DEERHOUND TO BROOKDALE FARM Deerhound (Danzig--Lassie Dear, by Buckpasser), sire of leading 1997 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies contender Countess Diana, has arrived at Fred Seitz's Brookdale Farm near Versailles, Kentucky, where he will stand the 1998 breeding season. The nine-year-old stallion previously stood at Mr. and Mrs. E. Allen Murray's Murmur Farm in Darlington, Maryland, A \$1,750,000 Keeneland July yearling, Deerhound is a full or half-brother to four stakes winners, including European Champion Sprinter Wolfhound (Nureyev) and MGSW Weekend Surprise (Secretariat), dam of classic winner Summer Squall and Horse of the Year A.P. Indy. Deerhound has sired seven two-year-old winners from 14 starters this year in his second crop, including Grade I winner Countess Diana and listed stakes winner Expensive Issue. The Deerhound Syndicate has approved the stallion's move to Brookdale Farm and has also approved the appointment of Brookdale Stallions Inc. as Syndicate Manager. He will stand for a 1998 fee of \$12,500 live foal.

TATTERSALLS AUTUMN SALE CONTINUES TO

SHOW GAINS Seven horses topped the 100,000guineas (\$171,150) mark during Tuesday's second session of the Tattersalls Autumn Horses in Training Sale at Newmarket, England. The day's highest price of \$239,610 was paid for the four-year-old colt Freequent (GB) (Rainbow Quest--Free Guest {Ire}, by Be My Guest). To date, Freequent has notched four victories in 13 career starts, including an allowance win in Italy in his latest outing Sept. 21. Freequent's dam Free Guest is a MGSW of \$184,431, and his half-sister Shamshir (GB) (Kris {GB}) won the G1 Fillies Mile. He was consigned by Luca Cumani's Bedford House Stables, which was responsible for four of the seven six-figure horses Tuesday. His purchaser was agent Richard O'Groman on behalf of Saudi interests. Overall, 223 horses in training sold Tuesday for a gross of \$6,158,661 and an average of \$27,616. The gross was up seven percent from the corresponding session last year, while the average rose eight percent. Californian Howard Schow topped the American purchasers Tuesday when he paid \$119,805 for the optimistically-named three-year-old colt Speedball (Ire) (Waajib {Ire}). The four-day sale continues through Thursday.

### • JUVENILE COLTS PREPARE FOR BATTLE

Trainer D. Wayne Lukas sent out a pair of his Breeders' Cup Juvenile hopefuls for drills over the Hollywood Park track Tuesday morning. Grand Slam (Gone West), winner of the GI Moet Champagne S. and GI Futurity at Belmont in his last two outings, breezed five furlongs in 1:01. "Grand Slam will be tactically placed," Lukas said. "He's very versatile with a good mind--a real good mind. (Jockey) Gary (Stevens) is very impressed with his maturity, more so than any colt in a long time--at least that's what he told me. They complement each other, and I think they belong." Also breezing for Team Lukas vesterday was two-year-old Double Honor (Gone West), winner of the GIII Sapling S. at Monmouth in August and most recently third in the GII Norfolk S. Oct. 19. The \$635,000 Barretts March purchase covered six furlongs in 1:13 2/5. "We're trying to get Double Honor to relax," said Lukas. "He's been getting along great in the mornings, but I don't know if that's going to happen in the afternoon." Working Tuesday at Santa Anita were a pair of Bob Baffert-trained Juvenile contenders--GII Norfolk hero Souvenir Copy (Mr. Prospector) and Johnbill (Slew City Slew), a 5 1/2-length maiden winner at Santa Anita Oct. 1. The pair drilled six furlongs in 1:11 4/5--the fastest of 12 works at the distance.

Two-year-old Cowboy Dan (Walesa), winner of his last four starts, including the GII Arlington-Washington Futurity Oct. 5, will miss this Saturday's GIII Iroquois S. with a sore shin. Trainer and co-owner Danny Hutt said the gelding never appeared to be in discomfort, but a routine check resulted in the discovery of some heat in the shin. "It's not a big deal, but he was scheduled to breeze Monday and this takes him out of training for this week," said Hutt. "We don't want to take the chance of aggravating it." Hutt said the major goal of Cowboy Dan's fall campaign remains the GIII Brown & Williamson Kentucky Jockey Club at Churchill Downs Nov. 29--but it depends how quickly the shin problem clears up. "It didn't show up when he galloped or walked," Hutt said. "But we're not going to run him until it's completely cold." Hutt and partners William Schaffrick and Robert Quackenbush purchased Cowboy Dan for \$250,000 after he ran a close second to Favorite Trick in the WHAS-11 S. Kentucky Derby Day.

### WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES by Alan Porter

### **PEDIGREE SHORTS**

With a game victory in the G1 Racing Post Trophy at Doncaster Saturday, Oct. 25, Saratoga Springs (c, 2, El Gran Senor--Population {Ire}, by General Assembly) stamped himself as a potential classic candidate for 1998. General Assembly has been working well with the Northern Dancer line, and of the first 13 stakes winners out of General Assembly mares, six are by Northern Dancer line sires. This affinity is not too surprising when one considers General Assembly's pedigree. In the first place, he is by Secretariat, a horse whose daughters have frequently worked well with Northern Dancer. However, we shouldn't ignore General Assembly's dam, Exclusive Dancer. She is by Native Dancer (as is Northern Dancer's dam, Natalma), and her dam, Exclusive, has a very similar genetic background to Arbitrator, the granddam of Natalma. Exclusive Native, a three-parts brother to Exclusive Dancer, has also worked well with Northern Dancer stallions, the cross providing over a third of the stakes winners out of Exclusive Native-line mares, including classic winners Entrepreneur, Balanchine and Mehthaaf.

Ninth Inning (f, 2, Meadowlake--La Finale, by In Reality), who scored a stunning victory in Saturday's GII Astarita S. at Aqueduct, is bred on the same cross as another brilliant juvenile filly, Meadow Star. The strongest connection between Meadowlake and In Reality is the fact that Meadowlake's sire, Hold Your Peace, is out of a mare by Eight Thirty, while In Reality is inbred to War Relic, a close genetic relative to Eight Thirty. Both these horses have Man o' War combined with his genetic relative Friar Rock, and the pedigree of Ninth Inning is particularly unusual for the fact that her sixth dam is Man o' War's sister, Masda.

There are very few horses which can match Seattle Slew as a regional sire of sires, and he was at it again last Saturday when **Seattle Carla (m, 5, Slew the Bride--Dr. Carla, by Relaunch)** won the California Cup Distaff at Santa Anita. Seattle Carla is inbred 4 x 4 to The Axe II, the broodmare sire of her broodmare sire Relaunch, and, of course, The Axe II goes back to La Troienne, who is doubled in the pedigree of Seattle Slew's dam. California-based In Excess (Ire) is making tremendous use of limited opportunities and has, we think, four stakes winners from around 16 starters. Two of these won this past Saturday, with Fun In Excess (f, 3, In Excess {Ire}--Bojo Ro, by Carr de Naskra) taking the California Cup Matron H., and Ex Marks The Cop (c, 2, In Excess {Ire}--Crystal Cop, by Crystal Water) the California Cup Juvenile S. Fun In Excess has a most unusual pedigree as he is linebred to Ardan (winner of the French Derby and Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe), with Ardan's three-parts-sister Tellaris also in the pedigree. Ex Marks The Cop has the influential Alibhai 6 x 5 x 5, including through the threequarters related Determine and Your Host.

A winner of five of six starts, including Saturday's The Swan S. (G2-Jpn) at Kyoto Racecourse in Japan, **Taiki Shuttle (c, 3, Devil's Bag--Welsh Muffin {Ire}, by Caerleon)** is fast developing into one of Japan's leading three-year-olds. Taiki Shuttle is the sixth stakes winner to be sired by Devil's Bag out of a mare by Nijinsky II or one of his sons. Since Devil's Bag is by Halo and Nijinsky II is by Northern Dancer, this combination gives a double of Almahmoud, granddam of Halo and Northern Dancer. Taiki Shuttle has a couple of additional twists. First, he has Hail to Reason, sire of Caerleon's granddam Regal Gleam, through a son and a daughter, and secondly, Caerleon is bred on the same Nijinsky II/Round Table cross as the dams of Devil's Bag's stakes winners De La Devil and Air Bag.

The GII Cowdin S. Sunday at Aqueduct resulted in an impressive victory for Coronado's Quest (c, 2, Forty Niner--Laughing Look, by Damascus). Coronado's Quest is the first stakes winner sired by Forty Niner out of a Damascus mare and only the second out of a mare from the Damascus line. There are, however, links between Forty Niner's pediaree and that of Coronado's Quest's granddam, Laughter, To start with, Forty Niner's sire, Mr. Prospector, is by a son of Native Dancer out of a mare by a son of Nasrullah, while Laughter is by a son of Nasrullah out of a mare by Native Dancer. In addition to two sons' strains of Nasrullah, Forty Niner carries a daughter of the same horse, and Nasrullah's close relative, Perfume II, appears in the center of the pedigree of Damascus.

### Weekend Pedigree Perspectives Continued.

Last Sunday's G3 Preis Der Spielbanken Des Landes Nordrhein-Westfalen in Dusseldorf, Germany, resulted in a win over his elders for the U.S.-bred Saugerties (c, 3, Trempolino-Stalwart Moment by Stalwart). This pedigree is an outcross at six generations save for Ribot, who appears 5 x 5, and Native Dancer, who appears 4 x 6 x 5. This is yet another version of the Sharpen Up/Ribot cross which also appears in Group 1 and Grade I winners Diminuendo, Earl of Barking (Ire), Flash of Steel (Ire), Oh So Sharp (Ire) and Risk Me (Fr). It also marks the continuing affinity between Native Dancer and Ribot, which was pointed out some time ago by New Zealand researcher Clive Harper. Although they were born on different continents. Native Dancer and Ribot have somewhat similar genetic backgrounds, the commonalities principally involving opposite sex strains of the English Derby winner Sainfoin and the sprinter Sundridge (out of a sister to Sainfoin).
