BENNY THE DIP RETIRED This year's Epsom Derby winner Benny the Dip (Silver Hawk) has been retired from racing and will stand the 1998 breeding season at Claiborne Farm. The three-year-old colt will be shipped to the Lexington, Kentucky farm in early November. Since winning the Derby, Benny the Dip finished second behind Pilsudski in the G1 Coral-Eclipse S., third behind Singspiel in the G1 Juddmonte International S. and, in his final race, sixth in Saturday's GI Dubai Champion S. He retires with earnings of \$1,472,042. "Despite being completely sound, we felt it was in his best interest to retire now," said owner Landon Knight. "This horse had a tough three-year-old campaign--winning the Epsom Derby and then facing top older horses."

TOTALS UP AT BELMONT On-track attendance and handle and total handle both increased at the recently concluded 33-day Belmont Fall Meet. On-track attendance reached 231,500, compared to the '96 total of 225,633, an increase of 2.6 percent. On-track handle was up 2.3 percent, totaling \$61,146,503 as compared to last year's figure of \$59,793,474. Handle from all commingled sources was up 4.7 percent, adding up to \$301,538,744. The '96 total was \$287,994,966. Daily average total handle rose 1.5 percent, from \$8,999,843 to \$9.137.538. Daily average on-track attendance edged down .5 percent to 7,015, while daily average on-track handle was off .8 percent to \$1,852,924. "There were a lot of positives at the meet," said NYRA President and COO Terry Meyocks. "The on-track numbers leveled off after sharp decreases in previous seasons. Hopefully, we've stopped the bleeding and can start to rebuild some of the on-track business."

SILVER MAIDEN TO BREEDERS' CUP Undefeated two-year-old filly Silver Maiden (Silver Buck) will be supplemented to the November 8 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies where she will battle for divisional honors with Countess Diana (Deerhound). Owner Frank Calabrese will have to pay \$120,000 to supplement his filly to the race. In confirming the decision to run Silver Maiden, trainer Britt McGehee said, "We hope she'll run a big race in the Breeders' Cup. She's going to have to." Silver Maiden has racked up five victories in five starts since beginning her career at Arlington International in July. She won the GII Arlington-Washington Lassie before taking Belmont Park's GI Frizette S. by seven lengths Sunday.

AGENCE FRANCAISE CONCLUDES WITH

NUMBERS UP The Agence Francaise concluded it's October Yearling Sale in Deauville, France yesterday with figures up across the board. At Wednesday's session, 90 horses sold for a total of \$1,133,937--up 33.4 percent from a year ago when 86 horses sold for \$849,987. The average price also rose 33.4 percent, from \$9,883 in 1996 to \$13,185 this year. The session topper was hip number 341. The colt by Saumarez was purchased by Winners for \$57,534. During the three-day sale, 264 yearlings sold for \$3,299,264, an increase of 28.2 percent from 1996 when 248 horses sold for \$2,572,975. The average price of \$13,250 marked a 27.7-percent increase over last year's figure of \$10,375.

STAR STANDARD INJURED AT KEENELAND

Star Standard (Risen Star), attempting to make a comeback to the races after a 17-month layoff, was vanned off the track after yesterday's eighth race at Keeneland. The five-year-old horse, unraced since winning the 1996 GI Pimlico Special H., was diagnosed by state veterinarian Dr. George Mundy as having sustained a fractured left front ankle. The incident occurred around the far turn as Star Standard appeared to take an awkward step and was pulled up immediately by jockey Pat Day. The horse was then taken to Rood and Riddle Equine Hospital in Lexington, Ky for further evaluation. In addition to his win in the Pimlico Special, Star Standard took the 1995 GII Lexington S. and finished second in that year's Belmont and GI Woodward S.

BEAUCHAMP KING RETIRED Four-year-old colt Beauchamp King (GB) (Nishapour {Fr}), winner of the G1 Racing Post Trophy in 1995 and the G3 Craven S. in 1996, has been retired and will now go to the sales in December. His only win this year came in a minor conditions event at Doncaster in July. His owner-breeder Erik Penser said: "His win in the Craven S. and his fourth in the (G1) St James' Palace S. at Royal Ascot last year have been the highlights of my time as an owner."


