Cat) will most likely not be entered in the Breeders' Cup Sprint, said trainer John Forbes yesterday morning at Hollywood Park. Forbes was not pleased with

the way his three-year-old galloped, but could not identify anything specifically wrong with him. "Right now, I don't plan to enter him," said Forbes. "It would be irresponsible to send him out there if he's not 100 percent. Right now, I say no." Forbes said that exercise rider Jorge Monroy said Tale of the Cat "felt stiff" during Monday's gallop at Hollywood. He was jogged for a veterinarian, and Forbes decided to fly veterinarian Dr. Jackie Shellow in from Florida to examine him. Neither Forbes nor Shellow could find anything wrong with the GII King's Bishop winner. "We can't see anything. We can't find anything, but he's not right," said Forbes, who speculated that the three-year-old may have pulled a muscle during his Oct. 29 six-furlong work in 1:09 at the Meadowlands. "Maybe we pushed too hard back there," he said. "It's minor enough that we can't find anything. We spent about \$25,000 getting this far, but you can't think about that. You have to think about his future."...Should Tale of the Cat not be entered, Bet on Sunshine (Bet Big), a five-time stakes winner this year, would draw in off of the preferred list...Sprint hopeful Confide (Phone Trick) worked a half-mile on Hollywood's main track in :47 2/5 under Mike Smith... Exotic Wood (Rahy) breezed three furlongs in :34 2/5 at Santa Anita. "That's as slow as we could get her to go," said trainer Ron Ellis.

•CHANGE OF PLANS FOR SINGSPIEL Trainer Michael Stoute made a minor alteration to Breeders' Cup Turf hopeful Singspiel (Ire) (In the Wings {GB})'s exercise schedule after a "pulse" was found in the five-yearold's left front foot overnight. "We just gave him a trot this morning," said Stoute. "I would have given him a little canter, and I could have, but we'll just put it off until tomorrow. He's absolutely fine and will run on Lasix, as he did last year." Dr. Rick Arthur, president of the American Association of Equine Practitioners, said a 'pulse' was indicative of an increased blood supply to the area. While not commenting on Singspiel specifically, he said a pulse normally confirmed minor inflammation of the tissues and could develop from a number of sources...Big Sky Chester (Afleet), also pointing for the Turf, worked five furlongs on the Hollywood turf in 1:15 4/5 under Gary Stevens.

•DOWN THE AISLE OUT OF CLASSIC Trainer Bill Mott sent his two Breeders' Cup Classic contenders out to work over Hollywood Park's main track yesterday morning, but during Down the Aisle (Runaway Groom)'s five-furlong work in :59 2/5, the four-year-old suffered a fractured medial wing of the coffin bone on his left front leg and had to be withdrawn from the race. "I was very pleased with the work," trainer Bill Mott said Tuesday afternoon. "He walked inside for about 10 to 15 minutes and we took him out for his bath. When we were coming in, he was nearly unable to make it back." Stablemate Dowty (Irish River {Fr}) also worked five furlongs, covering the distance in 1:00...Looking to repeat his dad's Hollywood Classic moment, Whiskey Wisdom (Wild Again) worked a bullet five furlongs in 1:01 1/5 under rider Pat Day vesterday morning over a muddy Churchill Downs strip.

•RIDER SCARE FOR SPINNING WORLD Connections of probable Breeders' Cup Mile favorite Spinning World (Nureyev) had a scare yesterday when jockey Cash Asmussen went down in the final furlong of a race at Maisons-Laffitte in France. Asmussen took off the rest of his mounts, but emerged unscathed. "It was a lucky fall," said Niarchos family racing manager Alan Cooper at Hollywood Park. "I've spoken to him and he's fine." Cooper said Asmussen was scheduled to arrive in L.A. Wednesday...Mile hopeful El Angelo (El Gran Senor) worked a half-mile on the turf in :45 2/5 under Alex Solis. "Well, I wanted to put a little speed into him, and that's certainly what I got," said trainer Jenine Sahadi...Wild Event (Wild Again) worked four furlongs on the turf in :50 4/5.

● DISTAFF / JUVENILE FILLY WORKTAB Ajina (Strawberry Road {Aus}), winner of the GI Mother Goose S. and GI Coaching Club American Oaks this year, worked five furlongs in 1:01 1/5 at Hollywood in preparation for the Distaff. "That was very typical of her," said trainer Bill Mott, "an adequate work. If she can't win off that, she can't win."...Four two-year-olds worked in preparation for the Juvenile Fillies: Bay Harbor (Forty Niner) went a half-mile in :47 4/5 at Santa Anita...Love Lock (Silver Ghost), winner of the GIII Debutante S. at Churchill, worked a half in :48 3/5 at Santa Anita...Primaly (Alydeed) worked a half in :51 at Churchill...Diamond On the Run (Kris S.) had a threefurlong blowout around the dogs at Belmont Park. The GI Frizette and GI Matron runner-up is scheduled to arrive at Hollywood Park today.

OAK TREE WRAP-UP The Oak Tree Racing Association completed its 27-day meeting at Santa Anita Park on Monday. Total handle reached \$268.1 million, an increase of 1.6 percent from last year's figure of \$263.8 million. On-track attendance for the meeting was 333,476, down .8 percent from 1996. Average daily attendance was 12,351--100 people per day fewer than in 1996. "We are very pleased with the results of the meeting," said Sherwood C. Chillingworth, director and executive vice president of the Oak Tree Racing Association, "Finishing virtually even with last year in attendance is gratifying considering the unseasonably hot weather and the fact that for the first time since 1987, the Breeders' Cup was not held during the Oak Tree meeting." Trainer Bob Baffert tied Mike Mitchell's 1983 Oak Tree record for most wins in a single meeting with 19 victories and Ron McAnally hit the 200-win mark, one shy of Charlie Whittingham's all-time Oak Tree record. Hall of Fame jockey Gary Stevens edged out Kent Desormeaux and David Flores on the final day of the meet to earn the rider's title with 23 wins.

JUDDMONTE NAMED TOBA OWNER OF THE

MONTH The Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders' Association and Gainsborough Farm have named Prince Khalid Abdullah's Juddmonte Farms its October Owner of the Month. Consistently one of the world's leading Thoroughbred breeding operations, Juddmonte scored impressive wins with two homebred fillies in October. Rvafan (Lear Fan) captured the October 4 Gl Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup in her American bow and stablemate Yashmak (Danzig) won the GI Flower Bowl Invitational H. that same day. Prince Khalid Abdullah purchased his first racehorse 20 years ago after being introduced to the sport in England. A prominent Saudi Arabian businessman, Prince Khalid is a hands-on owner who directs the breeding of 200 mares at his Juddmonte Farms divisions in Kentucky and England. "The Prince is justifiably very proud of what he's accomplished," said Dr. John Chandler, president of Juddmonte Kentucky. "He makes all his own decisions on who gets bred to what. He's a very dedicated and hardworking businessman and he runs his business."

Just as he had done in the Caulfield Cup October 18, Might And Power (NZ) went wire-to-wire for the victory, but unlike that seven-length stroll, he only just held on to beat the 1995 winner Doriemus (NZ), who looked as though he had done enough to win but failed by a nostril. Finishing well for third was last year's South Australian Derby winner Markham (Aus), HARBOUR DUES (GB) (Slip Anchor {GB}), who suffered traffic problems around the final turn, finished fast for fourth, the best performance ever in the race from an English-trained runner, while Queen Elizabeth II's ARABIAN STORY (GB) (Sharood) ran well to be sixth. Might And Power, only the 10th horse to take the Caulfield Cup-Melbourne Cup "double," is trained by 70-year-old Jack Denham, who does not speak to the media and refused to break his silence even on the occasion of training his first Melbourne Cup winner. Jockey Jim Cassidy, who has made a remarkable comeback to the big time after his career lay in ruins two years ago when banned for three years (reduced to two years after appeal) for being involved in tipping horses in what was called the the "Jockeys Tapes" scandal, said: "Might And Power is the best horse I've ridden. He's remarkable," he said. "When Greg Hall on Doriemus put his arms in the air, my first thought was that he'd won but I wanted to see the photo. My horse was beautifully relaxed in front and it was a remarkable performance."

WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES

SPECIAL QUEST (FR) (c, 2, Rainbow Quest--Mona Stella, by Nureyev) Racing is winding down in Europe, but there was one Group 1 event decided last weekend. That one, the G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud, a 1 1/4-mile contest for two-year-olds, resulted in a desperate finish, with Special Quest scoring by a neck from Asakir (GB) (c, 2, Nashwan--Yaqut, by Northern Dancer).

Both the winner and the runner-up are bred on the Blushing Groom/Northern Dancer cross. There have already been at least 76 stakes winners bred on this cross (around 25% of Blushing Groom line stakes winners). Rainbow Quest has shown a particular affinity for Northern Dancer and no less than 22 of his stakes winners are out of Northern Dancer-line mares.

There is a particularly good reason for Rainbow Quest combining so well with Northern Dancer, the same reason that Warning--who has the same second dam as Rainbow Quest--also works so well with Northern Dancer (nine of his first 16 stakes winners having been bred on the cross). The common element in the pedigree of Rainbow Quest and Warning is the mare Where You Lead. A daughter of Raise a Native, Where You Lead won the G3 Musidora S. and finished second in the G1 English Oaks, a race her dam, Noblesse, ran away with back in 1963. By chance, Where You Lead just happens to have a pedigree which is the perfect foil for that of Northern Dancer. To start with, Northern Dancer is by Nearctic (by Nearco, out of a mare by Hyperion) and Where You Lead's broodmare sire, Mossborough, is by Nearco out of a three-parts-sister to Hyperion. Then, Northern Dancer is out of a mare by Native Dancer, while Where You Lead is by a son of Native Dancer. Finally, Northern Dancer has a son of Blandford, and Where You Lead has a daughter of Blandford's brother, His Grace.

In the last decade, European breeding has been virtually saturated with Northern Dancer, so a stallion who is Northern Dancer free but has strains likely to combine well with Northern Dancer has a great chance of receiving mares who will suit him, just by chance. Another example is Machiavellian, who has no Northern Dancer but has as his granddam a half-sister to Northern Dancer. He has sired 10 of his first 15 stakes winners out of Northern Dancer-line mares.

This type of occurrence makes one wonder just how often a "stallion family" owes its reputation to the happenstance of some males from the family--such as Rainbow Quest and Warning in this instance--being in the right place at the right time, rather than any one family linked attribute.
