RECORD SET AT TATTERSALLS AUTUMN Chief Contender (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), winner of the G1 Prix du Cadran October 4 at Longchamp, attracted a record bid of \$385,087 during the opening session of Tattersalls Autumn Horses in Training Sale in Newmarket, England vesterday. Consigned by Peter Chapple-Hyam's Manton House Stables, the four-year-old provoked a bidding duel between two McCormacks from Ireland, with Cormac McCormack winning out over BBA Ireland's John McCormack, who was representing Saudi interests. The colt, on the board in nine of 13 career starts for earnings of \$178,378, was purchased on behalf of Hong Kong-based Keyhinge Pty., and will continue his racing career in Australia. American buyers were also active on opening day. Trainer Bill O'Gorman, acting for California conditioner Darrell Vienna, went to \$119,805 for the two-year-old stakes-winning filly Karakorum (Ire) (Fairy King), consigned by Ireland's Ballydoyle Stables, and Struggler (GB) (Night Shift), the top three-year-old sprinter in France in 1995 and a Group 3 winner of \$224,956, was purchased for \$97,555 to stand stud in Florida. A total of 248 horses sold for an aggregate of \$5,047,857 Monday, an average of \$20,354. The gross was up 54 percent over the corresponding session last year, while the average advanced 32 percent. The four-day sale continues through Thursday, with bidding beginning at 9:15 a.m. daily.

ELTISH TO LIVE OAK STUD MGSW Eltish (Cox's Ridge--Nimble Feet, by Danzig) has been purchased by Charlotte C. Weber's Live Oak Stud and will stand at the Ocala, Florida farm for 1998. Bred and raced by Juddmonte Farm, the five-year-old captured the G3 Vintage S. and G2 Royal Lodge S. at England at two, then shipped to the U.S. and ran second in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile. He went on to finish second in England's G2 Prince Of Wales's S. at three and the GI Philip H. Iselin H. at four and was on the board in four of six 1997 starts, finishing third in the GII San Pasqual H. and winning a Saratoga allowance July 25. The Kentucky-bred retires with a record of five wins, five seconds and five thirds from 25 starts and earnings of \$704,186; he will stand for a fee of \$3,500, live foal.

"In recent years, I have been looking at how my bloodstock interests can be tailored in the interests of my family. For this reason, I have been reconstructing my bloodstock interests around the world. In agreement with John Magnier and Coolmore, I have phased out my interests in the Coolmore operations over the last four years. However, while I have transferred my interest in the land assets which Coolmore holds around the world, I continue to retain my share in the substantial stallion and broodmare holdings at the Coolmore farms, and Swettenham Stud's broodmare band will continue to be boarded at Coolmore. My relationship with and my admiration for John Magnier and the Coolmore operation remains undiminished. As indeed we continue to own Longfield Stud in partnership together, and John and Sue will continue to race horses with us at Manton."

Who's Hot, Who's Not

LIKE FATHER, LIKE SONS?

by Jack Werk

Often when a stallion makes a major impact early on in his stud career, a premium is placed on his offspring as breeding stock, particularly his colts. The hope, of course, is that his sons will inherit his ability to sire superior runners, making him a sire of sires--hopefully in the mold of Northern Dancer or Mr. Prospector.

A recent example of this trend is Gone West, whose first crop were two-year-olds of 1991. In just seven years, Gone West's stud fee has gone from \$40,000 to \$100,000; he is now considered one of North America's premier stallions. By 1997, four of his stakes-winning sons were standing in Kentucky (Mr. Greeley, Pembroke, Supremo, West by West) for stud fees ranging from \$5,000 to \$10,000. So far his sons have been in demand by breeders and West By West's weanling and yearling prices have been surprisingly strong.

By far, the stallion who currently has the most riding on his success or failure as a sire of sires is Storm Cat, with no less than 23 of his sons at stud for 1998. Like Gone West, Storm Cat's first crop were two-year-olds of 1991. By 1997, he'd gone from an initial stud fee of \$25,000 to \$150,000, the third highest in North America. Storm Cat has reached super stardom among stallions and consequently his sons are in demand. Seven of them had retired to stud in Kentucky by 1997 (Forest Wildcat, Harlan, Hennessy, Level Sands, Mountain Cat, Storm Boot, Tabasco Cat) with two of them, Hennessy and Tabasco Cat, commanding \$30,000 stud fees.

Storm Cat's first two sons with runners, Mountain Cat and Storm Boot, are interesting to contrast. Mountain Cat retired with five stakes victories in 11 starts and just under \$1.5 million in earnings. Storm Boot, on the other hand, could only muster four wins in 14 starts and, in stakes company, did no better than a second-place finish in the Broad Brush Stakes. A non-starter at two, he retired with earnings of \$70,510.

Mountain Cat, standing at William T. Young's Overbrook Farm, stood initially for \$5,000 but his stud fee was raised first to \$7,500 and then to \$12,500, based on breeders' demand for his seasons and the impressive prices paid for his auction weanlings and yearlings. At the same time, Storm Boot, standing at Pope McLean's Crestwood Farm, was having difficulty filling his book at \$2,000.

Mountain Cat is out of a stakes-winning Key to the Mint mare; Storm Boot is out of a Mr. Prospector mare with no black type. However, Storm Boot descends in tail female from the powerful family of Rough Shod II through Gambetta, Zonah and Drumtop.

It seems that the only thing these two stallions have in common is their sire--until you look at the freshmen standings as of October 20. Mountain Cat in fifth place with seven juvenile winners from 58 foals, including stakes-placed winners Mountain Medley and Cat Doctor. This is a respectable start for a stallion at his stud fee

Now comes the surprise. Mountain Cat is tied with five other stallions and one of those is none other than Storm Boot, who has had seven winners from just 31 foals, including stakes-placed winner Hurricane Bertie. That's almost 23 percent 2YO winners, placing him second behind deceased Exbourne among all freshmen sires by percentage of 2YO winners. It looks like these Storm Boots are made for running!

Two things appear to be true at this point. Those who have invested in Storm Cat's future as a sire of sires have reason for optimism. And, if you are breeding to race on a \$2,000 budget and have a compatible mare, Storm Boot is your horse.
