DESERT KING, ALI-ROYAL TO COOLMORE Dual Irish Classic winner Desert King (Ire) (Danehill) and G1SW Ali-Royal (Ire) (Royal Academy) have been retired and will stand the 1998 breeding season at Coolmore Stud in Ireland. Yesterday's Racing Post reported the retirement of the three-year-old Desert King, who had been scheduled to make a final appearance in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf before coming down with a virus. A winner of five of his 12 career starts and \$1,072,725, Desert King captured this year's G1 Irish Derby and G1 Irish 2000 Guineas, as well as the G1 National S. at two. He finished second to Pilsudski (Ire) in his swan song, the G1 Irish Champion S. at Leopardstown September 13. A stud fee has not vet been announced. Four-year-old Ali-Royal picked up his most important victory in his career finale, winning the one-mile G1 Sussex S. at Goodwood July 30. The bay helped his dam, Aldiva (Ire) (Chief Singer {Ire}) become the first broodmare ever to be represented by three Group 1 winners in a single year; his full sister Sleepytime (Ire) took this year's G1 English 1000 Guineas and his half-brother Taipan (Ire) (Last Tycoon {Ire}) pocketed the G1 Europa Preis. Ali-Royal goes to the breeding shed with a record of seven wins from 16 starts and earnings of \$328,190. "With the departure of Royal Academy to our American division, Ashford Stud, we are delighted to be standing his fastest son here...where he was born and raised," said Coolmore Manager Christy Grassick. The stallion will stand for a fee of 6,000 guineas (approximately \$10,175).

STUD FEE SET FOR ENTREPRENEUR This year's English 2000 Guineas hero **Entrepreneur (GB)** (Sadler's Wells), who begins his stud career at Coolmore next season, will stand for a fee of 17,500 pounds (approximately \$28,270) in 1998, according to yesterday's *Sporting Life*. The three-year-old started only six times but won three of his races, earning \$307,930.

• **ANET TO MISS MILE** Three-yearold Anet (Clever Trick) was withdrawn from the Mile yesterday morning after coming up sore due to an abscessed left hind foot. The abscess was discovered several days ago, but the colt had been

sound until Monday. "I thought we were going to be okay," said trainer Bob Baffert. "The abscess had broken a couple of days ago. It looked like we would be okay, but today he's still tender. If I want to race him, I'd have to work him (Tuesday), and it could turn into a nasty quarter crack. And I couldn't give him any heavy antibiotics because it would come out in the test." **Naninja** (Alysheba), second on the preference list, will be awarded a berth in the Mile after the decision of Hesabull's connections to go in the Sprint; Chris McCarron has the mount.

• **KELLY KIP SKIPS SPRINT** Three-year-old Kelly Kip (Kipper Kelly), winner of the GII Forest Hills H. over older horses last out, was withdrawn from the Breeders' Cup Sprint after trainer Allen Jerkens expressed concern with the way his colt was traveling during his morning gallop Monday at Belmont Park. **Exotic Wood** (Rahy), first on the also-eligible list, gets his spot in the gate.

• **CLASSIC...**Three London bookmakers are making **Skip Away** (Skip Trial) the Classic favorite. Corals has the colt at 7-4, William Hill at 5-2 and Ladbrokes at 6-4.

• TURF ... "He was probably the only Breeders' Cup horse to gallop in the snow Monday," said trainer Noel Hickey of his Turf contender Buck's Boy (Bucksplasher), who trained during a flurry at Chicago's Hawthorne Race Course before heading for Kentucky on a van vesterday. His flight to warmer weather leaves Louisville this morning...jockey Jerry Bailey has picked up the mount on Flag Down (Deputy Minister)...Ops Smile (Caveat) worked a half-mile in :48 at Bonita Farm in Maryland Monday; he ships to California Thursday...Borgia (Ger) (Acatenango {Ger}), third in the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, worked at Cologne Racecourse in Germany yesterday and flies to the U.S. today. "The work was every bit as impressive as her last work before the Arc," said Andreas Schutz, the son of trainer Bruno Schutz who will take over his father's operation at the end of the year. Runner-up in the GIII Round Table S., third in the GII Pennsylvania Derby and fourth in the GI Preakness at three, the Kentucky-bred six-year-old won five of his 24 career starts and bankrolled \$446,518. His last victory came in a Belmont Park allowance race May 16 of this year; he made his final start at Saratoga, running fourth in an allowance test August 18. He will stand for a fee of \$2,500, live foal.

EUROPEANS TOPS ON TURF IN BREEDERS' CUP By Graham Rock

This year's European challenge for glory on Breeders' Cup Day offers quality, if not the quantity of some recent years, and overseas raiders are likely to start favorite in both races on the grass. Handicappers can thumb the pages of the *Daily Racing Form* until the print disappears, but there is no denying the chances of **Sing**spiel (Ire) (In The Wings {GB}) in the Turf and **Spinning World** (Nureyev) in the Mile.

No British-trained contender has won at the two previous Breeders' Cup Championships held at Hollywood Park and the mighty Dancing Brave was beaten at Santa Anita in 1986. One of the best middle-distance horses to race in Europe, Dancing Brave flew to California at the end of a long season and finished a disappointing fourth behind Manila. Breeders' Cup races are never won as an afterthought.

Singspiel has been trained with Hollywood Park at the back of Michael Stoute's mind since early summer. While many hoped that the winner of the Japan Cup and Dubai World Cup would contest the Breeders' Cup Classic, attempting a unique treble in the world's three most valuable purses, Sheikh Mohammed has opted to try and improve on Singspiel's second to his stable companion Pilsudski (Ire) in the Turf at Woodbine last year.

Singspiel enjoyed a short rest from training after his easy win from Desert King (Ire) in the Juddmonte International at York in August and has been brought to a peak for Saturday. On international ratings he is clear of his Turf rivals and he leads the pre-race betting at 6-4 with the major British bookmakers.

A fast surface will not trouble, but possible weakness might be the track, tight by European standards. At Santa Anita in 1993, some top-class colts from across the Atlantic flopped behind Kotashaan (Fr). Leaving the straight round the clubhouse turn, the field fanned out like crows flying from a shotgun. If Singspiel handles the bends, though, he should win.

Borgia (Ger) (Acatenango {Ger}) finished an excellent third to Peintre Celebre in the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, and is the best German-trained filly in recent memory. On a tenuous line through Pilsudski, runner-up at Longchamp, she is superior to Singspiel but that reasoning is surely a false trail. On the balance of their achievements, she has a few lengths to find against Michael Stoute's brilliant five-year-old.

Majorien (GB) (Machiavellian), from Criquette Head's Chantilly stable, would need to improve dramatically to make his mark in a field of this calibre, a remark that also applies to Dermot Weld's **Dance Design (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells), who has the Turf as a first preference over the Distaff. Dance Design finished seventh in Sunday's Yellow Ribbon Invitational after setting the pace, then stumbling after bumping with favored Memories Of Silver in deep stretch.

Rajpoute (Fr) (Double Bed {Fr}), formerly trained by Francois Doumen in France and now handled by Ron McAnally, was one of the luckiest winners of the decade when defeating Peintre Celebre in the Prix Niel and faces a difficult task in exalted company.

Like Singspiel, Spinning World was second at Woodbine, chasing home Da Hoss in the 1996 Mile. On his form this year, Jonathan Pease's horse is the best in Europe over eight furlongs and he is hard to oppose, given the quality of his opposition. He would be lengths ahead of the likes of **Fantastic Fellow** (Lear Fan) and **Soviet Line (Ire)** (Soviet Star) on their form in Europe, but Fantastic Fellow has thrived west of the Atlantic. It is unlikely, however, that he has improved enough to trouble Spinning World, who is priced at around 5-2.

The first three home in the Prix de l'Abbaye, **Carmine Lake (Ire)** (Royal Academy), **Pas de Reponse** (Danzig) and **Royal Applause (GB)** (Waajib {Ire}), line up for the Sprint. None has form on dirt, and they are likely to go the way of so many European hopefuls over the years. True, Sheikh Albadou (GB) landed a surprise at Gulfstream Park six years ago, and Dayjur would have won at Belmont if he had not mistaken a shadow for a fence close to the winning line. The 1997 challengers are not of that fine vintage and seem to be in Hollywood simply because they have little to lose.

Carmine Lake has had her training problems this season and her success at Longchamp came as a surprise. Royal Applause was officially retired after the Prix de l'Abbaye and runs following a change of heart, not an ideal preparation for the toughest sprint in the world. Those who believe that a European sprinter can triumph this time should pin their faith on Pas de Reponse, who showed plenty of early pace when beaten a length by Carmine Lake.

Consistent throughout the season, Pas de Reponse failed to stay a mile when beaten in the English 1000 Guineas, but since reverting to sprint distances, she has proved herself one of the speediest in Europe. It may not be fast enough, thought, against **Richter Scale** (*Habitony) on the dirt at Hollywood Park.
