HANSEL TO QUESTROYAL STUD Champion Three-Year-Old Hansel (Woodman) is moving from Gainsborough Farm in Versailles, Kentucky to Questroyal Farm in Hudson, New York. From three crops to race, the nine-year-old stallion has sired stakes winners Prince of Thieves, Mufattish, C. C. on Ice and recent G1 Prix Marcel Boussac winner Loving Claim. Hansel won the 1991 Belmont and Preakness S., as well as the GII Jim Beam S. and 1990 GII Arlington-Washington Futurity. He won seven races in 14 starts for earnings of \$2,936,586.

BARATHEA FILLY TOPS GOFFS SECOND DAY

Two seven-figure yearlings highlighted the second day of the Goffs Orby Select Yearling Sale in Kildare, Ireland yesterday. Topping the session was a filly by first season sire Barathea (Ire) out of the Ela-Mana-Mou (Ire) mare Welsh Love. The yearling, consigned by Kilcarn Stud, is a half sister to the current Epsom Derby favorite Second Empire (Ire) (Fairy King). Michael Tabor owns that colt, but he was runner-up in the competition to secure his half sister who fell to the bid of John Ferguson at \$1,452,599. The bid was the highest price paid in the world this year for a yearling filly and the secondhighest price ever in Europe. Darley Stud Management, in the shape of Anthony Stroud, then bid \$1,376,147 for a colt by Nashwan--Whakilyric, by Miswaki. Consigned by Camas Park Stud, the yearling is a half brother to Grade 1 winners Hernando (Fr) (Ninisky) and Johann Quatz (Fr) (Sadler's Wells). At the two-day sale, 362 horses sold for a total of \$38,308,869, an average of \$105,826 and a median of \$58,104. The aggregate marked an increase of 20.3 percent from last year's figure, while the average improved by 12.4 percent and the median rose 8.6 percent. Goffs Managing Director Philip Myerscough said, "We honored our commitment to restricting numbers at the sale and this has paid dividends. We are grateful for the support we received from our vendors and trade has been consistently strong throughout the sale." An additional 250 yearlings will sell today, all of whom are eligible for the Goffs £100,000 Challenge next June. Goffs results p. 2

PURSE RAISE FOR TRIPLE CROWN Pimlico Racecourse, Belmont Park and Churchill Downs announced vesterday that the total purse money for the Visa Triple Crown Challenge has been raised to \$3 million guaranteed. Purses for the Preakness and Belmont S., the final two jewels in the Triple Crown, will each be increased by \$500,000 to \$1 million guaranteed. Churchill Downs raised the purse of the Kentucky Derby to \$1 million guaranteed for the 1996 running. On top of the \$3 million in guaranteed purses for the three-race series, the Visa Triple Crown Challenge offers an additional bonus of \$5 million to the owner of any horse that wins all three contests. This marks Visa's third year of participation in the series. "We believe this year's Triple Crown generated a new enthusiasm for Thoroughbred racing in America," said Joseph A. DeFrancis, President and Chief Executive Officer of the Maryland Jockey Club. "It is our pleasure to join with Churchill Downs and the New York Racing Association as we provide this new impetus to our most important classic races."

KRIS S. MARE TOPS OBS OPEN SESSION The

first open session of the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's 1997 Fall Mixed Sale in Ocala, Florida, registered substantial increases over last year's corresponding session. A total of 191 horses grossed \$1,051,200, averaging \$5,504 with a median price of \$3,500. The average was up 51 percent from 1996's figure of 3,657, while the median rose 52 percent from \$2,300 a year ago. Topping the session was hip number 751, Sweet Kris (Kris S.), a 10-year-old mare consigned by Four Horsemen's Ranch and sold for \$35,000 to Ocala Stud. Sweet Kris was sold in foal to Montreal Red. The day's high-priced weanlings were a colt and filly from the first crop of Hazaam, selling back-to-back near the end of the session. Lucas Farm bought both, a colt, hip number 785, for \$30,000 and a filly, hip number 784, for \$25,000. Silverleaf Farms, agent, sold both weanlings. The OBS Fall Mixed Sale concludes Thursday when the second open session commences at 10:30 a.m.

DIZNEY NAMED TOBA OWNER OF THE

MONTH The Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders' Association and Gainsborough Farm have named ownerbreeder Donald Dizney their September Owner of the Month. Dizney, owner of Double Diamond Farm near Ocala, Florida, chalked up three stakes victories in September. His Anet (Clever Trick) won the GII Del Mar Derby, Omi (Wild Again) won the GI Matron at Arlington and Semoran (Phone Trick) won the GII Kentucky Cup Classic H. "We're absolutely blessed to have the kind of year we're having," said Dizney. "It's just unbelievable to have the opportunity to win three stakes like this." NYRA '98 STAKES DATES ANNOUNCED The New York Racing Association announced the 1998 Aqueduct winter and spring meeting stakes schedule and set the dates for a number of other major stakes throughout the coming year. A total of 37 stakes worth \$3,635,000 will be offered during the Aqueduct meeting which runs from January 1 through May 10. In all, eight stakes received boosts in purses while one purse was decreased and four stakes were eliminated from the schedule. The May 2 GII Withers will now be worth \$150,000 and the May 3 GI Carter H. has been boosted to \$200,000. The Gotham S. has been reduced from \$50,000 to \$150,000, but will be run three weeks before the Wood Memorial on March 21, as opposed to the two week spacing in recent years. The Assault, Berlo, Sporting Plate and Woodhaven stakes have been eliminated from the schedule. The highlight of the Aqueduct meeting will be the April 11 GII \$500,000 Wood Memorial. The GI Alabama and GI Travers S. will maintain their traditional placing in the Saratoga stakes schedule next year, running August 22 and 29, respectively. Super Stakes Weekend will be held September 19 and 20 with Breeders' Cup Preview Weekend slated for October 10 and 11--four weeks before the November 7 Breeders' Cup, Belmont Park hosts both weekends.

NEW SALES PAVILION FOR KEENELAND

Keeneland is set to undergo a series of building renovations and projects, most notably the construction of a new sales pavilion, the track's board of directors announced today. The projects include conversion of the present sales pavilion into a simulcast facility, construction of a new sales pavilion adjacent to the new barn area, refurbishing of the west section of the grandstand, and renovation and relandscaping the grounds and open space near the grandstand. The new sales pavilion will be an expanded and improved version of the present facility, measuring 73,000 square feet and containing a repository and review area for veterinarians, a covered holding area for pre-sale inspection of horses, a larger area for van companies and services, and expanded dining and bar space. Track officials estimate the plan will take three to five years to complete and will cost between \$30 to \$35 million.


