ALL SYSTEMS "GOLD" FOR CLASSIC Getting ready for the GI Breeders' Cup Classic November 8, top three-year-old Touch Gold (Deputy Minister) drilled seven furlongs in 1:24 at Hollywood Park yesterday morning, prompting jockey Chris McCarron to say, "He's ready for the big race. He really seems to be on his game. I had a big smile on my face when we hit the wire, knowing that he's himself again." The bay, a disappointing fourth and last in the GII Buick Pegasus H. at the Meadowlands September 20, cruised through fractions of :24 1/5, :47 4/5 and fiveeighths in :59 2/5. He finished with a final furlong in :24 3/5 with McCarron in the irons. "Obviously, he wasn't himself in the Pegasus--for whatever reason, I don't know," said the jockey. "He tried to get out really bad that night and never really tried to run. It just wasn't his night. We all have those days once in a while." But he added after the breeze, "I don't see any difference between the Touch Gold that was running this spring and the Touch Gold that was out there today."

WOODMAN FILLY SETS TATTERSALLS

OCTOBER RECORD The Head family's Haras du Quesnay set a new Tattersalls October Yearling Sale record Friday night, selling a filly by Woodman out of Toujours Elle (Lyphard) for 430,000 guineas (\$731,000) to Sheikh Hamdan's Shadwell Estates. The chestnut is out of a three-quarter sister to 1994 Irish 1000 Guineas winner Mehthaaf (Nureyev), and current sprint star Elnadim (Danzig), both bred and raced by Shadwell. The record-setting filly was one of six six-figure yearlings (100,000 guineas or more) sold during Friday's sessions, bringing the week's total to 19 with one session to go. Last year, there were 13 six-figure yearlings sold. The top-selling colt Friday was a son of freshman sire Sabrehill (Diesis (GB)) out of Butsova (GB) (Formidable). Consigned by Middle Park Stud, agent, the bay was purchased by Newgate Stud Company for 160,000 guineas (\$272,000). A total of 159 yearlings were sold for an aggregate \$7,575,200 during Friday's sessions, showing a gain of 3 percent from last year's corresponding sessions. The 1997 average of \$47,644 was up 8 percent. The median price, \$28,900, held steady. The October Yearling Sale ends today. News cont. p5

SPINNING WORLD HEADS FRENCH

BREEDERS' CUP TEAM According to vesterday's Racing Post, the French team for the 1997 Breeders' Cup will likely number less than six, but will include G1 Prix du Moulin winner Spinning World (Nureyev). Also scheduled to make the trip are Pas de Reponse (Danzig), Don't Worry Me (Ire) (Dancing Dissident) and Rajpoute (Fr) (Double Bed {Fr}). The Niarchos family's Spinning World, runner-up in last year's Mile, has been working well at Chantilly. He could go in either the Classic or the Mile this year. "He's already done a stint on the All Along dirt track," Niarchos Racing Manager Alan Cooper told the Racing Post. "He handled the turns very well and was not ill at ease on the surface." But he added, "The Mile would be the more logical choice and he would be favourite for the race." Both three-year-old filly Pas de Reponse, a half-length second in the G1 Prix de l'Abbave last out October 5, and five-year-old mare Don't Worry Me, eighth in the Prix de l'Abbave but winner of the G2 King's Stand S. at Royal Ascot and a Group 2 race in Germany two starts back, will point for the Sprint.
