SADLER'S WELLS COLT TOPS TATTERSALLS

OPENER At yesterday's first session of the Tattersalls Houghton Yearling Sales in Newmarket, England, 83 horses sold for a total of \$13,012,030 and an average of \$156,771. At last year's corresponding session, 57 horses sold for a total of \$11,617,199. This year's average price fell 23.1 percent from last year's figure of \$203,810. Yesterday's top price was paid for hip number 24, a bay colt by Sadler's Wells--Guess Again (Ger) (Stradavinsky). Consigned by Ted Voute, agent, the yearling brought a final bid of \$516,913 from B.B.A. (UK) Ltd. The colt is a half brother to G1SW Eva Luna (Ire) (Double Schwartz). The co-second highest priced colt was hip number 79--the first yearling by Sunday Silence to be sold outside of Japan. Consigned by Camas Park Stud, the bay colt brought a final bid of \$466,889 from Guy Armengel. Tattersalls results p. 2

Embassy (GB), whose dam Pass the Peace won this event in 1988, was victorious in her first two career starts--a maiden at Newmarket July 10 and the G3 Princess Margaret S. at Ascot July 26--before finishing second in the G2 Stakis Casinos Lowther S. at York in her most recent effort August 21. She travelled fifth in the early going here, behind pacesetters SHMOOSE (IRE) (Caerleon) and HEEREMANDI (IRE) (Royal Academy). At the quarter mile pole, a gap opened between this pair and Embassy was through it and gone in a few strides, quickening brilliantly to score with ease. Crazee Mental finished strongly to be second, while the 11/8 favorite CAPE VERDI (IRE) (Caerleon), racing for the first time in Sheikh Maktoum al Maktoum's colors after her purchase from Robert Sangster, found nothing extra in the closing stages. Winning trainer David Loder said of Embassy, "She has tremendous acceleration that can kill off the opposition. I have reservations about her staying the mile (in the 1998 Guineas) as she has speed in her pedigree. She'll start off next season in the Nell Gwyn S. here to see if she gets seven furlongs." Embassy's jockey Kieran Fallon has no such reservations about the filly's stamina. "I would think she would have no problem staying the mile next year as she is so laid back in her races," he said. Cape Verdi, who had edged out Embassy in the G2 Lowther S. August 20, disappointed her trainer Peter Chapple-Hyam, who said, "I thought she would win, but I think a mile is the shortest distance for her these days and she also wants faster ground. But I wouldn't worry too much about this run. She'll be back here in the winner's circle next year."

FASIG-TIPTON FALL SALES RESULTS During Monday's opening session of Fasig-Tipton's two-day Eastern Fall Yearlings Sale in Timonium, Maryland, a total of 222 yearlings sold for \$3,544,900, for an average price of \$15,968. The highest price of the Monday sale was \$120,000 paid for hip number 261, a colt by Fly So Free from the consignment of Walnut Green, agent. Signing the ticket was Baden P. "Buzz" Chace, as agent. The sale concluded yesterday with 318 yearlings cataloged. Complete results of the sale will appear in Thursday's TDN.

FAIRPLEX CONCLUDES '97 SEASON Fairplex Park in Pomona, California concluded its 18-day meet Sunday. "We had a successful race meet," said Fairplex Vice President of Racing Neil O'Dwyer, "One of the goals of the California Horse Racing Board is full fields of eight or more runners as an average per race, and we more than met that. We're very pleased we were able to run 10 Thoroughbred races a day and still maintain that average." A total of 232,906 patrons attended the races at Fairplex and its simulcast sites, a decrease of 19 percent from last year's 287,502. On-track attendance was 79,210, down two percent from 1996. Average daily attendance was 12,939, while average daily mutuel handle was \$5,195,991. Of the total handle of \$93,527,847, \$15,701,669 was wagered ontrack at Fairplex, an increase of nine percent from 1996's \$14,454,862. The leading jockey, for the second straight year, was Victor Espinoza with 24 wins.

WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES by Alan Porter

AIR EXPRESS (c, 3, Sales--Ibitsamm, by Caucasus)

Some time ago, in a pair of articles in *Owner* • *Breeder*, Roger Lyons demonstrated that when it comes to inbreeding to Nijinsky II through male strains, some sons are more equal than others. In fact, a comparison between a group of stakes winners and a representative sample group reveals that random inbreeding to Northern Dancer conferred no benefit at all, and was found just as often in the sample group as the stakes winners.

This story is somewhat different where Nijinsky Il-Northern Dancer's greatest racing son--is involved, and to date Nijinsky II appears in somewhere approaching 50% of the stakes winners inbred to Northern Dancer. We had three more examples of the phenomenon during last weekend's festival of racing at Ascot.

The most notable of these is Air Express, who defeated a top-class field to take Saturday's G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. Air Express is a son of Salse, who in turn is by Northern Dancer's sprinting son Topsider. Air Express's dam Ibitsamm is by Nijinsky II's son Caucasus and is out of a granddaughter of the great mare Gallorette.

The notable inbreeding in Air Express's pedigree doesn't end with Northern Dancer. Salse is out of a mare by Prince John, while Caucasus is out of Quill, and both Prince John and Quill are by Princequillo out of Count Fleet mares. So, not only does Air Express have Northern Dancer 3x4, but he also has the three-quarters related Prince John and Quill 3x3. This means Salse and Caucasus are themselves fairly closely related.

In some respects this pattern is similar to that of Gentlemen. Gentlemen is by Nureyev's son Robin des Bois (Nureyev is a Northern Dancer son from the immediate family of Topsider) out of a mare by Loose Cannon, a son of Nijinsky II. He has Graustark 4x4 in the same positions in which Princequillo appears in Air Express, again making the sire and broodmare sire somewhat related. These patterns once again suggest that inbreeding works best when it is supported by other strains which create genetic relationships.

Remarkably, the pattern of Northern Dancer through Nijinsky II and another son was also found in the winners of the two major two-year-old contests at Ascot. These are Glorosia (Fr) (f, 2, Bering {GB}--Golden Sea {Fr}, by Saint Cyrien {Fr}) and Teapot Row (Ire) (c, 2, Generous {Ire}--Secrage, by Secreto), who took the G1 Fillies Mile and G2 GTech Royal Lodge S. respectively.

Glorosia has Northern Dancer 4x5 through Lyphard (broodmare sire of Bering) and through Nijinsky II (sire of Green Dancer, in turn sire of Glorosia's granddam, Green City). In this case, the Northern Dancer strains are combined with French Derby winner Le Fabuleux, as he is broodmare sire of both Beaune (dam of Bering) and of Green City. The pedigree also has three crosses of Northern Dancer's granddam Almahmoud, as Bering's sire, Arctic Tern, is also out of a daughter of that mare.

Teapot Row is by Generous, a son of Caerleon (by Nijinsky II), and is out of a mare by Northern Dancer's son Secreto, who is becoming a very useful broodmare sire. Both Caerleon and Secreto have Royal Charger and Princequillo combined in the distaff side, and in fact Secreto also has a cross of Royal Charger's three-parts brother Nasrullah.

In closing, we should also note last weekend's Cup and Saucer S. (GIC) winner Gudai Might (c, 2, Seattle Dancer--Tintaburra, by Bold Agent). He has Northern Dancer 3x3 through Nijinsky II and a daughter.

PEDIGREE SHORTS...

Saturday's GI Vosburgh S. was expected to provide a first Grade I triumph for Tale of the Cat, but instead the race went to a horse of somewhat more humble origins in the shape of the hard-working Canadian Victor Cooley (g, 4, Cool Victor-Willow Flight, by Lend Lease). Although his pedigree is not as fashionable as Tale of the Cat's, Victor Cooley's background is still an interesting one. His sire, Cool Victor, is out of a granddaughter of Flaring Top (also the granddam of Nijinsky II). Flaring Top is by Menow out of a mare by a grandson of Sir Gallahad III. Victor Cooley also has a double of Tom Fool (through his sons Tim Tam and Buckpasser) and, of course, Tom Fool is by Menow out of a mare by Sir Gallahad III's brother Bull Dog.

Lost Code has been quietly having a very good season, and he was represented by a weekend graded stakes winner in the shape of Renewed (c, 3, Lost Code--Nifty, by Roberto). Renewed, who captured the GIII Lawrence Realization H. at Belmont, is bred on a reverse cross to this year's Epsom Derby winner Benny the Dip. Benny the Dip is by a son of Roberto out of a mare by Ack Ack (out of a Turn-to mare), which gives him Turn-to in the male line and on the zig-zag. Lost Code's dam is by Ack Ack, so Renewed has Turn-to on the zig-zag of the sire and in the male line of the mare.
