SIPHON RETIRED MGISW **Siphon (Brz)** (Itajara {Brz}), fourth after dueling winner **Skip Away** (Skip Trial) through the early fractions of Saturday's GI Jockey Club Gold Cup, injured his right front ankle in the race and will now be retired. "He cooled out fine, but there was some filling in the ankle," said trainer Richard Mandella. "We're going to send him home to Airdrie Stud. I was hoping to get him out on Monday morning, but I still have to wait for the X-rays to see how he's doing. He's pretty sore and we might have to wait on him. He's not in any danger, but we want him to be as comfortable as he can be." The six-year-old, a Group 1 winner in his native Brazil, captured six stakes in the U.S., including the GI Hollywood Gold Cup last year and the GI Santa Anita H. this season. He goes to the breeding shed with a record of 13 wins from 25 starts and earnings of \$3,158,619.

SILVER CHARM BACK ON WORK TAB Kentucky Derby and Preakness winner **Silver Charm** (Silver Buck) had his first breeze since being sidelined by a fever following the Triple Crown, working Sunday morning at Santa Anita. With apprentice jockey Dana Barnes in the saddle, the colt, unraced since his second-place finish in the GI Belmont S. June 7, went three furlongs in :38. "We could have gone faster," said trainer Bob Baffert. "But we've got a long way to go with him. But he looks really good." Baffert hopes to have the grey ready for the GI Malibu S. at Santa Anita December 26.

BENCHMARK OUT OF BREEDERS' CUP Winner of the GII Del Mar Breeders' Cup H. and GII Goodwood Breeders' Cup H. in his last two starts, six-year-old **Benchmark** (Alydar) will miss the GI Breeders' Cup Classic after coming up with a chip in his left front ankle. "He had some swelling in the ankle after (the Goodwood, October 11)," said trainer Ron Ellis. "He just wasn't moving fast enough when we galloped him, so we X-rayed him and found the chip. We'll do surgery on him this week and try to bring him back as long as the surgeon says it looks good. I think it will. We've had success bringing horses back from these kind of injuries." Benchmark has won seven of 14 career starts.

Hidden Lake showed her appreciation for her relocation to New York and the John Kimmel barn once again with her fourth stakes victory in as many starts for Kimmel. The favorite, coming off a three-month rest since winning the July 27 GI Go For Wand S. at Saratoga in her previous start, prompted the early pace before taking over after three-quarters and driving clear in the lane. "I know she looked like she was getting tired," winning jockey Richard Migliore said, "but believe me, I had a lot of horse. At the three-eighths pole, she was going easily. I hand-rode her to the sixteenths-pole, then I got into her because she was looking around and you don't take chances in a \$400,000 race." Kimmel made his case for an Eclipse Award for Hidden Lake. "I don't know the results of the Lady's Secret H. (won by Sharp Cat, with Twice The Vice second)," he said. "But if something should happen...if Twice The Vice should stub her toe or if we didn't make it (to the Breeders' Cup) or didn't run our best race, I still think the arrow should point to us. No other filly or mare has done as much in the division this year as Hidden Lake." Ajina, always up with the pace, finished well to be second and earned a trip to the Distaff. "She hit the front of the gate and was going backwards when they opened the gate," said jockey Mike Smith. "Instead of being on the lead where we were supposed to be, I had to go to 'Plan B' and come from behind. She ran great, I'm proud of her." Jewel Princess rallied wide but was no threat to the winner. Her trainer, Wally Dollase, indicated she will defend her title in the Distaff at Hollywood Park Nov. 8.

Chief Bearhart, last year's champion turf horse in Canada, had earlier in the year registered victories in the Apr. 25 GII Elkhorn S. at Keeneland and the GIII June 14 King Edward Breeders' Cup H. at Woodbine and was a sixth-length victor in the Sept. 28 GII C Sky Classic H. at Woodbine last time out. Bettering his record over the Woodbine turf to five-for-seven lifetime with this victory, the favorite trailed the field down the backside before accelerating around the far turn to take the lead turning for home and kick clear in the drive. "Well, he's certainly one of the best turf horses in America, I would think," said trainer Mark Frostad. "The 'Chief' has been training like a monster and performed like it today." As for the Breeders' Cup Turf, Frostad said, "It's a possibility. We'll have to see how he comes out of the race and we'll have to discuss it with the Samuels."

German-based three-year-old Caitano (GB) landed his second Group 1 race of the year, giving his remarkable but ailing trainer Bruno Schutz his fifth at this level on the year. Mons (GB) led from the gate and was still in front entering the straight, but Luso (GB) swept through to take over at the quarter pole and momentarily looked set to land his second Group 1 win of the year. Caitano, always travelling well, simply cruised up to take the lead inside the final eighth of a mile and went on to beat Luso by the exact same margin by which he defeated him in the G1 Aral-Pokal in Germany in August.

Undefeated at distances from five furlongs to a mile, Silver Maiden was looking to stretch her speed another sixteenth of a mile after a three-quarter length victory in the GII Arlington-Washington Lassie last out September 27. The second choice in her first appearance outside Arlington International, the bay set the pace through honest early fractions and had plenty left in the tank, widening the gap down the lane for an impressive score. "This feels wonderful," said trainer Britt McGehee.

"(Jockey Jerry Bailey) said she did it pretty easy. We'll look and see how she comes out of this and then evaluate what's next." The filly would have to be supplemented to the Breeders' Cup, and McGehee remarked, "It's (owner Frank Calabrese's) decision. I'll advise him as to how she's doing, but for that money, it's up to him. Before Countess Diana and Beautiful Pleasure met at Keeneland, I thought Countess Diana was the best filly in the country, but my filly is improving. By coming here, I accomplished what I wanted...I was hopeful those two would kind of beat each other up at Keeneland and it looked like it happened. I know they are nice fillies, but if we only have to meet them one time, maybe we can get them."

The first four finishers were all European invaders. Said winning owner George Strawbridge, "I've been trying to win the E. P. Taylor for 20 years now. I send my best horses to run in it. Fortunately, I bought this horse three weeks ago and here it wins, thanks to a superior trainer and a superior rider." The winner will now head to trainer Jonathan Sheppard's stable in Pennsylvania. "I imagine she's through for the year," said Strawbridge. "We'll start off again in the spring with her."

The slight favorite in a well-matched field of seven, Souvenir Copy eked out a game nose decision over OLD TOPPER (Gilded Time) in the GII Del Mar Futurity in his latest September 10. Stretching out off that seven-furlong test, the regally bred dark bay stalked pacesetter Double Honor through six furlongs in 1:09 4/5, moved three-wide as they straightened into the stretch and outfinished Old Trieste for the victory. "I've never had a two-year-old working like he has this early," said winning trainer Bob Baffert, who sent out two-year-old filly Vivid Angel to win Saturday's GI Oak Leaf S. "When he got out down the stretch, I thought, 'if he's the horse I think he is, he'll run right by (Old Trieste).' He answered the question for me. I was very confident...I've never had a two-year-old as mature as this horse. He's so classy. He's just a smart horse and he's going to get better. He's twice the horse he was at Del Mar." But Baffert added, "He's going to have to improve to beat (Moet Champagne winner) Grand Slam. The Breeders' Cup Juvenile is going to be a competitive race." Jockey Gary Stevens rides both Grand Slam and Souvenir Copy. Old Topper, who just missed in the Del Mar Futurity, was sent off the second choice but showed little and finished last. "(Jockey Alex Solis) said he just didn't have it today," said trainer Noble Threewitt. "I think as far as the Breeders' Cup goes, he's out."

Kelly Kip, four-for-five as a two-year-old, had been one-for-four since coming back from a seven-month layoff August 1. Winner of a Saratoga allowance race August 23 in his second start back, he finished ninth facing top-class sprinters in the Sept. 27 GI Vosburgh S. and second in an Oct. 5 Belmont allowance event last time out. The longshot showed speed on the outside before taking the lead after a half-mile and driving clear in the stretch. "He ran a great race," said jockey Jean-Luc Samyn. "There was still plenty of moisture in (the track); it helped our chances. It was wet fast. He was strong today. He loves this kind of track." Winning trainer Allen Jerkens was unsure if Kelly Kip would go onto the Breeders' Cup Sprint. Favored Crafty Friend, who had been competing around two turns in California in his last three starts, sat close to the pace early, was bumped at the 1/2-mile pole, but recovered and finished well to be second. "I'm looking forward to the Breeders' Cup (Sprint)," said his trainer, Wally Dollase.
