G1). Pilsudski is by a grandson of Northern Dancer. It is interesting that sons or grandsons of Northern Dancer are responsible for eight of the 14 stakes winners and five of the seven group/graded stakes winners produced by daughters of Troy. Of course, one reason for this is that Northern Dancer is by far the most frequently found male line in Europe. However, just repeating a cross won't make it work if there is no genetic affinity. In this case, the reasons for a genetic affinity are not that mysterious. Northern Dancer is by Nearctic, a son of Nearco out of a Hyperion mare. Troy has two Nearco/Hyperion combinations, one through his sire Petingo and one through his broodmare sire Hornbeam. Petingo has a daughter of Nearco and Hornbeam has a son of Hyperion, so reversing the cross found in Nearctic. In addition, as we have mentioned before, Petingo's sire Petition is a genetic relative to Nearctic. Troy's dam, La Milo, has Nasrullah and his three-parts brother Royal Charger 3x3 in her pedigree. Northern Dancer's granddam, Almahmoud, is by Mahmoud, and he is a three-parts brother to Mumtaz Begum, dam of Nasrullah and granddam of Royal Charger.
