BREEDERS' CUP Despite a disappointing fourthand-last place showing in the GII Buick Pegasus H. at the Meadowlands September 20, trainer David Hofmans said vesterday he will send star three-yearold Touch Gold (Deputy Minister) to the Breeders' Cup Classic, Hofmans will not, however, give the colt another race before the big event. "He had a horrible trip in the Pegasus, but I don't think he needs another race in him," he said. "He runs better fresh, so we're going to the Classic on works alone. He came out of the race very well. We pulled the patch off his foot and put on another one." Behrens (Pleasant Colony), winner of the Pegasus, is also expected to make his next start in the Classic at Hollywood Park November 8. The colt worked five furlongs in an easy 1:07 over Saratoga's Oklahoma training track Friday morning. "It was just a nice, light breeze for him," said trainer Jim Bond. "All I want to do is keep him happy. That's why he's staying up here in Saratoga where it is nice and quiet...I'll keep him here until a few days before the Breeders' Cup. I nominated to him to the Jockey Club Gold Cup (Oct. 18) just to cover my bases, but I think we will go right to the Breeders' Cup Classic."

(Smokester), sixth and last as the favorite in the GI Super Derby at Louisiana Downs September 28, has been turned out and will take the rest of the season off before getting ready for the Strub Series at Santa Anita this winter. "They wanted to give him a break," said trainer Paco Gonzalez. "He bled a little through the Lasix in the Super Derby, so he needs some time off. We'll get him back in training by the end of the month."

The first four from last year's race--Helissio (Fr) (Fairy King), Pilsudski (Ire) (Polish Precedent), Oscar Schindler (Ire) (Royal Academy) and Swain (Ire) (Nashwan)--renew their rivalry. Swain was also the subject of an injury scare yesterday, Simon Crisford, Godolphin's racing manager, said: "He came back from exercise with a bruised heel. He is slightly sensitive to it, but we do not expect it to be a problem. We do not anticipate that it will blow up but we will monitor it overnight. He has never been in better health and in better form, though." Peintre Celebre (Nurevev) took the Prix du Jockey Club (French Derby) at Chantilly June 1 and the G1 Grand Prix de Paris here June 22, but then suffered a surprise defeat in the G2 Prix Niel here September 14. My Emma (GB) (Marju {Ire}) won the G1 Yorkshire Oaks August 20, but is reported to have suffered a setback in training.
