WILL'S WAY INJURED *Will's Way* (Easy Goer), third in the GI Woodward H. at Belmont Park Saturday, suffered what may be a career-ending condylar fracture of his left front leg during the race. The four-year-old was scheduled to undergo surgery at Dr. William Reed's clinic in Elmont, New York yesterday. A decision on the colt's future will be made following surgery. "We want to see how things go first," said trainer Jim Bond. "It will be one day at a time. We've got to weigh everything and figure out what's best. I wouldn't say we're leaning in either direction. We'll do what's best for the horse." Bond discovered the injury Sunday afternoon. "There was a little inflammation," he said. "I didn't like the way it looked. We X-rayed him immediately and I wasn't happy with what I saw." *Will's Way* has won six of his 13 career starts, including the GI Travers at three and the GI Whitney H. this year at four, for earnings of \$956,400.

SPINNING WORLD TO ASHFORD STUD *Spinning World* (Nureyev), winner of the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas in 1996, the G1 Prix du Haras de Fresnay-le-Buffard-Jacques Le Marois in '96 and '97 and the G1 Prix du Moulin de Longchamp this year, will join the stallion roster at Ashford Stud in Versailles, Kentucky for 1998. The four-year-old, highweight at three from seven furlongs to a mile and three-sixteenths in Ireland, finished second in the 1996 GI Breeders' Cup Mile and will make the final start of his career in this year's edition of the race. He has won seven of his 13 career starts and \$1,161,529. His stud fee has not yet been determined.

PULPIT CONTINUES ON COMEBACK COURSE Claiborne Farm's *Pulpit* (A.P. Indy) breezed five furlongs in 1:01 2/5 over the fast main track at Churchill Downs Monday as he gets ready for his first start since finishing fourth in this year's GI Kentucky Derby. "We're very happy with his training," said trainer Frank Brothers. "His breezes are good, he's looking good. He's doing about as good as a horse can do. Hopefully he'll stay that way. If he does, he'll run this fall." Brothers added he would begin looking for a race for the three-year-old after three or four more works. "That's providing he doesn't miss a beat," he added. *Pulpit*, winner of this year's GI Fountain of Youth and GI Toyota Blue Grass S., underwent surgery to remove a chip from his left front knee after the Derby.

K.O. PUNCH, RODEO INJURED IN FUTURITY

The two favorites in the Futurity at Belmont Park will undergo surgery after suffering injuries in Sunday's Grade I event. **K. O. Punch** (Two Punch), runner-up in the Futurity as the 7-2 second choice, came out of the race with a non-displaced condylar fracture of his left front leg and will be operated on today. The surgery will be performed by Dr. Larry Bramlage at Dr. William Reed's clinic. "These things usually take 90 to 120 days, so if we miss October, November and December that will put him back in serious training in January," said trainer D. Wayne Lukas. "We'll be all right." **Rodeo** (Gone West), ninth after setting the pace as the 4-5 favorite in the Futurity, suffered a chip in his knee during the race. The two-year-old will undergo surgery this week, but his prognosis for a return to the races is also very good.

Local News: Calder

Jigadee (Prospectors Gamble) worked five furlongs in :58 4/5 between races at Calder yesterday afternoon. Out between the third and fourth races on the card, the two-year-old was ridden by jockey Robbie Davis, who flew down from New York for the breeze. Trainer Stan Hough was also on hand for the move. "I was very pleased," he said. "I wanted him to go in the afternoon because he has been a little funny when he gets to the stretch in some of his races. I'm not sure whether its something he sees or hears. We now put cotton in his ears when he runs, which we did today." "The cotton in his ears made a big difference," said Davis. "He didn't try a thing. The first part of the work, he wasn't handling the track--it was cupping out. So I just sat with him until he got his feet under him, and then at the half-mile pole I tapped him and he jumped into it. He finished up strong through the lane." Jigadee will make his next start in the \$400,000 In Reality S., the final leg of the Florida Stallion S. to be run October 4 at Calder.

Local News: Virginia

GISW Prenup (Smarten), who stood his first season at stud at Vinery in Midway, Kentucky last year, has been relocated to Blue Ridge Farm in Upperville, Virginia. The six-year-old, winner of the GI Jerome H., will stand as the property of a syndicate for \$2,500, live foal.

**Midwest Report cont.****Local News: Fair Grounds**

The Fair Grounds Racing Hall of Fame Selection Committee has announced the inductees for 1998. Taylor's Special, a winner of 21 races including the 1984 Louisiana Derby and Blue Grass S., owner/breeder Jack Lohman, jockey Johnny Heckman, owner J.R. Straus, and Lexington, the great sire who participated in match races with Lecomte in New Orleans in the 1850s, will be honored at the Hall of Fame Banquet and Induction Ceremony at the Fair Grounds Sat., March 14, 1998.

Local News: Prairie Meadows

The Iowa Racing and Gaming Commission has ratified a new operating agreement between the Racing Association of Central Iowa and Polk County officials which assures the continued growth of horse racing at Prairie Meadows through 2002. The new pact between RACI, which holds the racing and casino licenses, and the county, which owns the land and the buildings, will yield Polk County \$140 million over five years, provide \$37.5 million to charity and nearly double purses at the track to \$19.9 million by 2002. The agreement, reached after an 18-hour session which ended at 2:30 a.m. Saturday morning, requires RACI to expand its nine-member board to 13, in order to include more representation of community interests. Horse owners are being asked to drop legislation which would raise purses even higher. The county will in turn surrender its right to approve the track's annual budget and will get no more than \$140 million if the profit rises above projections. Negotiations with horsemen will begin immediately regarding the racing schedule for the next five years.

◆ FOREIGN ◆

Local News: Panama

Equus Gaming Company L.P., a publicly traded partnership with horse racing and gaming interests in the Caribbean, yesterday announced its subsidiary Equus Gaming Panama S.A. has signed a 20-year contract with the Panamanian government to run Presidente Remon Race Track in Panama City and to develop an off-track betting agency network in Panama. The contract grants Equus Panama the exclusive rights to simulcast races to and from the country and to operate up to 500 slot machines at the track. The company has paid \$2.2 million to the Panamanian government to fund severance benefits to existing employees before it takes control January 1, 1998. The track is scheduled to be closed for the month of January for renovations, with racing to resume in February.

Local News: England

This Saturday's G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. at Ascot promises to be a competitive affair with three of England's top three-year-olds set to tackle each other. **Entrepreneur (GB)** (Sadler's Wells), this year's G1 English 2000 Guineas winner, is set to take on both **Revoque (Ire)** (Fairy King), runner-up in the 2000 Guineas, and **Bahhare** (Woodman), one of last year's top-rated two-year-olds after winning all three starts. Entrepreneur will be returning to the racecourse for the first time since finishing a disappointing fourth when favorite for this year's Epsom Derby June 7. Revoque, last season's highweighted two-year-old in France and England, will be making his second start since disappointing when favorite for the Irish 2000 Guineas May 25. Bahhare, who has been out most of the season with an injury, made his first start in a year when second to Revoque in a conditions event at Doncaster September 12.

WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES

TOMISUE'S DELIGHT (f, 3, A. P. Indy--Prospectors Delite, by Mr. Prospector)

The spectacular progress of A. P. Indy continued this weekend when Tomisue's Delight defeated her elders in the GI Ruffian H. at Belmont Park. A. P. Indy has now sired nine stakes winners, five graded stakes winners and three Grade I winners from his first crop.

Remarkably, all five of A. P. Indy's U.S. graded-stakes winners have pedigrees which feature inbreeding or linebreeding to siblings or to three-quarters genetic relatives within the first six generations. Tomisue's Delight--who had previously been multiple Grade I placed, including a third to her three-parts sister Runup The Colors in the GI Alabama S. at Saratoga August 16--owns the most common formula, a collection of relatives from the La Troienne family.

A. P. Indy is a son of Seattle Slew, and Seattle's Slew's dam, My Charmer, has the sisters Striking and Busher 3x3 in her pedigree. A. P. Indy's second dam is by Buckpasser and, in turn, he is out of Busanda, a three-parts sister to Striking and Busher. In tail female line, Tomisue's Delight goes back to So Chic (Nasrullah--Striking), a sister to Glamour, the dam of Seattle Slew's broodmare sire, Poker. So Tomisue's Delight has Glamour and So Chic 5x5 and Striking/Busanda 6x6x5x6.

Of course, Runup The Colors is a variation on the same theme, with So Chic a generation closer up. A. P. Indy's son, Accelerator is bred on very similar lines to Tomisue's Delight, as his dam is also a Mr. Prospector mare, and is a great-great-granddaughter of Glamour. He has even more La Troienne, as his second dam is a daughter of Buckpasser. A. P. Indy's other graded stakes-winning son, Pulpit, is free of La Troienne on his distaff side, but his pedigree reveals Round Table and his sister Monarchy 5x4. Finally, Royal Indy, who was featured here a couple of weeks ago, has the three-quarters genetic relatives Secretariat and Bold Lad 3x3.

If we stretch the envelope a little to include Japanese Grade 3 winner Hishi Nile, we can note that A. P. Indy's dam is inbred to Somethingroyal (by Princequillo), while Hishi Nile's distaff side supplies Honeyway, whose dam, Honey Buzzard, is a three-quarters genetic relative to Cosquilla, the dam of Princequillo.

A. P. Indy's remaining unrestricted stakes winners are P. T. Indy and Parade Queen. This pair don't have sibling or three-quarter relationships, although their pedigrees are still interesting. Both have Nijinsky II (as does Pulpit) and since A. P. Indy has Tom Fool, this gives us the famous Tom Fool/Flaming Page combination. In addition, P. T. Indy's third dam, Shoshanna, is by a son of Nasrullah out of a Princequillo mare, as is A. P. Indy's broodmare sire, Secretariat. Parade Queen, meanwhile, also has three crosses of Somethingroyal, one through Secretariat and two through Sir Gaylord, although this pair are merely five-eighths related.

Of course, A. P. Indy was an outstanding racehorse and he possesses a superb pedigree. What's more, any sire whose pedigree gives him a predilection for such as Mr. Prospector (yes, Seattle Slew and Mr. Prospector contain three-quarters relatives), Nijinsky II, Nasrullah/Princequillo and La Troienne will frequently get the right strains just by accident. Still, we can't help but feel some clever planning has been at work behind at least some of these matings.

PEDIGREE SHORTS

The power of the pattern to upgrade was again illustrated by the victory of **Crystal Hearted (GB) (c, 3, Broken Hearted {Ire}--Crystal Fountain {GB}, by Great Nephew {GB})** in Sunday's G2 Flughafen Frankfurt Trophy. Crystal Hearted, who is also a group winner in England this year, is the best son by his sire, Broken Hearted, who in turn is the best horse by his own sire, Dara Monarch. Dara Monarch, a shock winner of the Irish 2,000 Guineas, had a pedigree which in the fourth generation featured the great stayer Alycidon (by Donatello II out of Aurora) and Queen of Light (by Alycidon's half-brother Borealis out of a mare by Donatello II). When we come to the pedigree of Crystal Hearted himself, we find that he has the mare Crystal Palace 4x2. Crystal Palace just happens to be out of Queen of Light, so Crystal Hearted has the genetic relatives Alycidon and Queen of Light 5x5x3.

Call it coincidence or call it synchronicity, but two rather similar pedigrees captured Group/Grade One races for two-year-olds over the weekend. In Sunday's GI Futurity at Belmont, **Grand Slam (c, 2, Gone West--Bright Candles, by El Gran Senor)** slam-dunked the rest of the field, while in France 24 hours earlier **Xaar (GB) (c, 2, Zafonic--Monroe, by Sir Ivor)** treated his field with similar disdain in the Prix de la Salamandre. The connection? Grand Slam is by Gone West out of a mare by El Gran Senor; Xaar is by a son of Gone West out of a half sister to the dam of El Gran Senor. Both pedigrees have Northern Dancer in the mix, too.


Florida-based freshman sire Line in the Sand was represented by his first stakes winner when **Danielle's Gray (c, 2, Line in the Sand--My Neffer, by Jig Time)** won Saturday's Foolish Pleasure S. at Calder. Danielle's Gray is the product of a clever pedigree, as her broodmare sire Jig Time is a three-quarters genetic relative to Raise a Native, grandsire of Line in the Sand. Danielle's Gray also has the brother and sister Nasrullah and Malindi 5x4.
