ARLINGTON INTERNATIONAL CLOSES

Many feel that, after next year's hiatus, Arlington International Racecourse will be back in action for 1999. But if Chairman Dick Duchossois is true to his word, and the state of the Illinois racing industry does not improve, it is possible that the state-of-the-art track which rose from the ashes of a 1985 fire has run its last race. Fresh from his stunning sweep of the Triple Crown, Secretariat tore up the track taking the Arlington Invitational S. in 1973; the gritty John Henry held The Bart at bay by the barest of noses in the inaugural Arlington Million in 1981; the great Cigar captured the 16th and final race in his historic streak in the Arlington Citation Challenge in 1996. But the 1997 Arlington meet ended as first-time starter Kark's Ark (Defensive Play), owned and bred by Emil Kark, trained by Alex Hassinger Jr. and ridden by Mark Guidry, won the 10th and final race, a state-bred maiden special weight event, on yesterday's card. Commenting on the closing, Chicago Daily Herald turf writer Ray Hallett said, "I never thought I would see today. I thought the track would go on forever. I'm heartbroken...I feel like I've lost a member of my family. I understand the decision, but that doesn't lessen the hurt and I hope that one day in the future the track will be back. I'll keep my head up by remembering only the good memories that the last 23 years have brought. I might also make one last bet." Added John McEvoy of the Daily Racing Form, "Arlington's closing is not, of course, `the end of civilization as we know it,' but it's too damn close for me."

ENTREPRENEUR TO STUD Entrepreneur (GB)

(Sadler's Wells), winner of the 1997 English 2000 Guineas, has been retired and will join his sire on the stallion roster at Coolmore Stud in County Tipperary, Ireland. Purchased for a co-sales topping 600,000 guineas (\$936,000) at the 1995 Tattersalls Houghton Sale, the colt went on to win three of his six career starts, including the 2000 Guineas; he was subsequently fourth in the G1 Epsom Derby and, in his last start, seventh in the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. at Ascot September 27. His career earnings came to \$307,930. "Unfortunately, we weren't able to get Entrepreneur back to his best after his setback in the Derby," said trainer Michael Stoute. "I have no doubt, though, that he was an exceptionally good colt. From the first time we worked him as a two-year-old, he exuded class and he excited me like very few others have done."

The New York State Racing and Wagering Board has proposed a new rule which would limit a jockey to using the whip on a horse's shoulders or hindquarters, and only when that horse is responding and has a chance to win. Using the whip before or after a race, unless to guide the horse, would be prohibited and any jockey raising welts or breaking the horse's skin would be subject to punishment. The rule is based on one already in effect in California.

Stablemate Exotic Wood (Rahy), who came back after a 3 1/2month layoff to take a Santa Anita allowance race going six furlongs October 8, will point for the Breeders' Cup Sprint. "The only thing we're worried about is that she might not get in," said Ellis. "I would have to think she's going to be invited, though."
