FREE HOUSE FAVORED IN SUPER

DERBY Making his first start since running third in the GI Buick Haskell Invitational at Monmouth Park August 3, California invader **Free House** (Smokester) has been made the 9-5 morning-line favorite for Sunday's GI Super Derby XVIII at Louisiana Downs. The grey, third in both the GI Kentucky Derby and GI Belmont S. and second by a head in the GI Preakness, arrived in Louisiana Thursday. "The flight went good," said trainer Paco Gonzalez. "Free House has traveled to many tracks and he's used to it. He gets a little nervous, but that's to be expected." As for future plans, the conditioner said, "He isn't Breeders' Cup eligible, so if the owners want to run him (in the Classic) they have to put up \$800,000. They will see how he runs here; they haven't ruled it out. He could also run next in the Cal Cup (at Santa Anita October 25). We have to see how he runs in this one." The colt drew post position #3 for the Super Derby. The second choice at 5-2, GI Travers hero **Deputy Commander** (Deputy Minister) breaks from post position #6 in the six-horse field. He worked three furlongs in :37 3/5 yesterday. "It was exactly what we wanted," said Aimee Dollase, the assistant and daughter of trainer Wally Dollase. "It was just enough to stretch his legs and take the edge off. He was striding really good, switched leads on time and did everything perfect." (Complete Super Derby field, p3)

SUFFOLK DOWNS OPENS TODAY Live racing returns to Massachusetts today as Suffolk Downs opens its 1997 Autumn Meet. The 55-day season features 12 stakes worth more than \$300,000. All the stakes will be worth \$25,000, with six added-money events for Massachusetts-breds. The highlights of the state-bred schedule will be the Massachusetts Oaks October 11 and Massachusetts Derby October 25. Located in East Boston, Suffolk Downs will race five days a week, with post time at 12:45 p.m. daily. Tuesdays and Thursdays offer simulcasting only. All paid admissions will receive a free \$2 bet opening day, and visitors to the track this Saturday and Sunday will get passes good for free admission throughout September and October. "We closed on a positive note in June with a successful MassCap," said Executive Vice President of Racing Lou Raffetto Jr. "We're anticipating a good fall with plenty of grass racing. We hope to give our fans some good, competitive racing." Opening day also marks the launch of the Suffolk Downs website at www.suffolkdowns.com. The Autumn Meet ends December 14.

ILLINOIS RACING REALIGNED FOR '98 With Arlington International Racecourse out of the picture, a completely different Chicago racing circuit came into focus Friday when the Illinois Racing Board awarded the 1998 Thoroughbred and harness dates. Sportsman's Park and Hawthorne Race Course carved up the Thoroughbred schedule, with Sportsman's opening the season March 1 and racing six days weekly through June 30. Hawthorne will offer live racing from July 1 through November 28, also presenting six programs per week. Both tracks have given up their harness meets for 1998, with Balmoral Park and Maywood as the beneficiaries. Those two tracks will race January 1 through December 31, with Balmoral running four nights weekly and Maywood running the other three. The proposal for the 1998 Thoroughbred schedule, which starts one week later and ends one month earlier than the 1997 model, was made by Ed Duffy, chief operating officer at Sportsman's, and was based on an agreement reached between the four tracks, the Illinois Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association and the Illinois Harness Horsemen's Association. "We wanted to do two things in creating the schedule," said Duffy. "First, keep it simple, and secondly, find a way to raise purses. With the announcement of the closing of Arlington came the perception that something going on here in Illinois was very bad. This sends a message to the rest of the country and changes the perception that Illinois is in trouble." Primarily because of simulcasting opportunities created by the realignment, Duffy projected an increase of daily overnight purses on the Chicago circuit from the current average of \$138,000 to \$200,000. With the future of Arlington International still up in the air, the situation could, however, be very different at next year's dates hearing. "There's no doubt in anyone's mind that this is a one-year schedule. It's nothing more or less than that," said Board Chairman Gene Lamb.

CLASS O LAD EUTHANIZED Class O Lad (Ormonte), the last of 10 victims of Kentucky's sponging incidents, was humanely destroyed Wednesday night due to severe colic. The six-year-old, eased as the favorite in a Churchill Downs claiming race June 14, was found to have sponges lodged in both nostrils and developed laminitis in both front feet the next day. His plight touched the hearts of horsemen across the country, most notably that of Mary Lowry, who adopted the gelding in early July and cared for him at her Flying Cross Farm in Goshen, Kentucky. Unfortunately, medication to treat Class O Lad's laminitis may have also caused the ulcers which brought on the fatal bout of colic. The introduction of strict pre-race examinations in Kentucky since Class O Lad's case has not uncovered any more "sponged" horses.

QUEEN'S PLATE FINISH TO STAND According to the *Daily Racing Form*, the Ontario Racing Commission has dismissed the appeal of William Sorokolit Jr. regarding the finish of this year's Queen's Plate. Sorokolit's **Cryptocloser** (Cryptoclearance) finished second in the GIC Queen's Plate at Woodbine June 29; the owner argued that the winner, Frank Stronach's **Awesome Again** (Deputy Minister), should be disqualified because stablemate **Cowboy Cop** (Silver Deputy), also owned by Stronach, interfered with Cryptocloser during the running of the race. The ORC determined that the interference in question "resulted from a combination of events and not from one single factor...We, like the stewards, are unable to attribute a sufficient degree of blame to the actions of (jockey Robert) Landry on Cowboy Cop or for that matter to any other rider which would prompt us to conclude that there was sufficient interference to warrant intervention," the *Form* reported. The ORC also cited Rule 11:15, which reads, "Where a horse of one ownership or interest is coupled with a horse or horses of the same or another ownership or interest, the disqualification of one will not necessarily affect the placing of the other" in dismissing the case.

JOCKEY CLUB RETIRES REMOTE SYSTEM The Jockey Club has announced that *Jockey Club Interactive* will become the sole electronic means by which owners and breeders can submit Registration requirements effective mid-October. The old Remote Name Claiming, Live Foal and Report of Mares Bred software will be taken out of service. *Jockey Club Interactive* is available free on the Internet; computer users can access the website at www.jockeyclub.com. Casey Tibbs (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), runner-up in the GI Secretariat S. August 24 in his American debut, has been sold by Irish-based partners Michael Watt and Susan Magnier to U.S.-based partners Al Ferris and New Phoenix Stables in a deal negotiated jointly by Newmarket International and trainer John Kimmel.
